Message from the Shire President May 2017

The Acting Chief Executive Officer and I attended the launch of the Regional Cities Plan in Kalgoorlie/Boulder last week. This plan has many phases of plans and initiatives for growth of population and industry in the City, of which it is hoped the adjoining Shires can benefit from some of these initiatives going forward.

Myself and Technical service supervisors, Keith Dickerson and Peter Miller met with the manager and supervisor of the GETS training group with the aim of gaining more traction and direction that the group will be taking under the new management group. Projects such as the footpaths in Kambalda will be ongoing and the signage and pathways at the Coolgardie Bluff will be completed in the near future.

The technical service staff and our road crews have successfully completed this year's work programme, which included resealing of local roads and the renewal of gravel roads, all of which has been achieved on time and budget which is a credit to all involved. The road crew is currently working on resheeting sections of the Binneringie Road that were affected by the heavy rain within the region in February. This road has seen a big increase in traffic usage, with the resurgence of mining activity in the Widgiemooltha area.

The Shire of Coolgardie Councillors were given a presentation by Francesca Lefante, who has been engaged by the CEO, to undertake a review of the Shires Planning and Strategy. She gave Council and Staff a great insight on how the Shire could adapt some of the initiatives in the strategy to encourage growth in our region and also how to activate tourism opportunities and holding the passing travellers in the region for longer periods of time.

I have also met with the Department of Minerals and Petroleum staff regarding the rehabilitation of the Pro Force mine site adjacent to the Coolgardie Gorge. This project is nearly completed with some surplus funds available for landscaping and tree planting. With these funds the Shire may be able to facilitate with the GETS group to complete in conjunction with the rebuilding of the Gorge wall that was washed out last year.

The Acting CEO, James Trail and I are planning to make ourselves available to meet with residents and members of our community to discuss any issues that they may have within their organisations or towns. These sessions will be held alternately between each town on the second Tuesday of each month, prior to council briefing forums. Further information will be provided in next months Cool-Rambler. Mosquito Control

Biting insect and mosquito-borne disease risk increase across Western Australia

WA Health is warning residents and travellers to take precautions against biting insects following the widespread rainfall and recent flooding events across Western Australia (WA).

Wet weather and flooding has created ideal conditions for breeding of mosquitoes and other biting insects across much of WA.

While Local Government mosquito management programs are in place around WA, it is not realistic or logistically feasible to keep mosquitoes and biting flies below nuisance levels when such vast areas of the State are affected with the recent weather conditions.

Increased mosquito activity is likely to result in an increased risk of the mosquito-borne disease Ross River virus (RRV), Barmah Forest virus (BFV), Murray Valley encephalitis virus (MVEV) and Kunjin virus (KUNV) in some parts of WA.

Symptoms of infection RRV and BFV include painful or swollen joints, sore muscles, skin rashes, fever, fatigue and headaches.

For most people, disease caused by MVEV and KUNV has fairly mild symptoms such as headache, fever, aching, swollen joints and rash. However, in rare cases these viruses, especially MVEV, can lead to a serious inflammation of the brain and result in long term disability or even death.

There are no specific cures or vaccines for mosquito-borne diseases in Western Australia, so it is very important that people take care to prevent being bitten.

An increase in the number March flies has also been reported in the Pilbara region. At least one species of March fly, known to occur in parts of the Pilbara and northern Goldfields, has a bite that can cause serious allergic reactions in some people.

Although March flies are not known to transmit diseases to humans in Australia, the bites of some species can cause allergic reactions, including skin redness and swelling.

People should take extra precautions to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes and flies include:

- Avoiding outdoor exposure particularly around dawn and dusk (and the first few hours after dark)
- Wearing protective (long, loose-fitting, light coloured) clothing when outdoors
- Applying a personal repellent containing 20% diethyl toluamide or picaridin to exposed skin or clothing. The most effective and long lasting formulations are lotions or gels.
- Wearing head nets if outdoors
- Ensuring infants and children are adequately protected against biting insects, preferably with suitable clothing, bed nets or other forms of insect screening.

The recent rainfall is also a timely reminder for residents to minimise mosquito breeding around the home by taking some simple steps to remove or modify breeding sites such as:

- Disposing of all containers which hold water
- Stocking ornamental ponds with fish and keeping vegetation away from the water's edge
- Keep swimming pools well chlorinated, filtered and free of dead leaves
- Filling or draining depressions in the ground that hold water
- Fitting mosquito proof covers to vent pipes on septic tank systems and sealing all gaps around the lid ensure leach drains are completely covered
- Ensuring guttering does not hold water
- Emptying pot plant drip trays once a week or fill them with sand
- Emptying and cleaning animal and pet drinking water bowls once a week

Anzac Day 2017 at Coolgardie

This year at Coolgardie there was a March that started at 5.45am from the corner of Renou and Bayley street up to the Memorial Garden for the 2017 Coolgardie Dawn Service. The March was led by First Class Constable Ferris and W Corcoran played the bagpipes. The salute was taken by Sergeant Pengilly from the Coolgardie Police Station.

A crowd of approximately 280 people gathered for the 6.00am Dawn Service .RSL President Willy Corcoran welcomed everyone and invited them to sing the Hymn 'Oh God Our Help In Ages Past' the gracious harmonies were sung beautifully by the Coolgardie attendees on the clear crisp morning.

Harley Cullen from Coolgardie Primary School read out the poem "Flander's Field" with support from his brother Maverick; this was then followed on by Cheyenne Aird and Cassiopeia Middleton from CAPS School reading a piece about "Simpson and his Donkey". Well done to our young readers, your voices were clear and crisp and you delivered your speeches very confidently in front of a huge crowd.

Corcoran delivered an address which reflected on the first world war, its conflicts and how the name "ANZAC" came about; telling of how the two countries that fought together formed a mate-ship that came about creating the Australian and New Zealand Army Corp. Robin Wade also delivered a powerful and touching address about the second world war. It was heartfelt and he acknowledged Papua New Guinea's roles (affectionately named The Fuzzy Wuzzy A ngels), as well as the background story of the Ensign and he also thanked Robert Javapro for being present with the Papua New Guinea Flag.

This was then followed by the Laying of the wreaths where Corcoran played "Abide with Me" on the bagpipes. We then listened to the Ode and the Last Post which saw our Air Cadets Wade, Javapro and Mangwa who lowered the flags. The Minute Silence was followed by Vic Dales recorded Poem titled "Anzac Dawn"; with the Rouse played and followed by the New Zealand and Australian National Anthems.

The Sunrise completed the service with a stunning display of gold and orange sending threads of sunlight across the colours and textures of the wreaths, attendees, the poppies that filled the Memorial and its gardens. Corcoran was pleased with the Service and the attendance and commented that,

"It was especially moving to see the young children who participated and attended the Service,"

After the service everyone was welcomed to a beautifully cooked breakfast, prepared by the RSL Committee ladies and friends. The breakfast was not complete without a cup of tea or coffee with the appropriate additive. A big thank you to our cooks and bar staff, we really appreciated your involvement.

A talking point of the RSL this year was the fantastic display on the Western wall of the building in the Memorial Garden. A big thank you to the ladies from the CRC Craft group who turned the 2000 plastic bottles, into a vibrant display of poppies and also to Alan Bergin for his great efforts in getting that display onto our RSL building.

Coolgardie Volunteer Fire & Rescue

From the desk of the Coolgardie Volunteer Fire & Rescue Captain – David Shilton



Winter is approaching so it's time to put some precautions in place now to avoid possible fires and damages to your house. Make sure your fires and chimneys are cleaned and if the power goes off due to storms, be careful with candles and don't leave them unattended, near windows with curtains or next to any inflammable products. The number of house fires caused by candles is huge and can be easily prevented if care is taken.

Have you checked your clothes dryer lately? Make sure they are clean of lint and dust; if you are drying clothes in front of a fire or radiators make sure you have them at a safe distance to avoid a fire.

Smoke Alarms in the house, we can't stress enough how important and affordable these are and they do save lives! Check the batteries in them and if you don't have them already go and get them. House fires do not happen only in the day time when everyone is awake, they can happen during the night or early morning while everyone is asleep and if looked after smoke alarms do not sleep!!

Take care on the roads with the change of weather. We can forget how slippery a bit of rain makes to the road conditions, drive safely and drive to the conditions.






