Shire of Coolgardie From the desk of the CEO

Greetings to all,

I hope that you all had a safe and enjoyable Easter break with your family and/or friends.

The years spin by at an escalatingly rapid rate, and our budget cycle is on us again. This is a painful process of balancing legal requirements, asset base and community need. It would be wonderful to say yes to everything that everyone wants, but we are instead boxed in to a cycle of balancing deteriorating asset and providing much needed services. The major benefit we do get is working with a great community.

We have recently received some calls about feral goats in Kambalda, with one ratepayer apparently having several goats in their front yard eating roses and jumping over their car. This is very much a systemic failure in control of feral animals in the Goldfields, a matter that the Council has been addressing over several years to the tin ear of state departmental apparatus. The matter of feral predation is usually associated with dog control, but herbivores are part of the problem as well, eating the flora needed by native species. This has seen the recognised extinction of a number of local species such as the Boodie, Woylie, Billby, Numbat, Walyadiji and the Brushtail possum. For a full list of extinct species, page 16 of the Department of Environment and Conservation report see '*A Biodiversity and Cultural Conservation Strategy for the Great Western Woodlands*' which paints a grim picture of the impact of feral invasive species in our region. Whilst all local government in our region through the Goldfields Voluntary Region of Councils (GVROC) have been calling for action over an indeterminable period and I strongly expect will continue to see those calls, it is a sad outcome that we will continue to see a reciprocated lack of action by the State to address the issue until it starts to directly affect locations West of the Scarp. But enough negativity.....

The month of March has seen the last of this seasons outdoor cinema. April is traditionally the start of colder weather, and this year is proving the case quite strongly. I am missing summer already. The return of the program is subject to a direction of Council, but if the program is continued, I expect we may be looking at somewhere around September for the startup of the next program. Thank you to Kambalda Football club for running the last few movies in Kambalda, and also generous contributions paying for the movies by BHP Billition Nickel West in Kambalda, and Evolution Mining Mungari in Coolgardie. Many thanks to those involved in allowing us to run these movies for our community.

From a works perspective, Kambalda residents will start to see the Gabion wall project drawing to a close next financial cycle. This is a project that will have spanned over five years and has had positive results since installation of the first wall. My thanks go out to the guys on the Coolgardie Shire crew who have spent these years in construction, and even creating a new method for wall construction that significantly increased construction time. People who say that Shire workers don't work, obviously have no idea what shire workers do.

A tribute to Arthur Bayley and William Ford

Walking, cycling or riding the Great Eastern Highway one may not be aware that it is the general route from the Perth region to the goldfield of Coolgardie discovered in 1892 at a time when both WA and Australia were in depression, resulting in the arrival of many thousands from all over to try their luck, and world fame for the new town.

The track

I ride along the beaten track to old Coolgardie town
Where prospectors trudged in olden days with grim but hopeful frown,
The asphalt whispers, murmurs low, my mind is all unhearing,
I think about the men who slogged through bush and heat all searing.

Starting from Victoria and New South Wales, then to Queensland and the north, and eventually to WA's Kimberley and Murchison, the search for gold by the 1880's had brought the trail even further south. The great surveyor/explorer Charles Hunt had led expeditions far east of Perth and York and there seems to have been a hint of a suspicion that he may have come across gold bearing country which the agriculture minded government in Perth desired to keep quiet about.

And at some time also in the 1880's the tough and canny prospectors George Withers and Gilles McPherson seem unsuccessfully to have penetrated deep in that direction but learnt that gold bearing ore there was.

The eve

In Southern Cross in '92 the great men gathered ready,
They'd seen gold rushes not a few; their hand and eye were steady,
The Ballarat and Bendigo and Murchison they'd found,
But in the camps the ebb and flow of rumour did abound
That eastward through the heat and bush where few had yet explored
Rush hardened men who made the push would find that gold was stored.

Fraser's Mine in Southern Cross was in an uncertain situation what with a strike and a work force of men whose minds were distracted by thoughts of what riches might lie to the east.

Bayley and Ford, both extremely experienced prospectors and bushmen, had set off to examine the eastern interior

The find

Seventeenth of September 1892, a spring day crisp and clear,
When the timeless bush all through boasts a wild flowering without peer.
In Southern Cross on this day, outside the cafe, post office, hotel
Men talk and wile time away, work has been quiet a spell.
Up and down the main street, in groups of various size scattered,
Young, not young, slovenly or neat, but all in the custom hatted.
A lone horseman comes into view, a pack animal in tow behind,
"The usual red dust covered through," observes the common mind.
For it's nothing unusual seeing men straggling in from the bush,
The rationale of most hereabouts being eventually making a prospecting push.

Arthur Bayley is recognised by most, he struck gold at Lake Anneen,
Been to many a remote outpost, he's bushwise and athletically keen.
His mount traverses the potholed street while attention to prior themes recedes,
Later in the hotel they'll meet, ascertain how country he's visited reads.
But he continues past the hotel, heads for the mining warden's place,
And suddenly a mental warning bell causes the general pulse to race.
"Hey it's Bayley!" goes the cry, some noticing the bulging saddle bags,
And struck by realisation why outside Finnerty's Bayley halts the nags.
The crowd dispersed about the thoroughfare, from a mien submerged and sickly,
In a minute mass from everywhere, their intrinsic resilience surfacing quickly –
By which time Bayley's scrambled inside, escaping the inevitable crush
Of hundreds sensing his dusty ride reeks of a gold strike lush.
And indeed, with Compton the registrar for the official Yilgarn Mining Ward
He registers a claim located far in two names – Bayley and Ford.

In memoriam

There's William Ford and Arthur Bayley,
Immortal names they are,
By Goldfields folk remembered daily
Though long they've crossed the bar;
'Twas they and their prospecting mates
The odds stacked high resisted,
And though their memory slow abates
Forever high they're listed.

Coolgardie was the most charismatic gold rush in Australian history, and a prelude to the discovery of the more durable Kalgoorlie Golden Mile.

Bayley tragically died young in 1896 at his property of Avenel in Victoria soon after his wonderful discovery with Ford - and Ford, who lived until old age, on hearing with great sorrow of his former mate's demise, is said to have said of Bayley that no man when out in the bush could have had a finer mate.




Coolgardie Volunteer Fire & Rescue Service

There are over 2,500 Volunteer Fire and Rescue Service (VFRS) members from 92 brigades in Western Australia who provide fire fighting and prevention services throughout the state.

VFRS fire fighters undertake a range of responsibilities including:

- Combatting fires
- Containing hazardous material spills
- Road crash rescue
- Fire safety education

Through comprehensive training, VFRS fire fighters learn to operate the wide range of equipment, vehicles and appliances used for fire suppression including charged hose lines, portable pumps, tankers and communications.

DFES provides VFRS training in:

- Personal and team safety
- Structural and bushfire fighting
- Communications
- First aid
- Vehicle driving both on and off road
- Leadership and emergency management procedures

For incidents involving road crash rescues and hazardous materials emergencies, specialised equipment such as the 'jaws of life' hydraulic rams, cutters and spreaders, decontamination equipment and protective clothing are used.

Not all fire fighters' work involves fire fighting or rescue. Volunteers actively promote fire education programs through schools, service groups, seniors' homes and local businesses. Training for this type of work is also provided by DFES Fire Services Managers.





The Pastor's Pen with Bill Kirkland

There was a time in King David's life when he was betrayed by a very close friend. He wrote of the pain and anguish associated with that very painful event. He basically said that if he was betrayed by an enemy he could bear it but not one who had been considered not only a close friend but a counsellor. In today's world it would be similar to having a family member or someone you really trusted betray you.

Instead of planning revenge and becoming bitter which would be the natural reaction, David decided to reach out to his God. He knew that God was able to sustain him through that period despite his pain and grief. He could have turned to the bottle to drown his sorrows; he could've planned revenge; he could have even blamed God for letting it happen. Instead, through an agonising Psalm we read 'Cast your burden on Jehovah, and He will keep you; He will never allow the righteous to waver.' Psalm 55:22.

The apostle Peter wrote a similar passage in his letter recorded in the book of 1st Peter. He wrote, 'Therefore be humbled under the mighty hand of God, so that He may exalt you in due time, casting all your anxiety onto Him, for He cares for you.' 1 Peter 5:6-7

A popular belief these days of those who don't believe in God can be summarised by these words "The universe is random, meaningless, and cruel." (Unknown author). When suffering kicks in and expectations are not met many reach this conclusion. Jesus Christ Himself suffered immensely at the hands of those He came to save. He was beaten, spat upon, mocked, betrayed, and misrepresented. He was known as a Man of sorrows, a Man familiar with grief. Through Jesus Christ, God identified with man's sorrow and suffering. Those trusting Him know that suffering is only for a season and they will be helped through that time.

Compare 'the universe is random, meaningless and cruel with the words of an old testament prophet who said to Israel ' For I know the purposes which I am purposing for you, says Jehovah; purposes of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope.' (Jeremiah 29:11) The future and a hope in a sometimes seemingly hopeless situation is something that multitudes of people have found when coming to know their Maker.
