Message from the Shire President May 2017

The month of May has been a busy period for Councillors and Staff working through the Level of Service Review and the Fleet Management report with our consultants John Ravlic and Grant Andrews respectively, and this was followed up by workshops to discuss the LOS templates prepared by our staff coordinators. Further workshops have been held to discuss the Shire Policy Manual Review and the Delegation manual update.

I would like to acknowledge the excellent job that our staff and coordinators have managed to achieve, with many intensive hours going in to complete these templates and manuals. Following on with further consultation during the next three weeks, the Level of Service templates, Policy and Delegation manuals will be presented to Council for consideration in June.

Council has formed a committee comprising all seven elected members and the Shire HR Officer for the purpose of recruiting a Chief Executive Officer for the Shire of Coolgardie. The Recruitment committee advertised the position during the month of April with the closing date for applications on May 5th. With five applications being received, the Recruitment committee has reviewed the CVs of all the applicants and short listed three of these for personal interviews during the process to select a preferred candidate to offer a three year contract for the position of Chief Executive Officer of the Shire. It is hoped that this process could be completed by mid June.

At this month's briefing forum, Councillors discussed the formulation of RoadWise Committees in Coolgardie and Kambalda. This initiative has been proposed by WALGA road safety advisor Cherie Wallace, who has offered to co-ordinate community consultation in each town during June with a view to forming these committees to promote road safety initiatives on local roads and also to work in consultation with Driver Reviver volunteers to reduce the risk of driver fatigue related crashes on our regional highways.

The Shire Annual General Meeting of Electors for the 2015/16 year was held at the Coolgardie Recreation Centre on May 11th with Councillors and Staff and six residents attending. The Annual report, President's report and Auditor's Financial report were discussed during the meeting, and in general business, the main areas of concern raised by the residents were:

- The recent hike in GRV valuations in Coolgardie, resulting in increased rates for residents.
- The pensioner concessions on rates and the payment levy on rates notices.
- There needs to be improved tourism initiatives in the Shire.

It was explained during the meeting that most of these concerns would be addressed in the coming months as the Shire is working on producing a Rating Strategy for the 2017/18 year, and we have Mia Hicks preparing a business case - tourism strategy for our Visitor Centre.

At the conclusion of the meeting after much constructive debate, one resident actually addressed the meeting saying she has noticed the changes the Council is making and thanked everyone for their contribution, which was a very pleasing result for us all.

The Acting CEO and I were invited to attend a meeting with Senator Rick Wilson and Federal Social Services Minister Tudge in Kalgoorlie on May 17th. The Ministers were in the region for consultation regarding the rollout of the National Disability Insurance Scheme, possible trial sites for the introduction of the Cashless Debit Card and anti-social issues facing communities across the Goldfields Regions.

This follows on from discussions at the Regional Council meeting in April, where several Shires expressed support for the introduction of a trial for the Debit Card to be rolled out in the Goldfields as one step toward reducing the anti-social problems facing these communities.

On May 3rd to May 5th, as the Goldfields Delegate on WALGA State Council, I travelled to the Murchison region for the May State Council meeting. The itinerary included visits to the towns of Mt Magnet, Cue and Meekatharra, with overnight stays in Cue and Sandstone on the way home.

It was a good opportunity to see how these Shires are operating and quite interesting to note there is strong mining activity in Mt Magnet and Meekatharra and there is a major influx of tourists in all of these towns, with most of the caravan parks brimming with vans and motor homes.

It was reported to me that many of these visitors come from the Eastern states for the winter months to prospect for gold in these regions, as well as taking in the various local tourist attractions. This is possibly an idea that could go into the strategy Mia Hicks is developing for our Visitor Centre business case.

Collecting firewood for domestic use

Chilly nights have moved in to the Shire of Coolgardie but people looking to stoke the fireplace have been asked to do so responsibly.

- Collection should be for private use only and is restricted to a ute or trailer load at a time.
- Firewood cannot be sold, exchanged or traded for commercial gain.
- It is a legal requirement to gain permission to enter and collect firewood from other land being used by pastoral leaseholders, mining companies and Aboriginal communities.
- Gathering is not allowed within 2 kilometres of station homesteads or on active mining areas.
- A number of restrictions apply to gathering firewood and one restriction is people cannot collect or cut wood within 7.5 kilometres to the towns of Kambalda and Coolgardie, in order to maintain the health of vegetation protecting the towns from dust storms.

Big numbers of first-time prospectors spark safety call

A cooler than usual summer has created an early start to Western Australia's prospecting season and a record number of treasure hunters in the field, prompting a safety warning from the Department of Mines and Petroleum (DMP).

"We usually run a safety campaign at this time of year, but this year we really need to get our message out there to what appears to be record number of first-time prospectors," DMP Executive Director Dr Ivor Roberts said.

"Prospecting is fun for young and old, but people need to be aware of the dangers that claimed the life of a prospector only a few years ago."

Dr Roberts said that nearly 1000 Miner's Rights had been issued since the start of the year, with almost 600 issued since 1 March.

"That means a lot of first-time prospectors will be heading out into regional WA and exposing themselves to the dangers of going bush," he said.

"We are to telling people to obey what we call the Seven Golden Rules for prospecting and the number one rule is to put safety first.

"The department is also encouraging prospectors to carry Personal Locator Beacons (PLBs) when prospecting in remote areas."

The device, which can be purchased from most outdoor stores, is considered by search and rescue organisations to be ideal for use in remote areas as it does not rely on telecommunication networks to submit a signal.

"PLBs are the best way of avoiding the sometimes tragic results of getting lost in the Goldfields and the outback," Dr Roberts said.

"If you're not carrying a beacon, you're not taking enough responsibility for your life and It doesn't matter how much gold you find, if you get lost, you risk losing your life."

The Seven Golden Rules for prospecting campaign will target tourist bureaus, libraries, caravan parks and DMP offices with posters, brochures and booklets.

Fact file:

- A Miner's Right is the most common prospecting permit used by tourists visiting Western Australia and allows holders to prospect on Crown Land with hand-held tools, such as a metal detector, and to take and keep samples or specimens up to 20 kilograms.
- The first Seven Golden Rules prospecting campaign in 2014 was in response to a recommendation by the State Coroner for prospectors to carry a Personal Locator Beacon (PLBs) following the death of a prospector.
- In 2012, lost prospector Michael Graham sparked a 15-day search involving aircraft, motorbikes, horses and expert trackers covering 1500 square kilometres. The body of the 46-year-old father-of-two was never found.
- The Coroner's Court was told that of the nine prospectors who had been reported missing that year, only one had been carrying a PLB and was found within four hours.
- Searches for missing prospectors average 11.3 hours but many last one or two days, while aircraft searches cost up to \$5000 per hour

The Seven Golden Rules of Prospecting

1. Put safety first

- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps, first aid supplies.
- Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) – it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

2. Obtain a Miner's Right permit

when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).

3. Obtain a 40E permit

before prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder),

4. Get written permission

from the tenement holder when prospecting on:

- a mining lease
- an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
- a prospecting licence

- 5. Comply with all legal requirements when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point
- Show respect when on Crown land because it is used or set aside for many purposes.
- 7. **Fill any holes** that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

ANZAC Day 2017 at Coolgardie



This year at Coolgardie there was a March that started at 5.45am from the corner of Renou and Bayley Streets up to the Memorial Garden for the 2017 Coolgardie Dawn Service. The March was led by First Class Constable Ferris and W Corcoran played the bagpipes. The salute was taken by Sergeant Pengilly from the Coolgardie Police Station.

A crowd of approximately 280 people gathered for the 6.00am Dawn Service, RSL President W Corcoran welcomed everyone and invited them to sing the Hymn "Oh God Our Help In Ages Past" the gracious harmonies were sung beautifully by the Coolgardie attendees on the clear crisp morning.

Harley Cullen from Coolgardie Primary School read out the Poem "Flander's Field" with support from his brother Maverick and this was followed on by Cheyenne Aird and Cassiopeia Middleton from CAPS School reading a piece about "Simpson and his Donkey" Well done to our young readers, your voices were clear and crisp and you delivered your speeches very confidently in front of a huge crowd.



Willy Corcoran delivered a address which reflected on the First World War and it's conflicts and how the name "ANZAC" came about due to the two countries that fought together and the mate-ships that came about representing the Australian and New Zealand Army Corp. (The name we now know as the ANZACs). Robin Wade also delivered a powerful and touching address that was heartfelt with the involvement of the Second World War and acknowledged the Papua New Guinea's role (affectionately named The Fuzzy Wuzzy Angels), as well as the background story of the Ensign and he also thanked Robert Javapro for being present with the Papua New Guinea Flag.

This was then followed by the Laying of the Wreaths where W Corcoran played "Abide with Me" on the bagpipes. We then listened to the Ode and the Last Post during which our Air Cadets, Wade, Javapro and Mangwa lowered the flags.

The Minute Silence was followed by Vic Dale's recorded poem titled "Anzac Dawn" and then the Rouse was played and followed by the NZ and the Australian national anthems.

The Sunrise completed the service with a stunning display of gold and orange sending threads of sunlight across the colours and textures of the wreaths, the attendees and the poppies that filled the Memorial and its gardens. Mr Corcoran was pleased with the Service and the attendance and commented that "it was especially moving to see the young children who participated and attended the Service".

After the service everyone was welcomed to a beautifully cooked breakfast, prepared by the RSL Committee ladies and friends. The breakfast was not complete without a cup of the tea or coffee with the appropriate additive, a big thank you to our cooks and bar staff, we really appreciated your involvement.

A talking point of the RSL this year was the fantastic display on the Western wall of the building in the Memorial Garden. A big thank you to the ladies from the CRC Craft group who turned the 2000 plastic bottles into a vibrant display of poppies and also to Alan Bergin for his great efforts in getting that display onto our RSL building.

Additionally a big thank you to the uniformed Police, Fire Brigade and St Johns Ambulance for attending as well as to all of the community members. 




THE WINTER SPRINKLER SWITCH-OFF

1 JUNE - 31 AUGUST

Dear Customer,

This is your friendly reminder that it's time to switch off your sprinklers.

A ban applies to all scheme and bore water users in Perth, Mandurah and some parts of the South West and Great Southern regions, from 1 June to 31 August each year.



WHY DOES THE BAN EXIST?

Evaporation rates are generally lower in winter, so you can leave your sprinklers off and let the rain take care of your lawn and garden instead.

Last winter we saved around 4.8 billion litres of water by switching off our sprinklers and letting the rain take care of our gardens. That's almost enough to fill Subiaco Oval 5 times!



Isaiah was an Old Testament prophet who lived approximately 650 years before the birth of Christ. He recorded many prophecies predicting the coming of the Messiah which proved to be very accurate. In the first chapter of the book named after Isaiah we read of a dialogue between the prophet and God Himself. In Isaiah 1:18 we read of God's invitation which says, 'Come now, and let us reason together, says the LORD.' I recently heard a sermon where it was pointed out that if God asked that question today He would be very lonely, since so few people are capable of reasoning now!

The capacity to reason or even argue has largely been replaced by slogans which are often designed to shut people up from debate. These are some of the slogans I hear: 'the science is settled', 'love wins', 'all religions are the same'. I am sure there are many more. People using these slogans usually mean "shut up" or, "your opinion does not matter". These slogans are actually useless without pursing the reasoning behind them. In probably the most educated society we have ever had people often look to celebrities to comment on every topical issue of the day whether they have any expertise or not. Suddenly we have people who are good at acting supposedly good at politics, economics, global warming and theology. Thinking for oneself seems to be largely outsourced.

The irony is that those who believe in Christ are considered to be brainwashed. Personally, I think that people who deny that we are born moral beings, that complex design demands a designer and that man has a fallen nature must walk around with their eyes shut. There is a common caricature of people of faith being weak, insipid, cowardly and foolish. The Lord Himself promises that those who seek Him with all their heart will find Him. (Jeremiah 29:13). History is replete with men and women of faith with brilliant minds who truly knew how to reason.


