Message from the Shire President June 2017

With the end of the 2016/17 financial year fast approaching, Councillors and staff have been engaged in workshops and strategies in preparation for the implementation of this coming year's budget. Part of this process will be to form a rating strategy to help identify the categories and rate in the dollar that will be required to fund the Shires operating revenue this financial year. Councillors will also refer to the Long Term Financial Plan and the recently adopted Level of Service Plan whilst in deliberations for bringing down the 2017/18 budget.

Technical Services staff has had to delay the start of the Shire Black Spot road projects because of holdups with the Intersection Design Drawings not being completed and approved by MRDWA. Fortunately the funding can be rolled over and these projects will commence in July/August.

The Shire has received a petition from Coolgardie residents to lobby the Minister for Transport and MRDWA, to lower the speed limit on Bayley Street to 50 kmph, and this will be presented to Council for consideration this month.

Coolgardie Community Resource Centre and Recreation Centre staff hosted the first interagency forum in Coolgardie for some time on May 26th. There were representatives from the Department of Sport & Recreation, GETS, Worklink, Red Cross, Department of Prime Minister & Cabinet, Youth Justice and Coolgardie Youth Club. This was a good meeting with some of the discussion points being:

- The number of children roaming the streets during school hours.
- The potential trial of the Welfare Debit Card introduced in the Goldfields region.
- Positives for Coolgardie with the Skate Park upgrade for youth.
- Funding for walking/bike trails and outdoor furniture from Dept Sport & Recreation.
- Suggestion to investigate a project to paint murals in and around Coolgardie to involve the youth, similar to the project in Kalgoorlie.

The Federal Senator for WA, Peter Georgiou visited Coolgardie/Kambalda on Tuesday 27th June, and invited Councillors to meet with him to air any concerns or issues that anyone would like to raise whilst they have the opportunity during his visit here.

I attended the WALGA State Council meetings on May 5th and June 7th. WALGA has called for an alternative option for the collection of the Emergency Services Levy, and has moved to oppose the future collection of the ESL through Local Government rates from 2018/19.

The CCC Commissioner was present at the June meeting, where he highlighted the need for Local Governments to ensure their systems and processes are satisfactory and they continue to strengthen relationships with WALGA, LG Professionals and the Dept of Local Government. He also said that most Local Governments were most at risk during the procurement of goods and services. It was also discussed that the Department of Local Government should take a more proactive (than reactive) role in the part they play in overlooking the compliance of Local Governments in WA.

Many Local Governments are experiencing difficulties in managing the control of off road vehicles in their communities.

There are moves to introduce strategic clearing permits for clearing native vegetation on road verges in WA. This will allow easier access to commence road works etc in the regions.

Murchison Zone moved to lobby the State Government on the following issues:

- Review and amend policy that student progression to next grade/level not be implemented until student meets required standard.
- Raise with State Government the critical issue regarding staffing medical/health centres in regional
 areas. Policy should dictate at least two nurses as a minimum be stationed at health centres where
 there is no hospital.

The annual Goldfields Giants basketball game was held at the Kambalda Community Recreation Facility on Saturday 17 June, with another good crowd attending and enjoying the entertainment. Hosting this event is a credit to our Recreation staff, with the work and effort involved, and thanks go to all our sponsors for making the event possible. It is important that we as a Shire continue to attract and promote events such as this for the benefit of our communities.



HOW TEACH LEARN GROW IS HELPING OUR KIDS' FUTURE

Teach Learn Grow

On Monday the 26th of June, Coolgardie Primary School welcomed 12 enthusiastic volunteers from Teach Learn Grow into their school to tutor the students for a week.

Education is the most important thing that we can give our kids to ensure that they are on the right track to a brighter future. However, on average, remote students are 2 years behind metropolitan schools, and students in remote locations are 12 times more likely to be below the national minimum standard in Mathematics. Furthermore, 3 in 5 Indigenous kids living in remote areas will never finish school. This educational gap between urban and rural students mean that remote and rural students are often severely disadvantaged when it comes to educational opportunities.

Teach Learn Grow (TLG) is a not-for-profit organization that sends over 230 volunteers, biannually, across WA to offer one-to-one tutoring for a week to help make a change for kids across WA. Their mission is to help bridge the gap of educational disadvantage in WA. Every child deserves to have equal opportunities in education, which is why TLG aims to improve the educational outcomes and aspirations of remote students in sociodisadvantaged areas so that they can reach their full potential.

From the 26th of June to the 30th of June, the volunteer's interacted with the wider school cohort each day and immersed themselves in the local community. Tuesday the 27th of June saw the volunteers create an after school 'games night' for the kids for some much deserved down time! The volunteers also put on their running shoes on Thursday the 29th of June and participated in the school's end of term Colour Run.

By sending these well-educated volunteers to tutor and act as positive role models to the students, TLG aims to improve our students' educational achievements and their value towards their education. Above all, they are striving to empower our students to reach their educational goals and potentials, and to see schooling in a more positive light!

But their efforts don't just end there. TLG also provides an eMentor program throughout the schooling terms, and will also be back again for the second part of their bi-annual rural program at the end of the year! Free mammograms for COOLGARDIE women

If you are a woman aged 40 or over you can access the FREE screening mammography service in Coolgardie. BreastScreen WA's mobile service will be located at Coolgardie Health Centre carpark, Wilkie Street from 31/07/2017 to 2/08/2017.

Breast cancer is the most common life threatening cancer for women and one in eight women in Australia will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Having a screening mammogram (breast x-ray) every two years significantly increases the chance of a woman surviving breast cancer and reduces the amount of treatment required. More than 75% of breast cancers occur in women over the age of 50. Research shows that screening is most effective for this age group.

BreastScreen WA's Medical Director Dr Elizabeth Wylie, said screening mammography was the most effective method for early detection of breast cancer.

"Screening every two years is vitally important to increase the chance of a breast cancer being detected when it is too small to feel or be noticed. Finding a cancer at this early stage often means that the breast cancer is small and more treatable".

"A free screening mammogram is one of the best things that women can do to look after their health. Breast screening saves lives and only takes 20 minutes," said Dr Wylie.

Screening mammograms may detect up to 90% of breast cancers.

Any woman with a persistent change in a breast should see her doctor immediately.

The mobile service will then be moving to Laverton and Wiluna.

BreastScreen WA encourages women to make an informed decision about having a mammogram. For more information please visit the BreastScreen WA website www.breastscreen.health.wa.gov.au



Morning tea provided, BYO lunch Wear old clothes Venue: Kambalda Arts Centre—Art Shed We supply all material and tools.



Fake news, fake science, fake refugees, and fake medicine are all terms you now hear in the news. The term is often used by those who want to discredit another person's point of view. Some people say that all religions are fake and man -made. It is obvious to thinking people that where there is something fake there is first something genuine.

Years ago bankers were trained thoroughly in identifying genuine bank notes. This then enabled them to detect fake notes. The numerous variations on the fake notes made it possible to identity them as forgeries. Many people feel they have to explore every faith, every philosophy, every ideology before they can make a choice on what is genuine and what is fake. In reality you only need to study the truth and it will be obvious what is fake.

A lot of people admire Jesus as someone who cared for people, forgave sins and healed the sick. However they baulk at some of His extraordinary claims. He claimed to exist before Abraham as well as claiming to be divine (John 8:58). He claimed to be the resurrection and the life (John 11:25) and He claimed to be the only way to His Father (John 14:6). All these claims seemed like "fake news" to His followers until after His resurrection.

People hate being caught out as gullible. I suspect that the majority of the Australian public consider being agnostic as a safe position to hold. To claim to know truth can come across as arrogant. The irony is that the only access we have to truth is through being humble. If Jesus is judge and Saviour as the Scripture declare, then it is worthwhile to at least consider His claims.




