Message from the Shire President August 2016

During our recent attendance at Local Government Week, I took the opportunity to visit the Hon. Minister L'Estrange to discuss our ongoing problem obtaining land in and around our townsites for development and recreational purposes. This matter has plagued us for over a decade, but the Shire has since 2011 been more involved as it is apparent that the actions by the Department of Minerals and Petroleum are primarily responsible for obstructing much needed development. This problem is wider ranging that just our Shire, affecting other local authorities in the Goldfields and mining towns further afield. In attendance apart from myself were the Shires Chief Executive Officer Mr Paul Webb, and the Hon. Minister Dave Grills. Minister Grills came to support our ongoing issue, and I believe his attendance certainly heightened just how serious this problem is for our towns. The Minister L'Estrange was a sympathetic ear, and asked for demonstration of our problem by presentation of facts. As we have substantial records on this matter, we are fortunate to have a long history of facts to deliver to his office. This has certainly been the most promising outcome we have had to date, although I expect the matter still has a way to go. As the matter is core to our future development, I do not believe this is a problem that we can divest ourselves of.

We were also fortunate to see a representative from the Department of Local Government and Communities, Mr Stuart Frazer. I made this visit, again with our Chief Executive Officer, our Manager of Administration Services, Ms Sue Mizzen, and our consultant, Mr James Trail. We initially discussed the matter of our Probity Compliance Audit Report. The items are being dealt with at a satisfactory rate, which is good news. Our only point of possible concern was the delivery of the Shire of Coolgardie Long Term Financial Plan (LTFP). The delivery of the LTFP was not a matter of timing, but of the ability to deliver a useful document that will give strong direction to the future of our organisation. To deliver a more accurate document, requires a little more time, and as long as we keep the Department notified of our progress, and we are moving forward, then we will reach a satisfactory result both for the Shire, and the Department. The document is currently in construction, and I look forward to presentation of the document to Council.

As part of our recent budget deliberations, our Audit committee was visited by our Auditor, Mr David Tomasi, Partner, Audit, Corporate and Local Government Advisory from Moore Stephens Australia. David helped to assuage concerns of members of the audit committee, and gave an overview of what our Council can expect in future deliberations. Again, the best tool we can have to project future financial directions is our Long Term Financial Plan. It was useful to have explained that our annual budget in isolation is quite frugal, with a modest surplus. Given surmised projects into the future it is apparent that the Council will have some pretty tough decisions to make.

On a happier front, the Shire of Coolgardie was the proud winner of this years Banners on the Terrace Award. The Shire won 'Best Digital/Professional', and 'Best Overall' categories in the competition. I would like to extend our thanks to Ms Ashlee Donkin, who provided the artwork for the banner. The image was a true reflection of activities in the goldfields in the present and past. It is great to see someone with such fantastic potential in our Shire, and I firmly believe this young lady has a great future ahead. We are lucky to be the home of a good number of varying artists in our region, many of whom go unrecognised.

From the desk of the CEO

Greetings to all,

I would like to congratulate Ms Ashlee Donkin on her fantastic win for the Shire of Coolgardie, in this years Banners in the Terrace, awarded at Local Government Week at the Perth Convention Centre.

The Shire of Coolgardie won the 'Best Digital/Professional' and 'Best Overall' rounds of the competition, due to the artwork provided by Ms Donkin.

Each Shire provides a standard size banner to the Western Australian Local Government Association on an annual basis, and these banners are displayed for a period of time in the centre of Perth during Local Government Week. It is a good opportunity to get our Shires name into the mind of Perth people, and the win lifts the profile of our Shire in the minds of competing Local Government. Many thanks Ashlee.

The structural repair works currently being conducted on the Coolgardie Post Office complex are nearing completion. The project includes drainage rectification works to move water away from the foundations of the building, and removal of deteriorated stone.

Water infiltration into the stone work had caused the affected stone to affectively turn into powder, and the mortar to fall out of eroded jointing. Replacement of external stone work has given the building a much needed face lift, and correction of drainage will direct water away from the building, slowing the work of time of the building into the future. It is the constant wetting and drying cycle that causes the most damage, so by keeping the building dry, the work will add extra life to the normally affected areas.

We are looking forward in September to Coolgardie Day. This is always a fantastic event which draws a big crowd for an outstanding family day out. This is not a Shire event, but is run by a small group of committed volunteers who manage to make this one of the best attended events in the region. My personal favourite is the parade, with the old vehicles driving through the main street. I hope to see you there.

On behalf of the Shire of Coolgardie I would like to sincerely thank G.E.T.S (Goldfields Employment Training Services) for their outstanding contributions they have made to both Kambalda and Coolgardie town sites Including

- Refurbishments to the train carriages at the Kambalda East oval including the design and paint work
- The litter pick up at the Kambalda land fill site
- The installation of the pathway from Blue Bush Road in Kambalda to the Kambalda West District High School
- The Coolgardie Bluff project including the installation of the walking track

Without the assistance and contributions to these projects these initiatives may not have been carried out as quickly as what they have been, once again thank you very much G.E.T.S the Shire of Coolgardie truly appreciates the work you have been putting into our towns.

Donkin Park and Sarah Jane Wilson Playground Upgrades

The Shire of Coolgardie secured funding from Lotterywest in April 2016 to go towards a new playground at Donkin Park in East Kambalda and an upgrade at Sarah Jane Wilson Park in West Kambalda. With funding from Lotterywest of \$87,000.00 and the Shire of Coolgardie's contribution of \$80,000.00 there is a total of \$167,000.00 of which \$137,000.00 will be spent on a new playground at Donkin Park and \$30,00.00 will be spent on an upgrade of equipment at Sarah Jane Wilson Park.

These upgrades and renewals make up part of the Shire of Coolgardie's 2015 - 2020 Playground Hierarchy Rationalisation Strategy. Initially East Oval playground was listed to be upgraded however, once reviewed by Council it was decided that due to the floodway in the East Kambalda Park and the overall area that was limited by this, it would be in the community's best interest to utilise the open space at Donkin Park. The Shire are now able to create a family friendly environment with a more contemporary playground focusing on educational and physical elements to cater for all ages developing another open public space for the community to enjoy.

The Shire advertised the playground design and installation for tender which received 5 tender submissions. From those submissions an assessment was completed, rating all designs and scope of work including overall best value for money. Council resolved to accept Adventure Plus's design (see below for the concept designs) the project is due to commence in October 2016.

—keep an eye out for dates to follow.





Expression of Interest Potential use of space in restored Post Office Complex

The Shire of Coolgardie has applied for funding to restore the interior of the Post Office Complex. The funding body has asked that the Shire demonstrate the potential future use of the various spaces within the building, and Palassis Architects were engaged to create concept designs.

Spaces have been considered at great length to ensure that the building, as a central business and residential hub, is utilised to its maximum potential. We are asking members of the community to examine the floor plans, and demonstrate their support for the project by signing the document available at the Coolgardie Recreation Centre, by contacting Shire staff, or by writing a letter of support for the project.

The Shire would also like to ask if there are members in the community who might be interested in renting any of these potential spaces for residential or business purposes, and to demonstrate this interest by filling in one of our Expression of Interest forms.

Several uses have been proposed for various spaces, shown on the sample floor plan. Please let Shire know if you would be interested in:



Coolgardie Community Men's Shed Incorporated

The Coolgardie Men's Shed, particularly Wayne and Gorry, have been vigorously working away at 'prettying up' our running engines in preparation for Coolgardie Day. It is the intention of the guys to have the machines running and in top condition for display, to hopefully share our joy of things that are old, with people visiting the town on the day. Top effort guys.

Harry Watkins has been on a bit of a hiatus, but thankfully has returned to the fold, most recently getting the 1912 Leyland truck up and running again. She has been idle for about 12 months, for no particular reason other than we have all been busy on other things, but with a little TLC and some kind words, we started her up again on Sunday 28 August. It was fantastic to hear her running again, and a few passers by did stop as they were walking past the door, no doubt very surprised to see something so old (baring Morrie) alive, running and in such good condition. Yes Morrie, you are in pretty good condition as well, even if you have not been given as much care as the Leyland. We are hoping for a visit from a mechanical wizard, called Wally, to drop by and give her a tune up. Wally was one of the team who originally restored the Leyland to running. I don't thing there is an engine out there that Wally could not return to perfect running condition. Maybe Wally could have a talk to Morrie.

A few members of the team will be starting work on the old bread cart. The cart used to make deliveries around Coolgardie, and I think there are still a few people in town who remember this being drawn around. She is a bit worn, and some of the timber work will need replacement, but if you have timber work skills, or are interested in learning about timber work, please drop by. We have members who can teach you some timber skills whilst restoring the cart. There are plenty of other timber work projects to work on after this, all of which help to bring our history back to life.

If you are interested in engines, we are currently restoring to running, a first ever production run Sulzer diesel engine. She is being stripped down to her component parts, ready for cleaning and replacement. Prior to construction, she will need a sizable foundation, and then during reconstruction, application of paint. This is an absolute gem of an engine, and a significant piece of world heritage, as well as fantastic win for Coolgardie. Having this engine run will be a huge man magnet for passing tourism. It should be noted that this is not a small engine. It stands completed at about 11ft tall, and the drive wheel is sunk about 4ft into the ground. Impressive. Just like Morrie.

Coolgardie Men's Shed has many very cool completed projects, has many more on the boil, and if you are interested in anything in particular, you will probably share that interest with others. Come down and say hello. Men's Shed is open most Sunday's from 10am, but at times there may be people irregularly visiting through the week. If you see the door open, drop in and say hello. We are a friendly bunch (except for Gorry's dog) who will be happy to share a cuppa with you.

Container deposit scheme to combat litter in WA communities

Member for the Mining and Pastoral Region Dave Grills MLC has welcomed the announced introduction of a container deposit scheme for beverage containers in Western Australia.

The scheme is expected to start in mid-2018 and will help improve recycling and reduce littering in the State. Under the scheme, consumers will be able to get a 10 cent refund on containers for soft drinks, bottled waters, small flavoured milk drinks, sports drinks and spirit-based mixed drinks.

Mr Grills said there was a strong desire among regional communities to increase recycling rates through such a scheme.

"Communities across the Mining and Pastoral Region are rightly proud of their natural environments and they want to ensure those natural values are protected through better waste management and recycling," he said.

"Containers from a wide range of drinks are constantly in our litter stream and they end up in the environment, along roads and in parks and gardens.

"This scheme will benefit local communities by helping to reduce litter while also generating jobs and economic activity in the recycling sector."

Mr Grills said community groups that undertook regular fundraising, such as charitable groups, sporting clubs, Scouts and Guides, environmental groups, and surf lifesaving clubs, would be able to profit by participating in large-scale recycling activities.

Nationals WA Candidate for the Kimberley Rob Houston said the Nationals WA strongly supported the introduction of a container deposit scheme in Western Australia.

"This is a practical way to reduce litter in our regions and help keep places like the Kimberley beautiful," Mr Houston said.

"With a 10 cent refund on drinks containers, all Western Australians will be rewarded for their recycling efforts. This initiative will complement our recycling culture and is a win for the environment, jobs, the community and the recycling industry."

The Liberal National Government is committed to reducing waste and litter across all waste streams. The container deposit scheme will complement the Western Australian Waste Strategy: Creating the right environment and the Litter Prevention Strategy for Western Australia 2015-2020.
