### HERITAGE CONSERVATION AND MAINTENANCE FOR THE EXTERIOR OF THE BUILDING



Council are pleased to advise the community that the conservation work on the exterior of the Coolgardie Post Office Complex has commenced.

The State Heritage listed building, situated on Bayley Street (Coolgardie) is owned by Council. Built from local stone, the building has deteriorated in parts due to age, soil salt content and water drainage issues.

The current conservation works being carried out will ensure that the building is safely conserved for the community to continue to enjoy.

Council accepted a tender which includes the following scope of works; water management, stonework repairs, a preventative painting programme, partial re-roofing and associated repairs, stormwater and subterranean drainage and joinery repairs.

The conservation work commenced on May 9 2016 and is expected to be completed by September 2016.

Funding for the project was secured through Country Local Government Funds, and through a loan.

The building, which houses the Post Office and the Coolgardie Markets, is part of Coolgardie's identity.

Subject to funding, the Shire will continue to work towards full restoration which will enable all areas to be available for use.

### Shire of Coolgardie From the desk of the CEO

### Greetings to all

We have had a few interesting weeks completing our works program, evidenced most strongly by our reseal works. Reseals require that loose stone be left on the surface for a few weeks to help with the bedding in process. The loose stone is then swept off to reveal the final surface.

We have received a few complaints about the loose stone, but when we explain the process, the complainants have been leaving the office happier once they understand what we are doing. We are very sorry about the inconvenience, but it is an important step in this process. Roads need to be resealed about every 15 to 20 years. If we don't do this, the surface of the road goes brittle, water gets into the base, and the road will fail. Failed roads cost a heap to fix, so our aim is to reseal as much as we can.

The Kambalda Community Recreation Facility is the recipient of a grant funded solar power system, which is targeted for commission in early June. The project is about 80% complete at the time of writing this report. This is a very exciting project, and I look forward to identifying the real savings this project will give us over the next 12 months in relation to power costs. As solar power hardware becomes cheaper, the return period on spend continues to diminish. Continually increasing power supply costs also add to longer term efficiencies in alternative power supplies. We will gather data from this project and others in the region, to see if we can apply solar power to any other civil projects. It is important to remember that some projects are not suitable to these systems as peak demand may exceed capacity of the system, or battery backup may not extend to full demand period. Increasing the capacity of the system may exceed the economic benefit of the project.

The Shire has also been the recipient of Lotterywest funding for park equipment in Donkin Park and Sarah Jane Park. The project is currently progressing through the tender process, and I look forward to seeing what we will be offered for installation to benefit the children in our town.

Our Planning Scheme draft No 5 is currently now sitting with the West Australian Planning Commission (WAPC). This document maps the Council's and communities vision for the future development of our Shire and towns, identifying development potential, provision of industrial land, access to recreational pursuits and diversity of housing. We will continue to lobby for our Shire through this process.

## Shire of Coolgardie Collecting firewood for domestic use

Chilly nights have moved in to the Shire of Coolgardie but people looking to stoke the fireplace have been asked to do so responsibly.

- Collection should be for private use only and is restricted to a ute or trailer load at a time.
- Firewood cannot be sold, exchanged or traded for commercial gain.
- It is a legal requirement to gain permission to enter and collect firewood from other land being used by pastoral leaseholders, mining companies and Aboriginal communities.
- Gathering is not allowed 2 kilometres of station homesteads or on active mining areas.
- A number of restrictions apply to gathering firewood and one restriction is people cannot collect or cut wood within 7.5 kilometres to the towns of Kambalda and Coolgardie, in order to maintain the health of vegetation protecting the towns from dust storms.

### Rates Objectives and Reasons 2016 2017

The rate in the dollar (RID) is calculated to provide the shortfall in income required to enable Council to provide necessary works and services to maintain assets and provide for the future asset needs.

In the Shire of Coolgardie, the rate burden between the categories of Gross Rental Value and Unimproved has been considered fair and equitable by stakeholders at public consultation held each year. This remains as town sites rated using Gross Rental Value provide 31% of the rates (by value) and those being rated on Unimproved Value 69%.

### **Gross Rental Values (GRV)**

The four categories of GRV properties, dependent on land use and zoning are

- Residential
- Commercial
- Industrial
- Vacant Land

It is proposed that all properties using GRV as the basis for rating will attract the same RID and minimum rates. The reasoning being that the same services are provided for all.

The minimum rate is set to ensure that each rateable assessment makes a fair contribution to the services provided. Where the property is vacant, this contribution ensures that the services provided in the future will meet the needs of the improvements placed on the property.

### Unimproved Values (UV)

The differential between mining and rural properties has an historical base, due to anomalies in valuation methods some years past. Changes to processes and conditions now placed on rural and special leases have reduced the need for this variation, and this was addressed in 2015/2016 by a reduction of the differential. Council recognises the importance of diversity of industry to the community, and provides a generous concession for ratepayers who can demonstrate that they use their rural land for purposes other than mining. This is reflected in the Rate Strategy of the Council.

The lower minimum for Mining UV recognises that these leases are, for the most part small, and each ratepayer may have multiple leases, each paying the minimum rate.

A concession offered to Bona Fide Prospectors (who hold proof from the Department of Transport) recognises the importance to the community of the historical link of independent prospectors who live within the shire. The level of concession is set at each Annual Budget.

### Prospecting popularity prompts safety message to carry personal locator beacons

The Department of Mines and Petroleum (DMP) has launched its annual Seven Golden Rules for Prospecting campaign to highlight safe and sustainable practices.

Mineral Titles Executive Director Dr Ivor Roberts said the department had issued more than 17,000 Miner's Rights for prospecting in Western Australia in the past five years.

"A Miner's Right is the most common prospecting permit used by tourists visiting Western Australia and allows holders to prospect on Crown Land with hand-held tools, such as a metal detector, and to take and keep samples or specimens up to 20 kilograms.

"That is an incredible number and is indicative of gold prospecting's continued popularity in this State, "

Dr Roberts said.

Dr Roberts said safety should always be a prospector's number one priority.

"Western Australia's outback can be a harsh, remote environment, which is why personal safety is such an important consideration when prospecting in this State," he said.

This is why we encourage everyone to carry Personal Locator Beacons (PBLs) when prospecting in remote areas."

The device, which can be purchased from most outdoor stores, is ideal for use in remote areas as it does not rely on telecommunication networks to submit a signal.

PLBs are the best way of avoiding the sometimes tragic results of getting lost in the Goldfields and the outback.

The Seven Golden Rules campaign will see DMP offices, tourist bureaus, libraries and caravan parks targeted with posters, brochures and booklets.

### The Seven Golden Rules for prospecting are:

- 1. Put safety first Your safety is your responsibility
- 2. Obtain a Miner's Right permit when prospecting on Crown land
- 3. Obtain a 40E permit prior to prospecting on an exploration tenement
- 4. Get written permission if you want to prospect on someone else's mining tenement
- 5. Comply with all legal requirements when prospecting on a pastoral lease
- 6. Show respect when on Crown land because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes
- 7. Fill any holes repair any ground disturbances that you make

# Sky Muster™ migration and connection process



Following the successful launch of **nbn**'s **Sky Muster**™ satellite last October, eligible Australians are set to be able to order services from the end of April 2016. The new service will be available to homes and businesses in rural and remote Australia (including external territories) that fall outside the fixed line and fixed wireless areas.

**Sky Muster™** is designed to deliver wholesale speeds of up to 25/5Mbps¹ and data allowances of up to 150GB per month. Internet service providers will provide retail plans at different price points and data allowances, so you can choose a plan that best suits your needs.



### How do I place an order?

To find out if you are eligible for the **Sky Muster**<sup>™</sup> service, please contact an internet service provider or check your address at **nbn.com.au**. For a list of internet service providers offering **Sky Muster**<sup>™</sup> services, please check our website for updates.

### How much will the Sky Muster™ service cost?

The plans and associated pricing for homes and businesses will be set by internet service providers (**nbn** is a wholesale-only supplier). For a list of internet service providers offering **Sky Muster™** services, please check our website for updates.

### How long will it take for me to get connected?

Customers should contact their internet service provider to find out how long their installation and connection process will take once their order is placed with nbn. **nbn** plans to do batched deliveries or hire local installers where there is sufficient demand, however if **nbn** gets more orders than the available installation capacity in that month, there could be longer wait times. nbn has specified different service level targets depending on the location. **nbn** will aim to complete a standard installation within 20 business days of an order for the service being placed by the internet service provider for most categories. In isolated areas on the mainland and in Tasmania, it may take up to 35 days. For limited access areas (those areas that can't be accessed by road and would require some element of air or water transportation), **nbn** has an aspirational target of 90 days. Please discuss with your internet service provider if you have any questions about installation time.

### What is the ordering and installation process?

(1) When an internet service provider receives an order, they should give a delivery timeframe (as per the above activation targets) to the customer.

- (2) After receiving a confirmed valid order from the internet service provider, **nbn** will then directly contact the customer within two business days to set an appointment date.<sup>2</sup>
- (3) The internet service provider will be sent a notification when the appointment has been agreed between **nbn** and the customer.
- (4) nbn will call the customer approximately 24 hours prior to the appointment to confirm.
- (5) If the installer is unable to contact the customer, they will still attend the premises and if the customer is not present, a missed appointment charge may apply.<sup>3</sup>
- (6) The internet service provider receives a notification when the installer is on site.
- (7) Once on site, the installer will recommend, and seek the customer's agreement to, a location for the equipment that has an unobstructed view to the satellite.
- (8) After the customer has agreed to a location for the equipment to be installed, the installation occurs, the service is tested by the installers, and the installation is complete.

### What equipment will be installed?

A qualified installer will install a dish typically on the customer's roof or wall. The dish will generally be either 84cm or 120cm in diameter depending on your location. The receiver and transmitter are mounted on the dish and two cables will be used to connect the dish to the satellite modem located inside the home. A standard installation of the equipment is currently free except in limited access areas<sup>4</sup>. However, customers should ask their preferred provider if there are any other fees.

### Do I need to be present for the installation?

The customer or an authorised representative over the age of 18, needs to be present throughout the installation. A standard installation should typically take 2-4 hours; longer for a non-standard installation.

### Will nbn carry out the entire installation, including wiring?

**nbn** is responsible for the installation and maintenance of satellite dishes and associated **nbn** equipment, including wiring from the dish to the network termination device (NTD). Please contact your preferred internet service provider in relation to any modem/wireless router the internet service provider may provide to the premises to which you can connect your equipment such as a PC or laptop.

### I am currently an ISS customer. How do I migrate to the Sky Muster™ service?

ISS customers should contact an internet service provider to place an order for **Sky Muster**<sup>™</sup> services. The appointments process covers ISS customer migrations as well as new installations. The plan is to migrate all ISS customers to **Sky Muster**<sup>™</sup> over the next 10 to 12 months. Existing ISS customers switching over to the new **Sky Muster**<sup>™</sup> service will need to have new equipment installed at their premises. **nbn** will de-install and remove ISS equipment.

### How do I cancel or change the appointment date?

Customers should talk to their internet service provider who will be able to book changes to appointment times. Charges may apply for cancellations less than 1 business days' or 48 hours' notice depending on the location of the premises.<sup>5</sup>

### Can I be sure that I will have a working service before the installer leaves?

If a customer has an existing service, it won't be switched off until the **Sky Muster**™ service is operating. The exception to this is where the **Sky Muster**™ equipment is to be installed in the same location as the existing equipment. However, the installer will seek the customer's consent before doing this. The installer will do basic tests to ensure the service is working before leaving. If the installation can't be completed, **nbn** will complete the installation remotely or through another visit to the premises, as required.

### Will you be switching on some parts of the country first?

**nbn** plans to have the entire network switched on at the commercial launch date. Customers will need to contact an internet service provider to order their **Sky Muster**™ service.

We will be activating both new users and also those who we are migrating over from the interim satellite service solution simultaneously. Given the size of Australia, the activation at customer premises will take some time.

### What if my children need Sky Muster™ for education purposes? Will we be prioritised?

**nbn** is working with state and territory departments of education on ways their distance education programs can be delivered over **Sky Muster**™. As some states have existing arrangements in place for their distance education services they may not initially use **Sky Muster**™. In those states where the department of education doesn't already provide a satellite service, **nbn** will take pre-orders from eligible distance education students. The proposed distance education product provides access to a second service with a 50 GB a month allowance per eligible student separate to the home service.

- 1. We're designing the nbn™ network to provide these speeds to our wholesale customers, telephone and internet service providers. End user experience, including the speeds actually achieved over the nbn™ network, depends on the technology over which services are delivered to your premises and some factors outside our control like equipment quality, software, broadband plans and how the end user's service provider designs its network
- 2. If **nbn** is not able to contact the customer to make an appointment following an order, a notification is sent to the internet service provider. After a total of 5 business days, the order will be in pending mode if there is no response. If the order is pending for more than 5 days, it may be cancelled by **nbn**. The internet service provider can then reschedule installation on behalf of the customer and **nbn** will attempt to contact the customer again to reschedule.
- 3. If the customer reschedules or cancels the appointment close to the confirmed installation time, fees may apply (within 1 business day for urban, rural and remote areas, or within 48 hours for isolated and limited access areas).
- 4. Limited access areas are areas that can't be accessed by road and would require some element of air or water transportation.
- 5. If the customer reschedules or cancels the appointment close to the confirmed installation time, fees may apply (within 1 business day for urban, rural and remote areas, or within 48 hours for isolated and limited access areas).

And as a Field Officer, you'll earn around \$21 per hour, receive motor vehicle allowances and enjoy flexible working hours. You will also be responsible for daily administrative tasks and the security of Census materials.

### App helps visitors do the right thing

Road tripping around a foreign place can provide challenges in the way of locating essential facilities and doing the right thing by locals. A new app, **CamperMate**, which takes point of interest mapping a few steps further than Google Maps, is now available in Australia.

CamperMate is designed to help travellers navigate this country and camp responsibly. It is a free, multilingual app for iPhone and Android that helps tourists find public toilets, recycling stations, rubbish bins and other facilities as they travel around, often through remote areas.

Originally developed in New Zealand, CamperMate has had over 200,000 downloads in its five-year existence, making it the country's most popular travel app. The app also won the Innovative Mobile Technology Award at the 2015 NZ Hi Tech Awards.

While its main purpose for travellers is to share locations of interest, local authorities have embraced the app as a way of encouraging responsible camping by providing travellers with the right information at the right time.

"Over 15,000 road travellers are using CamperMate in New Zealand each day – that's all spread from word of mouth," says CamperMate founder, Adam Hutchinson. "It's a platform for local authorities to communicate to domestic and international people travelling through areas that are otherwise hard to reach, providing information on where is suitable to camp, and any local rules visitors should be aware of".

Whilst CamperMate uses the GPS function of smartphones to map points of interest it has also been used as a valuable communication tool for local authorities and the State Emergency Service (SES) in times of emergency. It has the ability to send out weather alerts via in app messages to warn travellers of natural disasters in the area, such as bushfires or flooding.

The app has potential to increase traffic at local campgrounds too. In New Zealand, commercial holiday park options collectively have been viewed over 3.7 million times within the past six months.

CamperMate are so confident in the accuracy of information they provide, that they offer a money-back guarantee if campers are fined as a result of guidance received from the app.

Matt Harvey, General Manager of Australian Operations at Britz and Maui Campervans sees huge potential in the app for tourists. "For customers who are driving themselves, the app relieves stress by providing all the information they need to make good decisions. We find that anything to help make their stay easy and enjoyable is a way to ensure they come back again or recommend Australia as a destination to their friends."

He also believes CamperMate will provide peace of mind for local authorities and communities, "Both (local authorities and communities) can have confidence that travellers are aware of the rules, therefore minimising environmental impact and misunderstanding."
