Kambalda Cleans up at WA Queens

All those early, cold Sunday mornings throughout this year's freezing winter months, paid off for the members of the Kambalda Full Bore Rifle Club when they attended the 2016 Western Australian Queens Prize Meet in Albany in late September.

Team Kambalda's success began in the days leading up to the Queens Prize. Kambalda Team members, Shayne McDonald (coach and shooter), Dave Bliss (captain), Laurie MacKay, Micheal Green and Dave Martin, battled the rain at the 800, 700 and 600 metre ranges to take out runner-up in the Ray Miles Team Shoot for Target Rifle. They finished with a grand aggregate score of 405.35.

With the team shoots done and dusted, the battle for the Duke of Edinburgh Prize began. Albany hosted some atrocious weather – freezing cold, fishtail winds and relentless rain – making the shooting challenging to even the most experienced shooters. Decked out in full wet weather gear (the rifles as well), Kambalda club members gave it their best shot and by the last day of the 'Dukes', FTR shooter Vanessa Bliss had snuck past Dave Bliss to take out the Number #1 badge for the FTR Class with a grand aggregate of 329.12.

Shire of Coolgardie Message from the Shire Acting President September 2016

On Tuesday 4 October, the Coolgardie Shire Council held a special meeting to appoint an acting CEO to steer the organisation through the coming year. In accordance with due diligence Council advertised an EOI with clearly defined expectations that were relevant for the successful applicant. Having received 4 expressions, and numerous enquiries, Council were unanimous with their decision to appoint Mr James Trail to this position with his commencement date being effective as of the 1 November 2016.

Mr Trail's appointment comes with strong support from the Department of Local Government and credible recommendations from former Local Government bodies. James has been engaged by the Coolgardie Shire since 2013, also other high profile LG organisations. During this time his contractual services and expertise have been sought to assist and improve Governance, Risk, Compliance, Policy Revision, Local Laws and Financial/Administrational functions.

Council are united in their vision for the coming twelve months. Defined actions in relation to the Governance and the financial future of the Coolgardie Shire are to be implemented during Mr Trail's tenure. The professional calibre of experience, knowledge, and integrity that Mr Trail is able to offer the organisation will undeniably secure a solid foundation as the organisation works toward re-aligning with the shifting expectations of Local Government and their communities imposed by the State.

The Coolgardie Shire would like to welcome Mr Trail to his appointment and envisage a productive and progressive year ahead.

On behalf of the Coolgardie Shire Council, I would like to take the opportunity to thank our Acting CEO Ms Jill O'Brien for accepting this position of responsibility and leading the organisation through a challenging past few months. Ms O'Brien has represented the Shire with professional integrity and is to be commended for her diligence and management in this role. Jill will return to her commitments as the Manger of Recreational and Regulatory Services as of 1 November 2016.

As ratepayers, of Shire are aware, Council had rescinded the adopted 2016/2017 rate model and budget in light of the implications of the Valuer General's 2015/2016 revaluation of Gross Rental Valuations on the rate setting statement. At a special meeting of the Coolgardie Shire Council held on the 11 October 2016, Council adopted the new rate setting statement and budget and are now able to proceed with the issue the Coolgardie Shire rates notices. We would like to acknowledge, with thanks, the patients and support of those affected by this delay.

The Shire President, Malcolm Cullen and our Acting CEO, Ms O'Brien took swift action this month as an opportunity was presented to resolve the ongoing issue with wild goats in the township of East Kambalda. The muster will begin in two weeks and within a week the goats will be mustered and transported to Geraldton.

Members of Council were invited to view the progress on the restorative works on the historical Post Office building in Coolgardie. Early in 2016 Polassis Architects were engaged to consult, identify and direct repair priority works in conjunction with Safeway Building and Construction on site to complete this stage of restoration works. With a long awaited boost in funding from the Country Local Fund, supplemented by a supporting loan from the Shire, the works completed to date will significantly

improve the drainage and diversion of water away from the building. Masonry works have also improved the appearance and structural well-being of the building.

Councillors and Officers have been committed to reviewing service levels and assets across the organisation over the past months. The dynamics of the State Government are shifting and it is our responsibility to ensure the governance in relation to future financial sustainability is assessed in order for the Shire to maintain quality levels of service to our communities. As a means to supporting this we have been investigating the feasibility of shared services with the City of Kalgoorlie Boulder. During the course of a meeting held on the 12 October with the Mayor and CEO of the city, Ms O'Brien, Mr Trail and myself, it was identified that there are significant opportunities that will offer relief in the areas of Waste Management, Administrative Services and Asset Management. This initiative would serve to optimise service delivery by significantly reducing the impact of financial constraints, contractual deliveries, and enhance the resilience of the Shire and the City of Kalgoorlie Boulder moving forward into the future.

- Review the Shire's policies, local laws and delegations in accordance with the Probity Review.

- Investigate opportunities with the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder to implement shared services
- Develop a compliance framework
- Written and verbal requests, complaints and enquiries from the community be dealt with in accordance with Council policy
- Ensure monthly financial reporting to Council is in accordance with statutory and legislative requirements

Kambalda Police Station – Spring 2016

Just to introduce myself, I am the officer in charge of Kambalda Police Station and have been in the role since April 2016.

Currently Kambalda is enjoying a relatively low crime rate, this is usually expected during the colder months. There have been a few reports relating to vacant properties around town being targeted and commonly it has been hot water systems stolen. If you are a property owner it is important to ensure that you have any boundary fencing secured with pad locks to deter and prevent thieves gaining access to the rear of properties, where most hot water systems are fitted. If you are living next door to a vacant property and see any suspicious persons or vehicles please contact the police station to report it at the time.

As the weather starts to warm up it is important that households in the community take responsibility for securing their property. This includes locking doors and windows, securing valuables and other equipment like bicycles, off road motorcycles and gardening equipment in locked outdoor sheds and garages. If you take reasonable steps as above you will prevent the likelihood of your property being stolen by opportunist thieves. Crime prevention advice can be provided by officers at the police station, so feel free to come into the station or make a phone call.

There are several social media sites available to the community to make comment on local issues, believe it or not most the staff at the police station do monitor these sites. As a member of the community, if you see or hear something that isn't right then I would encourage you all to contact Kambalda Police Station by phone in the first instance. There was recently an example where a local posted on Facebook that they had seen a dark 4WD acting suspiciously in the light industrial area. That person didn't call the police station to report the suspicious activity and it transpired the following morning that the Shire of Coolgardie depot had been broken into and several thousand dollars' worth of tools stolen. So remember, if it doesn't look right it probably isn't!!

Finally, I am aware and concerned by the lack of activities available to the local youth in and around Kambalda itself. Kambalda Police Station has recently been given approval to commence Blue Light activities within the community and has received full support from the Shire of Coolgardie, local schools and the wider community. There will be notices of upcoming events posted in the coming months, so keep a look out for these and I would encourage you all to get your kids to come along and have some fun

Tough new laws to tackle graffiti vandalism

The State Government has delivered another blow to graffiti vandalism in Western Australian communities with its tough new graffiti laws coming into force this week.

Member for the Mining and Pastoral Region Dave Grills MLC said the State Government had fulfilled another key election commitment by creating a stand-alone graffiti offence, which carried significant maximum penalties of a \$24,000 fine and two years behind bars.

"I believe that these new measures will give offenders some sense of the impact of their crime and send a message that one simply cannot trash a piece of public or private property without consequence," Mr Grills said.

"Under the new laws, those sentenced to a community-based order or, if a juvenile, a youth community-based order must undertake at least 10 hours of community work to clean up graffiti."

In addition to mandatory clean-up orders for convicted vandals, Mr Grills said the Graffiti Vandalism Bill also included measures such as:

- confiscation of property, like smart phones and laptops, used to record and transmit graffiti vandalism;
- strengthening Public Transport Authority (PTA) powers to ban serial offenders from buses, trains and stations;
- strengthening local government powers to enter private property to remove graffiti; and
- creating an offence for possession of a graffiti tool or implement.

"These tough new laws will support our local communities and help reduce wanton damage to public and private property. Home and business owners know the effort it takes to clean up graffiti vandalism and now offenders will also understand the work involved to remove graffiti," Mr Grills said.

Nationals WA candidate for Roe Peter Rundle said the laws strengthened what the Liberal National Government was already doing to combat graffiti vandalism, which cost WA about \$8 million a year to remove.

"The State Government endeavours to clean graffiti vandalism within 24 hours and now they will remove the ability for a vandal to broadcast it. If it isn't already, now graffiti vandalism will be the most pointless past-time in WA," Mr Rundle said.

In 2007-08 there were 16,025 verified graffiti offences, dropping to 2139 in 2015-16. The cost of removing graffiti vandalism in 2013-14 was \$7.84 million.

Dealing with snakes

In spring and summer, many reptiles emerge to bask in the sun. During this time you should take precautions to minimise the chance of encountering snakes.

Remember, snakes are an integral part of the natural environment and play an important role in

If you find a snake:

Do not approach or aggravate it in any way. Most bites occur when people accidentally step on snakes, or while attempting to kill them. As the warmer days of spring approach, snakes become more active as they leave their winter retreats in search of a mate and food.

If you find a snake in a garden or a house, contact **Wildcare Helpline (08) 9474 9055** to be referred to a volunteer reptile remover. If volunteers are unavailable, there are commercial snake removal services. Advice can be provided by phoning the Department of Parks and Wildlife on **(08) 9219 9840** Wildlife ecosystems.

Precautions

- Take care in bushland and grassy areas.
- Walk and/or cycle in cleared areas only, where you can see the ground.
- When bushwalking, wear long trousers and boots or other enclosed footwear that preferably cover the ankles.
- Keep a watchful eye on the ground about a metre ahead of where you are walking, and avoid entering areas of long grass, rushes and undergrowth.
- Around your home remove long grass and items lying on the ground such as corrugated iron, which may provide cover for snakes.
- Reduce mice numbers around the house.
- Learn the <u>correct treatment for snakebite</u>. (*First aid information from St John*.)

Why should I have a pap smear?

Up to 90% of the most common type of cervical cancer can be PREVENTED if early cell changes are detected. As cervical cancer does not cause any symptoms early in the disease, the best way to detect cell changes is by having a pap smear. A Pap smear is the best method available to detect these early cell changes.

A pap smear is a painless, quick and simple screening test. All women between the ages of 18 -70 years should have a pap smear every 2 years. Younger women who have been sexually active for 3 years should also have pap smear screening.



The warmer weather and camping season are apon us, hopefully to stay for a little while this time. Having had such a long and wet winter the bushland around the Shire of Coolgardie is looking very beautiful and green. The wildflowers are slowly coming to an end but the water reserves still have plenty of water in them. Its the perfect time to get out and explore all the beautiful places around us.

Victoria Rocks

Victoria Rocks was originally called "Queen Victoria Rock" named in honor of Queen Victoria by John Holland in 1893. It is one of the largest, most spectacular Granite outcrops in the Goldfields. From the top of the rocks you will have panoramic views of the surrounding woodlands.

In the 1920's the woodlands below were completly cleared for their use of timber, Today however, you will find plenty of Salmon Gum, Gimlet & Redwood growing. There is also plenty of wildlife to be seen with Emus, Echidnas and Ornate Dragons (type of lizard) often spotted here.

It is an ideal spot to go camping if you dont want to travel to far from home but still want a bush retreat to explore in our stunning region. The Victoria Rock camping spot is perfect for sightseeing, bush walking, photograpy, star gazing or just to spend the weekend relaxing.

Victoria Rock is located 48kms south of Coolgardie along the Victoria Rocks Road, it should take you about 30 – 45 mintues from Coolgardie and It is accessable in a 2-wheel drive car.

Once you get there, you will find an information shelter, shady picnic spots, camp sites, toilets & barbecues.

Please make sure you pack your own drinking water and fire wood.

Please note, as the area is in a conservation reserve, no dogs are allowed.







The Pastor's Pen with Bill Kirkland

One of the best known characters in the Bible is a man called Jacob. Jacob was the younger of twins. Through deception he cheated his brother Esau of the blessing which fathers gave to their firstborn. In Hebrew Jacob's name actually means deceiver. After stealing his brother's birthright Jacob found himself running for his life. Esau was very angry and felt very aggrieved by his brother's actions. Jacob settled down and married into his mother's family. Jacob's father-in-law then deceived Jacob, first of all in regards to getting married to the daughter he loved and then in regards to his wages which were continually changed and not usually for the better. In one sense you could see that Jacob was reaping what he had previously sown. Jacob had deceived and now it appeared he was receiving a dose of what he had given out.

The Bible records Jacob having an encounter with God resulting in Jacob's surrender. God then changed Jacob's name to Israel. From Israel's family came twelve tribes which made up the nation of Israel. The most famous of Israel's children was Joseph. He too was a casualty of deceit as a couple of his brothers sold him into slavery and then told his father that he had been killed by a wild animal.

Many people feel deceived in life. The gospel of John records a meeting Jesus had with a man called Nathanael: 'When Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him, he said, "Here is a true descendant of our ancestor Israel. And he isn't deceitful." John 1:47 Meeting someone without deceit seemed very refreshing to Jesus. Jacob had been transformed by a meeting with God. Now Jesus described a true child of God as one who had had their nature transformed. It was Jesus Christ Himself who transformed Jacob's nature and He still does the same today. Some people feel they can do this transformation without God. There is hope that we can be transformed from being deceivers to being trustworthy, from faithless to faithful, from blasphemers to worshipers, from liars to truth tellers. Certainly outward behaviour can change but inward purity comes from God alone.
