Shire of Coolgardie Message from the Shire President April 2018



The shire released a community and corporate survey for community consultation and to receive submissions during April as part of the process to gather information from our communities to draft a new Community Strategic Plan 2018 - 28. To date more than 130 surveys and 40 submissions have been received and these will be evaluated into the draft plan to go back into the community for final consultation before being adopted by council.

As part of this consultation process, some concern has been raised regarding the future of the Kambalda pool. I would like to assure residents that it is not the intent of council nor our staff that the pool be closed. For some time now, our pool managers have raised concerns with several major issues that require to be addressed and as part of the community survey several options for a future aquatic centre in Kambalda were put in as suggestions. As a result of this shire staff are undertaking the following measures to assess the structure of the pool and filtration system during the winter months:

- Staff currently sourcing quotes to de-water pool surrounds.
- Scope of works for structural engineering report by 20th April.
- De-watering of pool surrounds commence 7th May.
- Emptying of pool to commence 14th May.
- Structural engineer to commence work 21st May.
- Engineers report received by mid-June.
- Community workshop end of June.
- CSP adopted by Council in July.

Shire staff have been undertaking training by DSS officers during April in preparation for the rollout of the cashless debit card trial in the Goldfields region. The rollout of the card commenced in Coolgardie with residents receiving their documents recently, and it is expected that Kambalda residents will receive theirs in mid-May. The shire has appointed two new officers, one in the Coolgardie Administration Office and the other in Kambalda Resource Centre to co-ordinate the shop fronts and assist participants in the scheme to activate their new cards.

I would urge any of our residents that have any concerns whatsoever, to call in at either shop front where our staff will be only too happy to assist with setting up the card in an endeavour to ensure a smooth transition.

Coolgardie residents and visitors alike welcomed the return of some greenery to Tommy Talbot Park in the centre of town recently, where Chris Hicks and his crew have transformed part of the park. Green synthetic grass has been placed where the ground has lay bare since the original lawn was removed to prevent further water damage to the stonework on the nearby buildings two years ago. Visitor Centre staff have received many positive comments from people following these works.

I received an invitation from our local mining and pastoral member, Kyle McGinn, to meet with him in Coolgardie on April 13, where he announced that the Minister for Mines had confirmed that the Mining Registrar's Office in Coolgardie would re-open upon the completion of the upgrade and repairs to the building being undertaken by the Department of Finance (Building Management, Works). To achieve this result has taken a lot of lobbying of various government departments and ministers, and I would like to thank Kyle for his effort, as this is really good news for our community, mining companies, prospectors and tourists alike.

Our road crew has been busy recently, working toward putting the finishing touches on the Lady Loch haulage route, and maintenance work on Binneringie Road north of Widgiemooltha. Both these roads are being prepared for major increases in heavy vehicle traffic, with the Burbank's mining centre increasing activity south of Coolgardie, and Tawana ramping up production of lithium at Bald Hill and transporting their product to the Esperance port.

Maintenance grading has also been carried out on sections of Coolgardie North and Jaurdi Hills roads, repairing washouts caused Continued P3

by the recent heavy rains in the region.

Our Technical services staff are undertaking road assessments in preparation for funding submissions to RRG and R2R Groups for road works in the 2018/19 and 19/20 years.

Our waste co-ordinator has been kept busy with the receival of asbestos related material from the roof replacements taking place in Kambalda following the severe storms last November. There is approximately 220 houses that will have the roof replacements in the towns during this process, most of which will be disposed of at the Kambalda tip, and this will have a part effect of modernising the towns through this natural disaster.

On a much sadder note, the Coolgardie community is mourning the sudden and tragic loss of long-time resident and councillor Bob Kippin. Bob passed away following a tragic accident on Easter Saturday and his enthusiasm and commitment to his fellow residents and our communities will be greatly missed. He was fittingly farewelled at a moving memorial service at the Coolgardie Recreation Centre on Friday 13th April by a huge crowd of family, friends and acquaintances, with the hall set up with an outback bush setting especially for Bob. On behalf of the councillors and staff, I wish to offer our sincere condolences to his wife Gill and all of the families.

The Kambalda community has also received sad news last week with the sudden passing of Mrs Maureen Kuhn. Maureen and her late husband Bert were long-time residents of the Kambalda community, and she devoted many years of service to the schools in Kambalda as well as supporting many other community organisations. They raised their family in Kambalda, with Noeline and Cyril being current members of our shire staff, and granddaughter Jessica was recently a trainee at the shire. Maureen's presence in Kambalda will be missed by all, and on behalf of the councillors and all staff I wish our sincere condolences to the Kuhn and Poke families.

The Cashless Debit Card trial has started in Coolgardie and shortly will be in Kambalda. Pop down and see our friendly teams that are there to help with the setting up of the card. The Coolgardie office is in the shire administration building on Bayley Street and the Kambalda office is in the Kambalda Community Recreation Facility.

It was a great sadness that one of our councillors, Bob Kippin, passed away in Coolgardie on Saturday, March 31, 2018. I only knew Bob a short time in working with him as an elected member of council. Bob was dedicated, professional and a damn good bloke. He will be missed by all of us at the shire and his Coolgardie community, where he was such an active and respected member. Bob's funeral was held at the Coolgardie Community Recreation Centre on Friday, April 13, 2018 and it was so fitting for his personality and his wishes of having a "bush funeral". Well done to everyone for making this happen for Bob, it was a brilliant send off for a person so deserving of it.

The shire crews have been spending time doing one off clean-ups of illegal dumping in the bush. This exercise is not only an added expense to the shire but it is taking our crew away from their schedules and maintenance plans. These clean-ups are still in progress. If you see anyone doing illegal dumping please report it.

Our rangers are currently targeting abandoned vehicles, registrations and microchipping of dogs and impoundment of wandering dogs. It is a dog owners responsibility to ensure that that their dogs are contained at their properties and by law all dogs must be microchipped and registered with the shire. If you are unsure if your dog is microchipped, our ranger will come and check the dog and can also do the microchipping at your property rather than you having to take them into Kalgoorlie to a vet. If you contact the shire on 9080 2111 they can arrange to make an appointment with the ranger for you.

Large gathering for Kambalda service

At around 5.50am members of the uniformed parade; Volunteer Fire & Rescue Brigade; St John's; police and two students from the local high school, were assembled at the cenotaph.

There were approximately 300 members of the community assembled around the cenotaph, which was arguably, the best turnout ever. It was noted that the mining company Goldfields Australia, provided two large buses to transport their workers in for the occasion.

At 6am the dawn service began under the control of the President. He read out an address which detailed the origin and meaning of ANZAC Day. This was followed by a wreath laying ceremony. The parade was brought to attention and the flag ceremony began, with St John's controlling the flags. The bugle sounded the *Last Post*; the flags were lowered onto the left shoulders, the *Ode* was delivered, one minutes silence observed, *Reveille* sounded and the flags raised to the top of the flag poles and back to half-mast.

The parade was dismissed, the President thanked the community for attending and everybody, except the poor workers from Goldfields, went for a gunfire breakfast cooked by members of the Kambalda Club.

Representatives gathered again and at 11am the parade marched into the cenotaph area to the sounds of *I was only 19* by Redgum, which began proceedings.

The ceremony was very well supported by the Kambalda and Kalgoorlie Oasis Family Church where the ladies sang the songs for the occasion and the Pastor Bill Kirkland delivered prayers. A wreath-laying ceremony took place followed by the sub-branch president giving an address based on remembrance, which included the battle at Villers-Brettonneux. At 11.15am the RAAF gave us a wonderful fly past of four aircraft, which was very well enjoyed by all that were present, and followed by the remainder of the service and the final parade.

The president thanked all those who had contributed towards the commemoration. The final salute was taken by Leading Firefighter, Bevan Hamilton, who celebrates 25 years of service with the Kambalda brigade this year. He is also an RSL member, service no. 522455. The parade was then dismissed and we all went to the Kambalda Club to enjoy that 'cold frothy' refreshment, the ANZAC Footy game and the 2 UP, which was very well run by John Kempton. The crisp Coolgardie Anzac morning started with a march at 5.50am from the corner of Renou and Bayley street up to the Memorial Garden for the 2018 Dawn Service. Willy Corcoran played the bagpipes and the March was led by the Coolgardie Police officers and Robin Wade. The salute was taken by Sergeant McGeown from the Coolgardie Police Station.

A crowd of approximately 200 people gathered for the 6.00am Dawn Service. RSL President Willy Corcoran welcomed everyone and the crowd waited for a surprise in the sky at 6.05am which was Rod Higgins doing an impressive Fly Over in his plane. Mr Corcoran then invited the crowd to sing the Hymn 'Oh God Our Help In Ages Past' the gracious harmonies were sung beautifully by the Coolgardie attendees.

Cheyenne Aird from Caps Coolgardie read out the poem *Flander's Field* and later in the service Riley Ford from Coolgardie Primary School read *The Ode.* Well done to our young readers, who delivered their readings beautifully in front of the large crowd.

Mr Corcoran delivered an address which reflected on the first world war, its conflicts and shared some stories. This was then followed by the laying of the wreaths, the lowering of the flags and a minute's silence. The service concluded just as flickering rays of dawn sunshine fell over the attendees.

Mr Corcoran was pleased with the service and the attendance and commented that it was fantastic to see the young children who participated and attended, and the impressive poppy display on the wall and the new wreaths which were done by the Coolgardie CRC craft ladies.

After the service everyone was welcomed to a beautifully cooked breakfast, prepared by the RSL committee members Tom Carr, Ann Gould, Chris Jones and Chris Burke who all had an very early







| Summary in a snapshot | When we first joined the Waterwise Business Program, we learned that 90 per cent of the water used at our Kambalda Community Recreation Facility (Shire of Coolgardie) was due to irrigation. We've been able to make huge savings through implementing irrigation efficiencies and using alternative water sources. |
| What we did | To reduce the amount of water being used in irrigation we fitted rain sensors and aligned the irrigation system with the watering roster. We continue to monitor our reticulation and have implemented a leak detection and repair program. Our horticultural staff are committed to improving water efficiency and have increased their water conservation awareness through use of waterwise educational tools. |
| Benefits/outcomes | We have reinvested the money saved by reducing water into facilitating reticulation improvements and pump replacements to maintain an efficient irrigation system. |
| Learnings | By concentrating our attention on a specific area of our site and using fresh thinking we have been able to make efficiency savings of over 35 per cent. |
| What's next for us? | Moving forward we will continue to monitor our irrigation use and settings and carry out leak detection and follow-up repairs where necessary to avoid unnecessary water loss. |

Banners in the Terrace is one of WA's largest art projects, featuring entrants from Councils all over the state.



St John Ambulance WA has released a new, free smart phone app, First Responder.

The St John First Responder app has a range of features, one being its unique first responder capability. The app allows qualified first aiders to sign up as a first responder and be notified when someone has called 000 for an ambulance within 500 metres of their current location and in a public place.

To become a first responder you will need to provide evidence of having completed a first aid course within the last three years. Minimum qualification level of HLTAID001 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

If you're not looking to sign up as a first responder yet, then that's okay! The app also contains a number of other resources, including:

First aid instruction guides - helping you to treat a range of injuries and illnesses.

Triple zero (000) calling with automatic GPS location – calling 000 from the app will send your GPS coordinates direct to the St John State Operation Centre, making it easier for an ambulance to locate you.

Defibrillator (AED) locator - showing all the defibrillator locations near you.

Upload the location of new defibrillator (AED) locations that aren't currently appearing on the app.

Locate nearest medical centres and emergency departments - including live ED waiting time information.

Patient transport services information.

Your first aid course information and refresher reminder notices

First aid tips and special offers - keeping you up to date with handy first aid information.

First Responder is a free app and available on <u>Apple's App Store</u> and <u>Google Play</u>. You can find out more about how to use the app in our <u>First Aid Responder App Guide</u>.

From the desk of the Coolgardie Volunteer Fire & Rescue Captain - David Shilton

Hi everyone

Well April has been a busy month for the fire brigade with a busy bee clean-up at the station and grounds and two training courses that our members participated in: a first aid and a BA refresher course. These courses are provided by DFES and our members have increased their skills and knowledge whilst becoming further qualified.

Winter is approaching so it's time to put some precautions in place now to avoid possible fires and damages to your house. Make sure your fires and chimneys are cleaned and if the power goes off due to storms, be careful with candles and don't leave them unattended, near windows with curtains or next to any flammable products. Every year there are house fires that could be avoided doing these simples steps:

- Have you checked your clothes dryer lately? Make sure they are clean of lint and dust; if you are drying clothes in front of a fire or radiators make sure you have them at a safe distance to avoid a fire.
- Have you checked your gutters lately? Make sure you clean out your gutters to prevent flooding over the winter rainy months. Gutters should be cleaned twice yearly.
- Smoke alarms in the house. We can't stress enough how important and affordable these are and they do save lives! Check the batteries in them and if you don't have them already go and get them. Batteries should be replaced on Aprils Fools Day (1st of April) annually. House fires do not happen only in the day time when everyone is awake, they can happen during the night or early morning while everyone is asleep and if looked after smoke alarms do not sleep!
