













50 year celebration of KD1 Nickel Discovery



Well it seems the hard times have thinned Kambalda out a bit, but they can't break her spirit.

Thursday night, the 28 of January saw a good gathering of seventy odd people or so at the Kambalda Community Recreation Facility, in celebration of the anniversary of the KD1 nickel discovery.

All walks of life of all ages came to celebrate her fifty years of existence. I was one of the many thousands, who over her fifty years had worked and lived in the town. I was now one of those who had come back to say thank you for those three years of my working life.

Those memories were reignited with some wonderful stories of the Nickel boom of the late 1960's and 1970's. It was the best place to be in if you were young and chasing good money with a young family.

Everything happened fast at Kambalda in those days. Development saw constant changes. The Silver Lake shaft was in full production and around the corner on the northern side was the Durkin shaft with its four big gin wheels up high on the head frame standing over what I believe was the first concrete circular shaft to be sunk in Australia. They had bought South African miners over to show Western Mining how to do it.

The town was divided into two parts, East and West with West being the second stage of development. Each week saw new houses and streets.

The money generated from Kambalda kept Kalgoorlie and Boulder afloat over those years. The gold price was down and the gold mines on Boulder's famous Golden Mile were doing it pretty tough.

How to prevent mosquitoes in your home



Did you know?

Only female mosquitoes bite. They need the protein from blood to develop their eggs.

Mosquito lifecycle

Mosquitoes go through for development stages – egg, wriggler (larva), tumbler (pupa) and finally adult. This whole cycle from hatching egg to flying adult can take as little as 5 – 7 days in summer.

During colder months the life cycle may take several weeks.

Where do mosquitoes breed?

Mosquitoes can breed in any type of standing water, from natural and man-made water bodies to water holding containers. Backyards are a common breeding environment, with old car tyres, pot plant drip trays, septic tanks, rain – water tanks, blocked roof gutters, domestic ponds, paddling pools and disused containers like jars and buckets all being ideal breeding sites.

How can I minimise mosquito breeding sites in my backyard?

Dispose of all containers which hold water
Stock ornamental ponds with mosquito eating fish
Keep swimming pools well chlorinated, filtered and free of dead leaves
Level or drain depressions in the ground that hold water
Fit mosquito – proof covers to vent pipes on septic tank systems. Seal all gaps around the lid
Screen rain water tanks with insect proof mesh, including inlet, overflow and inspection ports.
Ensure guttering is not blocked and does not hold water.
Empty pot plant drip trays once a week or fill with sand
Empty and clean animal and pet drinking water bowls once a week.

Residual chemical sprays can be used to further reduce mosquitoes. This should not, however, replace the removal and prevention of backyard breeding sites which is a more effective control method.

How can I avoid being bitten?

Cover up with long, loose fitting and preferably light coloured clothing.

Apply mosquito repellents

For babies and young children the best protection is protective clothing, only infant – strength repellents should be used on young children.

Motor Vehicle Security

Cars can be a soft target for criminals, however there are proven strategies you can adopt to reduce significantly the chance of your car being stolen.

To help protect your vehicle from crime, consider the following tips:

- it is compulsory to fit an approved immobiliser at the time of purchase of a vehicle;
- park your car off the street, preferrably in your yard or in a locked garage;
- if you need to park on the street at night, ensure you park in a well-lit area;
- it is an offence to leave your keys in the ignition while your car is unattended;
- close all windows and lock all doors before leaving your car;
- remove any items from your car that may entice a thief;
- remove cheque books, credit cards, driver's licence and registration papers from your glove box; and,
- keep a spare key in your wallet or purse rather than keeping them hidden in or on the car.







Where to from here?

Putting together a historical collection for this event was not an intended use, but a way of showing the potential of a historical collection for our important and interesting short history.

The further we delve into the past, the more we learn about the information for visitors to the Kambalda Arts Centre.

Displaying a pictorial history was our original intention, but in doing so, we have found that there is a limited availability of imagery due to copyright law, owners of copyright changing hands and access to information in public and national archives.

In summing up, to this point a lot of time initially has gone into researching and much more is required, so will be very a very slow process.

We have located some WMC archives that will be very important, but await ability to access the material.

Given our intension to create a pictorial display anyway, to date we have achieved quite a lot and that is accessible to the public, in the Kambalda Arts Centre.
