Message from the Shire President September 2017

As the Goldfields - Esperance representative on WALGA State Council, I attended the meeting in Perth on 7 September 2017.

The meeting this month was held in the North Metro Zone and State Councillors were given a chartered tour of the Mindarie Regional Council facilities including the Mindarie Landfill site and recent subdivision developments in Stirling and Wanneroo City zones. It was extremely informative to hear about the changes to the way city landfill facilities are adapting toward Zero waste into landfill into the future, and highlights some of the issues we are facing dealing with future waste in our Shire.

There will be a slight delay with the opening of the new Skate Park in Coolgardie due to the loose gravel and surrounding verges on the slopes of the facility not being fully completed. Our Technical Services staff are investigating ways to rectify this problem as soon as possible so as to be able to open the Park for the kids of Coolgardie, who are chaffing at the bit to get on and use the facility. It is anticipated to be opened early in October.

Our Technical Services staff attended the annual Regional Road Group meeting last Thursday for the allocation of MRDWA road funding for the 2017/18 financial year. The Shire has applied for increased funding this year in an endeavour to expand our road programme for the benefit of all road users in our Shire, with works scheduled to commence in October.

The opening of the Time Capsule buried under the big rock in the Kambalda Town Square in 1992, was celebrated at the Kambalda Club on Friday 15th September, 25 years to the day it was buried. Former Shire President Mrs Billie Ingham, who was Deputy President at the time, had the honour of performing the opening of the Capsule in front of 45 excited Kambalda residents, many of whom were present during the original burial ceremony. Should anyone wish to view the many photographs or articles that came out of the Capsule, please contact our staff at the Kambalda Community Resource Centre. A Big thankyou goes to our maintenance crew for their work in unearthing the Capsule and Val and CRC staff for organising the opening ceremony for this very historic event.

Funding has been made available for the installation of a 40kw solar powered system onto the Coolgardie Recreation Centre. Along with the system installed onto the Kambalda Community Recreation Facility last year. This will result in further cost savings to the Shire of Coolgardie. This funding was provided through the Goldfields Regional Councils renewable energy programme, which resulted in similar systems fitted to Local Government infrastructure throughout the Goldfields - Esperance Region.

The CEO and I met with the leader of the National Party, Mia Davies along with her associates Jacquie Boydell and Nick Fardell last week to lobby their support for funding toward the Coolgardie Post Office development, as well to make them aware of the closure of the Mining Registrar Office in Coolgardie due to lack of funding being allocated to the building in the WA State Government Budget. There is a Senate estimates hearing scheduled in Perth next week where there may be an opportunity for the Nationals to question the WA Treasurer to ascertain there has been any provision in the State Budget for these building maintenance programmes.

Improving Kambalda's water quality

Currently customers in Kambalda are supplied drinking water which passes through the Spargoville Reservoir, west of the town.

From time to time we have detected the presence of algae, which occurs naturally in this reservoir. Although this is not a health risk, we are aware that the water can look and smell unpleasant for some Kambalda residents and in some instances can affect household appliances.

By delivering this project to supply customers through a new water supply main, which goes around the reservoir, we will be able to significantly improve the quality of Kambalda's water supply.

This work will involve decommissioning the Spargoville Reservoir and constructing 160 metres of new water supply main to go around the reservoir.

Where is this happening?

The work will occur within Water Corporation's Spargoville Reservoir site. See the map below. The water main will mainly be installed by digging an open trench, which will be backfilled and restored.

Hours of construction.

Work will take place between Monday to Sunday, 6.00am - 6.00pm.

Will this work impact me?

This work will be confined to the reservoir site and therefore local residents will not experience any construction impacts such as noise, dust or vibrations from this work.



Time Capsule Contents Unveiled 25 years later

During a celebration afternoon on Friday 15 September 2017, people of the Kambalda community and neighbouring towns reflected on exactly 25 years ago.

They thought about what has changed over the past two and a half decades - fashion, Local Government, Rates, Education, Food - as well as what hasn't.

On 15 September 1992, the Shire along with local schools filled a time capsule with numerous items and buried it at the Kambalda Town Square.

On 15 September 2017, the Shire dug it up and unveiled the contents in the presence of 45 people. Former Shire President Mrs Billie Ingham, who was Deputy President at the time, had the honour of performing the opening of the capsule.

A variety of objects preserved for a quarter of a century; Woolworths catalogues, a dog tag, 25th medallion, photos, newspapers, Kambalda Primary School students work, to name a few.

Each item had been carefully placed in the Stainless Steel air tight capsule and in some cases, labeled.

Several quotes were recorded on the day, describing the experience as "nice and a little sentimental" and "the memories - the pleasantries, the people I knew, I look out here now and I see people and although older, still have the same quality people I knew back then" end quotes.

All contents from the Time Capsule will be on public display at the Kambalda Public Library for the month of October. So come on in and have a look and walk down memory lane. If your child has an item that you wish to take home from the capsule, you may do so at the end of October. Please see a staff member about the process. All photographs will remain the property of the Shire of Coolgardie for future reference.

NOTIFICATION OF ROADWORKS - OCTOBER 2017 TO JANUARY 2018


Main Roads WA will be undertaking roadworks on Goldfields Highway between Marianthus Road and Durkin Road, Kambalda.

Message from the new Officer In Charge

Greetings from new OIC

For those that I haven't had the chance to meet yet, I extend a warm hello and look forward to meeting you. A little about me – I've been a Police Officer for over 11 years. In that time I've worked mostly frontline but also in specialist areas such a Prosecuting Services Division and Sex Crime Division. I was promoted to Sergeant in 2012 and have previously served as a Country Officer in Charge. In 2014, I was admitted as a lawyer in the Supreme Court WA and High Court of Australia. I'm married and have two wonderful children. I am passionate about delivering justice for victims of crime. I believe in the rule of law and its application on all citizens. I also believe in what President Regan said about law and order; 'We must reject the idea, that every time a law is broken society is at fault rather than the law breaker. We must restore the American precept that each individual is responsible for his actions.' To that end, I commit to conduct quality investigations to withstand legal/judicial scrutiny to ensure that wrong doers are held accountable.

Over the past few months, I'm proud of the achievements Coolgardie Police have achieved. There was an unusual increase in burglary and stealing offences during the first eight weeks of my tenure here. In that time, we've managed to identify who the offenders are and have preferred 15 burglary charges against eight juveniles. All of these offenders were convicted in Court and have been sentenced or are awaiting sentence. We've also identified and charged a 21 year old man with receiving stolen property from one of the juvenile offenders. Seven *Misuse of Drugs Act* search warrants have been executed resulting in 15 drug charges and 2 firearms charges. We've also recovered over \$4 500 worth of stolen property. It's extremely rewarding for us being able to return stolen property to the rightful owners.

Coolgardie Day was a great success and thanks to all those who volunteered their time and effort. From a policing perspective, there were nil reported offences during the day which we're quite pleased about.

May I take this opportunity also to remind you all about the importance of ensuring that your vehicles and homes are locked and secure. Heading into the warmer months, it is quite common for people to leave their homes for extended periods on holidays. Please ask a friend/relative to keep up appearances if possible i.e. taking bin out, alternate a different light to be left on inside etc.
