Shire of CoolgardieMessage from the Shire President
March 2019



The Shire's technical services and road construction staff have made great progress over the past month and a half in having the majority of planned road projects and resealing of local roads throughout the Shire completed on time and within budgets that were allowed. The use of local contractors for some of the larger projects, such as the Kambalda Tip intersection, the Black Spot work on Coolgardie North Road and King Street, has enabled the Shire to achieve and be within sight of the completion of 2018/19 years road program. Thanks, and acknowledgement for the work and effort in these achievements to Peter Miller, Keith Dickerson (RSA Works) and all the Shire team.

Our community and recreation centre staff, in consultation with Council, have initiated the opening up of the Kambalda Recreation Centre stadium to the public on weekends for the first time since the facility was built. This proposal was suggested to enable and encourage more use of the facility by volunteers with less input from Shire staff, and so far has proven to be really successful, culminating in nearly two hundred children and adults competing in the recent tee ball and netball competitions.

These programs have also provided an indoor activity for Kambalda residents during the temporary closure of the Kambalda pool. The opening of the centre on the weekends has also seen a significant benefit to business within the precinct due to the increasing amount of people in the town centre.

Thankfully there has been a significant downturn in activity regarding the recent spate of bushfires in the Shire of late. This has been one of the worst bushfire seasons in recent memory, which had major impacts of road closures and a serious drain on Shire resources over the past two months. Over the next months, Shire staff will be drafting up a bushfire strategy and looking at installing strategic fire breaks around our townsites and industrial areas in an endeavour to safeguard against any future fire events.

I would like to acknowledge the effort our Shire staff, and all the volunteers who spent many hours out fighting and finally bringing all these fires under control. Our fire control officers Rod Franklin and Steve Forward, along with DFES officers, formed a good working relationship during this time, and the lessons learnt from these events will put the Shire in good stead going forward in future years.

The Shire was fortunate to be included with a visit to the Goldfields by the Federal Assistant Minister for Transport Scott Buchholz, accompanied by the Member for O'Connor Rick Wilson. Whilst in Coolgardie we took the opportunity to present the Ministers with our economic prospectus and a short tour of previous heavy vehicle intersection upgrades on Carins, Coolgardie North Roads, Great Eastern Highway as well as the proposed truck assembly and parking zone off Lady Loch Road. Both Ministers were quite surprised with the statistics on the amount of heavy vehicle traffic passing through Coolgardie and were very interested with the volume of lithium currently transported to Esperance along the Coolgardie-Esperance Highway.

The community workshop to inform Kambalda residents on the progress of the upgrades and renovation of the Kambalda Pool on March 19 attracted over 70 residents to the recreation centre. CEO James Trail provided a Power Point slide in an endeavour to provide information regarding actions taken by staff so far to assess the pathway to replace and restore the entire facility, including the pool bowl, balance tanks, filtration and chlorination systems and building infrastructure in a staged process that would see the project completed by late November to mid December.

A detailed proposal to fund the upgrades was also provided, with the majority of funding dependent upon a \$1.9 million loan from the WA Treasury. Council and staff are confident with the processes and procedures that have been put in place, and we will be in a good position to see the Kambalda Pool restored to its former glory prior to Christmas this year.

The start of local football has come upon us very quickly. I would like to wish the Kambalda Football Club all the best for the 2019 season.

Thank you to everyone who attended the Kambalda swimming pool community information evening on Tuesday, March 19, 2019. It was great to see in excess of 70 members of the community out in force expressing their views/opinions and asking questions. The community members in attendance were advised of the following:

- Tender advertised and closed February 1, 2019.
- Site inspections undertaken by all tenderers.
- Meeting held in Perth between all prospective tenderers, Shire staff and consulting engineer.
- Workshop held with Councillors to discuss funding options.
- Loan documentation submitted to Western Australian Treasury Corporation.
- Letter from Shire President to large businesses and mining industry operating in the Shire as well as local members and Ministers.
- Grant Applications submitted to State Government for \$880,000 Unsuccessful.
- Grant application submitted to Federal Government for \$500,000 Unsuccessful.
- Draft tender assessment completed.

The tender for the upgrade of the Kambalda Aquatic Facility was awarded at the Council meeting held on March 26.

I recently received the draft of the Bayley Street Road Safety Audit. This document will be workshopped with Council as well as engaging with the Coolgardie community in the coming two months. It was exciting also to receive funding for the

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redevelopment of the Post Office Precinct from the Federal Government. It was extremely welcomed when the Federal Member for O'Connor Rick Wilson MP announced grant funding of \$916,100.

April is a busy month of events, with school holidays and public holidays in our communities. The Blessing of the Roads will be held in Coolgardie Park at 9.30am on April 10, and Kambalda Town Square at 9.30am on April 11. This event highlights a very important road safety message. We need to take our time and take care on the roads to keep our families and communities safe in this special holiday period.

The Coolgardie and Kambalda RSL will be holding their Anzac Services on Thursday 25 April 2019. Times and more details are advertised on pages 27 and 32.

Well done to our Recreation staff in both towns who have some fantastic and creative activities planned for our children during the school holiday period. I am sure the community will get behind these activities.



Congratulations to Danny Poglits who won the gym membership, and Ryan Pettit who won the door prize.



Pioneer women of the Eastern Goldfields

When it comes to the history of Coolgardie there are a lot of stories about the men who flocked to the area, their discoveries and achievements.

However, there were also a lot of women worth mentioning.

This is the story about the first two women who arrived in Coolgardie. It is sourced from a wonderful and well-known author, Norma King, and her book called *Daughters of Midas*.

Ann and Edith Murphy

Around 1889-1890, Ann's husband Felix opened a general store in Southern Cross, while she and her daughters ran a boarding house.

The discovery of gold and the rush to Coolgardie saw Felix and his sons become teamsters working for a company known as I.J.K Cohn, carting supplies between Southern Cross and Coolgardie. Felix quickly realised the need for a general store in the new mining area and discussed the matter with his wife. She agreed to move to Coolgardie. And so, on October 16, 1892, the Murphy's left Southern Cross with a team laden with goods and equipment for the store. Three days later Ann and her 11-year-old daughter made history by being the first European females in Coolgardie.

They erected their canvas store and living quarters among all the activity in the area known as Fly Flat. About six weeks later, Warden Finnerty advised the community to leave the area as water supplies were dangerously low. Ann, Edith and a large number of men went back to Southern Cross in time for Christmas.

The following winter, Ann and Edith returned to Coolgardie to help Felix look after the new store, which he had erected in the more suitable location of Bayley Street.

Edith Murphy was a tomboy and she enjoyed living in Coolgardie among the diggers – who had given her the nickname "Tommy".

One day, Edith "borrowed" a horse to take on a joy ride. The owner of the horse thought it had been stolen so he reported it to the police. When Edith returned, and the owner realised it wasn't stolen after all, he told the police to forget the matter. Ann Murphy had other ideas however and told Warden Finnerty he must make Edith stand up in court and charge her with stealing – if only to teach her a lesson. He was hesitant at first, but finally agreed. He took her to court and placed the

now very alarmed girl in the dock and said, "Tommy Murphy I charge you with stealing a horse". In later years Edith told her family she never forgot her fright when the Warden uttered those words – even though she knew it was a mock court. Not long after this episode, Edith was sent away to school at St Joseph's Convent in Perth.

Edith returned to Coolgardie for the opening of the railway in 1896, so the pioneers of the "Old Camp" took the opportunity to invite both Ann and Edith to a function at Fahaan's Hotel Club. There they gifted them each with a gold keyless Rotherham watch with chains and pendants attached in honour of being the first European women in Coolgardie.

Ann and Felix moved to Leederville not long after the ladies received this honor and opened a new business, where they lived a long and happy life together.

Edith lived until the age of 87. She was known to have a go at everything and was fiercely independent, wanting to earn her own living and arrange her own life after her husband passed away. She enjoyed sport, horse racing and dancing.

They truly were amazing women!

On Friday, March 8, Coolgardie's local police officers Rob and Chris held a fun-filled evening with some of the youth in town.


The afternoon started with some tasty refreshments - a sausage sizzle and fruit platter - for everyone to enjoy at the Coolgardie Recreation Centre.



Little leprechauns in the Kambalda library


There was a lot of green and orange at the Kambalda Public Library during a storytime marking St. Patrick's Day last month.


Improvements to the Cashless Debit Card



Almost one year after the initial roll-out of the Cashless Debit Card trial in the Goldfields region, the departments of Social Services and Indue have been working on a number of improvements to the card functionality as well as updates to the Indue website.

Most of those improvements came into effect as of the end of January and start of February 2019 and were a response to feedback from participants and well as other stakeholders.

Direct debits were previously only allowed using the Indue



card number. Now, a major improvement has been put into place and direct debits can now be set up using the Indue BSB and account number. A direct debit is a regular payment set up to pay a merchant or company directly. Such payments can be set up weekly, fortnightly or monthly with any business that allows direct debits. If you have set up your direct debit providing your Indue card number (recurring Visa debit) you will be asked to update your payment details once your card expires or if your card is lost. This means details will need to be updated eventually.

If setting up a direct debit providing your Indue BSB and account number those payments remain in place until you actively request to cancel the regular payment/direct debit with the merchant/company.

This improvement now enables all forms of bill payment with the Cashless Debit Card and will allow participants who are currently transferring funds to their regular bank account to bypass the previous set up and having to allow 2-3 business days for those transfers.

- In addition, the Department of Social Services has worked together with Indue to develop web tutorials to assist participants with the following:
 - 1. Direct Debits.
 - 2. BPay.
 - 3. Internal and external transfers.

These tutorials are now available as an additional step when activating a new Cashless Debit Card online or can be found on the new Indue website at **www.cdc.indue.com.au** under the tab "How-to tutorials". If you are a participant and feeling unfamiliar with your web portal, your local partner shopfront staff are more than happy to assist you to access those tutorials and will guide you through all the steps.

Further improvements include:

Navigating through the updated new Indue CDC website has been made easier with a search functionality throughout the website and a new FAQ search to find specific information.

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- Finding your nearest local partner shopfront, with location and business hours, CDC ATMs, or finding out where to obtain a replacement card has been updated and is now showing an interactive map linked to Google Maps on the Indue website under the support tab.
- With all those changes the "Approved Merchants List" has been removed and is no longer necessary as all merchants are considered approved unless listed on the "Blocked Merchants List".
- Should you still be accessing your web portal using the old Indue website it will automatically redirect you to the new website www.cdc.indue.com.au and no additional steps are needed.
- Saving account and payee details. From May this
 year, additional updates will follow to allow participants
 to save BPay and account details online. Cardholders
 will be able to add, update or delete payee details or
 select from a list of saved payees when setting up a
 transfer on their web portal, adding a much requested
 feature to the Indue account for participants.


 Online shopping is now available. Please check the Indue website to see if a particular website is available or blocked. Previously, each online merchant had to be approved but now all online merchants are approved unless specifically blocked by Indue.

In many instances, your rent will be paid before your payment goes onto your Cashless Debit Card. In other private rental agreements, you can use your Cashless Debit Card to pay rent by BPAY, eftpos or direct debit.



Misconception 2: I can't use my card interstate.

You can use your Cashless Debit Card in any location in Australia

You can use your Cashless Debit Card in any store that accept eftpos nationwide, except to buy alcohol, gambling products, some gift cards or to withdraw cash.



Misconception 3: I can't buy second hand items (furniture, cars etc) or items at markets.

You can purchase items with cash from markets and stalls

You can use the 20 per cent of your payment paid into your regular back account to make cash purchases. There is also an ability to transfer additional funds in certain circumstances where you need access to additional cash.



Misconception 4: Indue charge fees to use the card.

The Cashless Debit Card is a fee-free account

The Cashless Debit Card is a fee-free account for participants. You can check your account balance and transaction history for free online, over the phone or at an ATM. Lost or stolen cards are replaced for free and purchases do not incur transaction fees or account keeping fees.



Misconception 5: I can't shop online.

You can shop online using your Cashless Debit Card

From 29 January 2019, you can use your card to make purchases from all online retailers, except those that sell alcohol or have gambling activities available such as online casinos.



Misconception 6: I can't buy meals where alcohol is also served (mixed merchants).

You can use the Cashless Debit Card at restaurants and bistros

You will be able to purchase food using your Cashless Debit Card at most restaurants and bistros in Cashless Debit Card trial sites, however alcohol cannot be purchased with the card.






