Alison Dimer & Debbie Carmody | The Work

The Artist, Debbie Carmody, and the Storyteller, Allison Dimer, have completed a collaborative work for the Creative and Cultural Plan.

The artwork is reflective of Dreamtime Story and their own stories of living in the Shire.

The artwork depicts Gulgurla Rock in Coolgardie, Mularri which means 'talking hill' also known as Mount Burgess, Red Hill and the Kambalda salt lakes that are connected to the dreamtime story of the Crow and Eagle in Coolgardie.

The artwork's story is of the Gulgurla rock tjukuurl (the Dreaming) a physiographical site believed to be the origin of the Gulgurla plant (silky pear / bush banana) at the beginning of creation.

Debbie shares the special area along the salt lakes where her father used to walk with his mother before he was put into Norseman mission.

The work is reflective of the many colours of the landscape in the Coolgardie and Kambalda areas. It includes a colour palette of greens, reds and the yellows of the soft sand around the salt lakes within the Shire of Coolgardie and rest of the Goldfields.

About the artists

Debbie Cormody lives in Boulder and is an Anangu, Spinifex and traditional owner for Upurli Upurl Nguratja (Cundelee) and Kepa Kurl (Esperance). Her connection to the community is through Country -Song/Travel Lines, and Family.

Alison Dimer is a Maduwongga Galagu woman, and the Holder of Cultural Stories passed down form her mother Dorothy Donaldson/Dimer who had the stories passed down to her from her ancestors of the Maduwongga Galagu tribe.

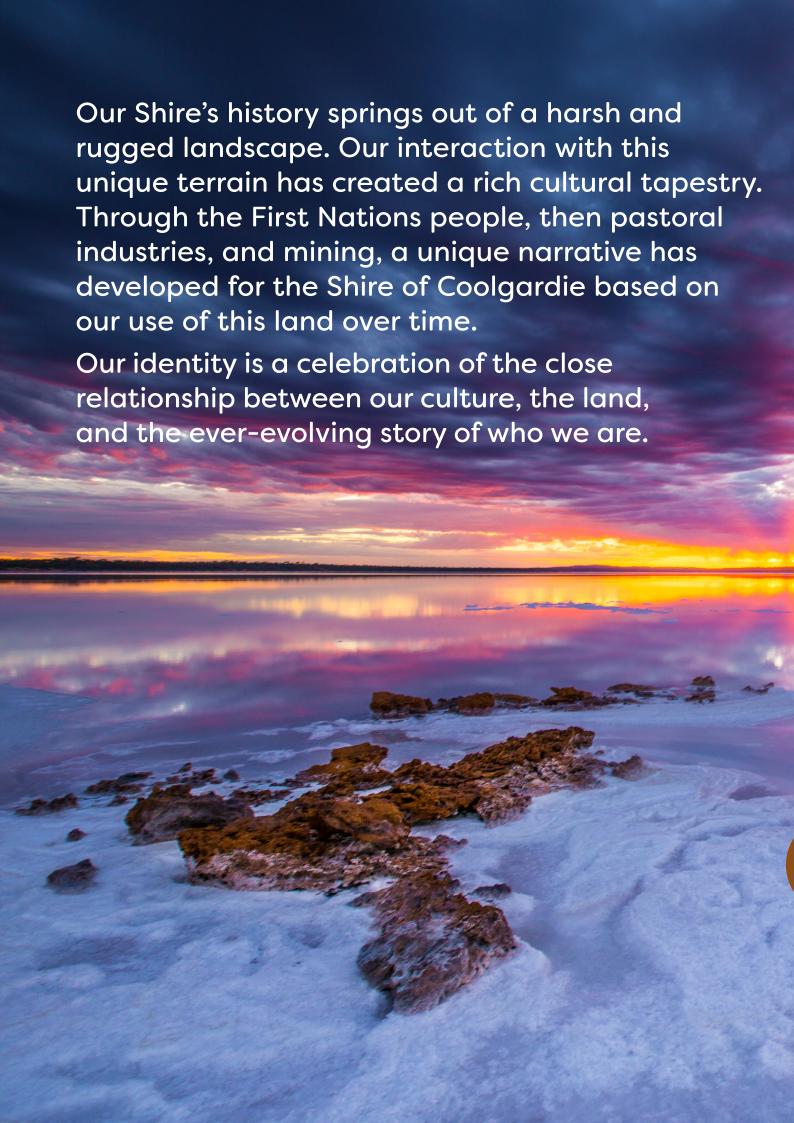


Introduction

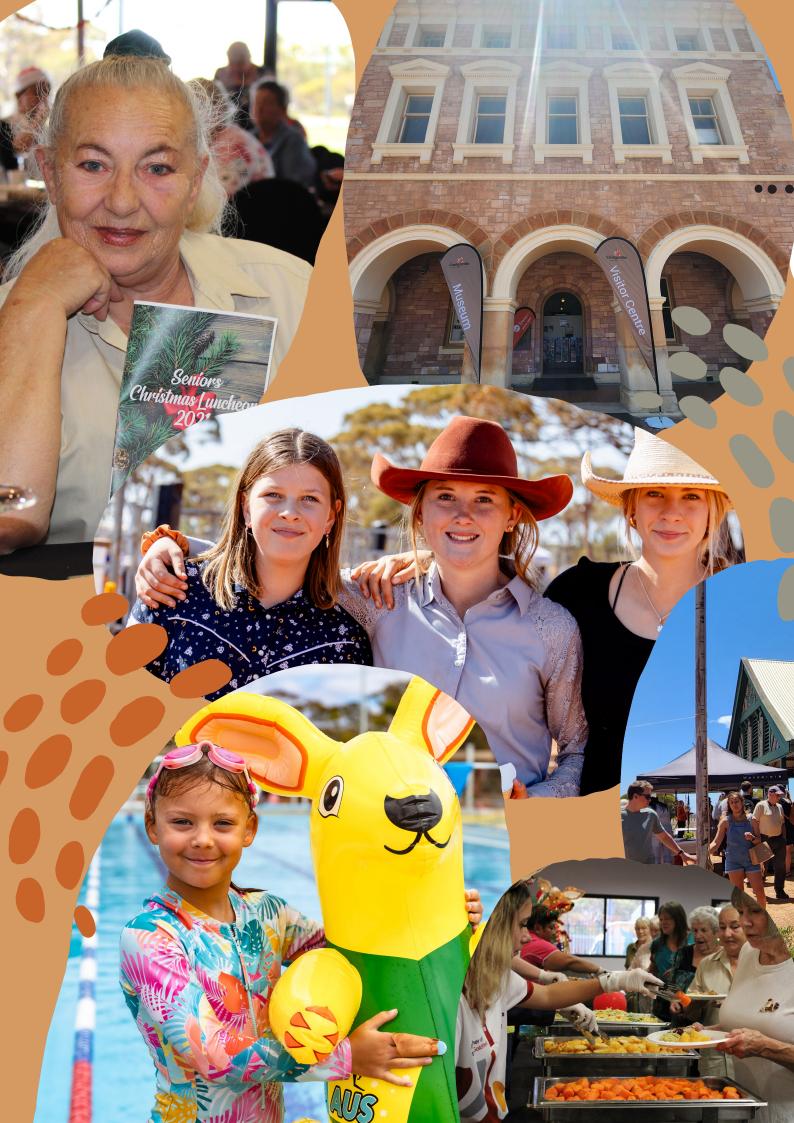

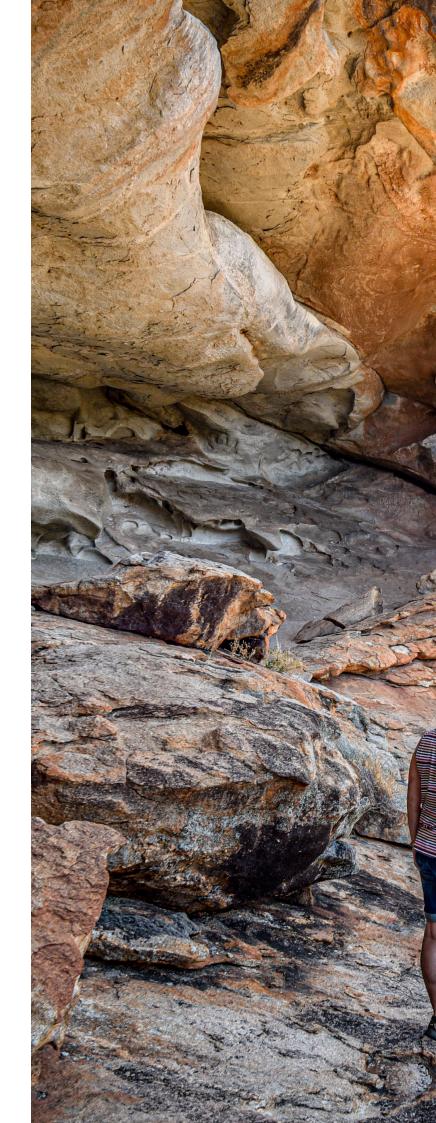

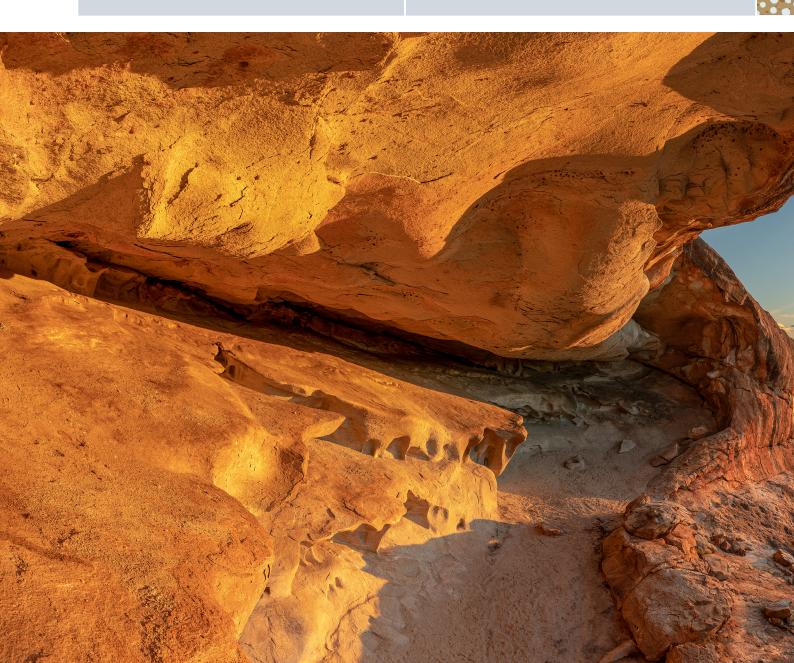
