May 2019



Well it has finally happened. Following the approval of the \$1.95 million loan by WA State Treasury, the Tender documents for the Kambalda Pool upgrade were signed on May 1. The successful tenders, Acorp Pty Ltd, are now onsite in Kambalda and working steadily on the planned upgrades and renovations of the facility. As part of the agreement with Treasury, the Shire has engaged Core Business to be the project managers to oversee all of these works, with Core providing our CEO with weekly updates as works progresses. The Shire is now confident that the facility will be opened as planned in December or at the latest early January 2020.

Councillors and staff have been busily engaged with Stephen Tweedie and Chris Liversage from Conway/Highbury in reviewing Shire local laws, the delegations register and council policy manual over the past two months. As a result of these reviews and work being carried out, the Shire local laws and policies will be much more aligned and streamlined to be effectively administered and understood by Councillors and staff.

This process has been ongoing for some years by various staff members, however, the use of outside resources has enabled the work to be completed whilst making economic savings and efficiencies on our CEO's and staff time.

The Shire consultants that have been engaged to produce a comprehensive report on both the Shire waste facility sites, Strategen and Australian Venture Consultants, are nearing completion of these reports. Whereby the Shire will be in a position to consult with both our communities with the proposed direction the Shire will be required to take in order to meet all regulatory requirements in the management of these waste facilities into the future. It is expected these community consultation forums will be held in the coming weeks.

With the increased mining activity in the Shire recently, where several new companies to the region have purchased mines that have been on care and maintenance, or inactive for some years, our CEO has initiated a feasibility study to investigate options to reopen the Kambalda Airport in the event these operations commence in the near future.

Although the Council position is that we have promoted and pushed for residential workforces in our communities for some years, we have to recognise these companies have a duty of care to provide a safe environment for their employees and this may include shorter travel times to each mine site where they accommodate them.

Our CEO has taken the opportunity to employ Mia Hicks as the Shire Executive Economic Development Manager. Mia, who had been previously engaged as a funding-business case consultant at the Shire, brings a wealth of knowledge to the organisation with some 20 years' experience in her field. I believe that this expertise will be of great benefit to the Shire of Coolgardie, with Mia mentoring staff in line with the current turnaround within the mining industry in our region and the growing amount of projects that are coming on stream in both our towns.

The unexpected result from the Federal Government election last weekend, with the Morrison Liberal Government being re-elected with an increased majority, I believe will put our Shire in a reasonably strong position to continue the good working relationships we have built with Ministers and their Chiefs of Staff, to leverage funding for future projects and facilities in our Shire.

The Shire has received verbal confirmation that the grant funding promised for both our projects, the Kambalda Pool and Coolgardie Post Office Precinct will be honoured, which is great news for our communities.



Trials and tribulations of Coolgardie's pioneer nurses

In the exciting days following the discovery of gold, Coolgardie would have obviously lacked many things necessary for good health – such as adequate supplies of fresh food and water, and no organised sanitary facilities.

Consequently, sickness such as typhoid and dysentery became common. The need for medical attention was very urgent.

Among the first of the nurses to answer the call for help was Nurse Baseby – who had a handful of willing helpers. She was followed by Nurse Penglase, whose husband was working on the mines while she was in Perth with their three children. She left them to be cared for and set out for Coolgardie.

Nurse Baseby quickly set up a tent hospital and nursed the sick either in the hospital, in camps or in their own homes. Later she ran her own maternity hospital and it is estimated she delivered more than 1000 babies in the Goldfields region, often without the assistance of a doctor.

Of course, there were plenty of nurses who came to Coolgardie to assist with the sick and the dying. The conditions in which they worked is difficult to imagine – heat in the summer, cold in the winter, dust and sometimes mud, and let's not forget the flies! The nurses' ankle-length frocks, long starched petticoats and aprons did little to keep them cool during the summer, nor did the fashionable

long hair which was coiled up on top of their heads and felt like a wet cushion as it was never dry.

In April 1894, two nurses by the names of Sister Margaret O'Brien and Lena Miller arrived. They checked into the Exchange Hotel and immediately asked Warden Finnerty for a site for their own tent hospital. He gave them permission to set up near the Government hospital, then continued to ask if they would look after that as well, as at the time a constable was in charge.

The Warden showed them over the hospital, and Sister O'Brien commented later that the patients were "the dirtiest looking objects imaginable, covered in dust and sand indescribable ... tents and more tents, men everywhere, old singlets and trousers were the order of their dress. The hopeless look of everything would have discouraged the stoutest heart".

As autumn set in, the women appealed for funds to buy blankets as the patients began to suffer from the cold. Mr. Faahan held a concert at his Club Hotel which raised some funds, while others took up collections.

Towards the end of 1894, the two resigned from the Government hospital, but continued caring for patients in their own private hospital, which was relocated to a site in Lindsay Street.

By February 1895 there were 60 patients in the Coolgardie hospital, most suffering from fever. Sister O'Brien's hospital and a few other private ones were all overcrowded as typhoid was rampant and people from all walks of life fell victim to the disease.

The lack of water made nursing extremely difficult. The rationed and expensive condensed water did not taste pleasant and was insufficient for sponging and cooling the patients with high temperatures. In despair, when the water supply ran out, nurses often tried to cool feverish bodies by damping a sponge with whiskey or brandy – two liquids Coolgardie was never short of.

Another nurse worth mentioning is Nurse M.D Edis, who, despite being told by her matron that she would "never make the grade" went on to receive the Florence Nightingale Medal and medals from the two world wars and a Coronation Medal.

Unfortunately, tragedy also struck some of the nurses. One nurse by the name of Adams fell victim to typhoid. A young widow named Elizabeth Gold was murdered by gunshot at the hospital.

The man who shot her then turned the gun on himself.

"It was noble of them to come to nurse the sick and injured at a digging camp ... and we bid them welcome to Coolgardie."

She was dressed in a gown getting ready to leave for the Coolgardie Ball.

And Nurse Mercy Gregory (who was married to J. Gregory, proprietor of the United Club Hotel) was also murdered. During a stay in Sydney, a night porter at the hotel she was staying at broke into her room. She disturbed the young man stealing her jewelry and, in a panic, he cut the nurse's throat. There is a water fountain in the Coolgardie Park that was erected by her friends to remember her by.

A journalist for the *Coolgardie Miner* wrote of the pioneer nurses: "It was noble of them to come to nurse the sick and injured at a digging camp, we feel we speak not only for ourselves but for the entire field when we bid them welcome to Coolgardie."

The nurses who braved the conditions to treat the sick were true heroines.

Shedding light on the tale of the lonely grave

There are several unmarked and lonely graves in the Coolgardie region. This is understandable, considering the living conditions in the 1890s.

For example, as you head toward Bonnie Vale on the Coolgardie North Road, there is a lonely grave located on the side of the road to your right.

For a long time, no one knew the story of this grave, and even to this day no one knows the name of the man buried there.

Thankfully for us, the wonderful Victor Dale, who has lived in Coolgardie his whole life, was able to tell us the story of this lonely grave. The story was passed down to him by his father Harry, which was passed down from Harry's father John.

In 2018, Mr Dale kindly paid for and erected a memorial stone at the lonely grave for the purpose of preserving history. This is the story of the unknown man that was told around campfires where men and horses rested for the night, and which was passed down from two men who were in Coolgardie at the time:

He was a teamster with a full load of freight on the Bonnie Vale road. This man rested his team of horses on the small rise to check his horses' hooves for stones, and was kicked by one of the horses.



Later, another team passing through the area found the man dead beside the road and buried him where they found him.

That is just one of many tragedies that happened in the beginning of pioneer settlement in Coolgardie.

Maybe one day we will be able to piece together the stories of the men, women and even children who have been forgotten.

Farewell Peter and Robyn

For the past two years, we have had the absolute pleasure of having Peter and Robyn maintain our historic Warden Finnerty's Residence in Coolgardie.

Peter and Robyn were dedicated to the task, and poured love, care and pride into the house, bringing it to life both inside and out. They have introduced new gardens, maintained the collections, warmly welcomed our tourists, made friends with the visiting wildlife and enjoyed beautiful sunsets and music from the patio.



Their efforts did not stop at Warden Finnerty's, as last year they also dedicated their Friday mornings to making pancakes for the students at Coolgardie Primary School, and were also more than happy to get their "bake on" whenever the school had a bake sale fundraiser.

Sadly for us, Peter and Robyn have decided to move back to the eastern states to be closer to their families, and we thank them for the difference that they have made to our community. It has been a pleasure getting to know them and they will be dearly missed.

Goodbye Peter and Robyn, we wish you all the best for your future - travel safe and thank you for being part of our lives!



New gear and new skills at Freestyle Now clinic


On May 19, 2019, we held a Freestyle Now clinic at the Kambalda skate park.

Thanks to our amazing community we raised a whopping \$737.55, which has been donated Cancer Council Australia!






















Congratulations to all feather hunters!

In accordance with Section 6.36 of the Local Government Act 1995 and the notice of Councils intention to levy Differential Rates for the 2019/20 financial year, the following are estimated Differential Rates and Minimum Payments for the Shire of Coolgardie and the Objects and Reasons for these Differential Rates.

In addition to the differential rating Council also give notice of its intention to levy a specified area rate for the 2019/20 financial year for the purpose of applying these funds raised against the cost of refurbishing the Kambalda swimming pool.

The figures shown above for both differential and specified area rating are estimates and may change as part of Council's deliberations after consideration of any submissions received.

OVERALL OBJECTIVE

The rate in the dollar is calculated to provide the shortfall in income required to enable Council to provide necessary works and services, to maintain assets and provide for future asset needs.

The overall objective of the proposed rate in the dollar and minimums in the 2019/20 Budget is to provide for the net funding requirements of Councils Operational and Capital Budget. The **estimated** rates in the dollar indicated above are based on a **1.95**% increase on the previous year rate in the dollar.

The basis for the calculation of Rates is either the Gross Rental Value (GRV) or Unimproved Value (UV) for each individual property and these valuations are provided by the Valuer General's Office.

Unimproved Values (UV)

The differential between mining and rural/pastoral recognised an anomaly in valuations that occurred some time ago. The valuation of rural values is set at a state wide level and it is believed is not a true reflection of the value of rural properties in this Shire.

The adoption of a lesser rate for the rural/pastoral properties is aimed at addressing this inequity.

The lower minimum for Mining UV recognises the high number of small prospecting and exploration leases which are important to the community both to maintain the historical link to the community of the small prospector and miner.

In the 2018/19 financial year concessions for two categories of rateable properties were endorsed on application and meeting a certain criterion as follows;

- Rural Use applicants who are paying rates in the UV Pastoral/Rural category may apply for a
 concession if they can show that their property is being used for rural pursuits and not for activities
 relating to or supporting mining or other commercial purposes.
- Bona Fide Prospectors applicants with rates in the UV Mining category may apply for a concession if they hold a certificate from the Department of Transport to support their application.

Council will again consider such concessions when adopting the 2019/20 Annual Budget.

Gross Rental Values (GRV)

The four current categories of GRV properties, dependent on land use and zoning are;

- Residential
- Commercial
- Industrial
- Vacant Land

The proposed specified area rate is an additional rate for the Kambalda swimming pool and is consistent with section 6.37 of the Local Government Act 1995 where a specified area rate may be imposed on rateable land within a portion of its district for the purpose of meeting the cost of the provision by it of a specific work, service or facility if the local government considers that the ratepayers or residents within that area —

- (a) have benefited or will benefit from; or
- (b) have access to or will have access to; or
- (c) have contributed or will contribute to the need for,

The purpose of the specified area rate is for these funds to be applied against the cost of the refurbishment of the Kambalda swimming pool, including costs associated with the loan obtained to fund the project.

Section 6.37 stipulates that any monies raised from a specified area rate must only be used to meet the cost of providing the specific work, service or facility for which the rate was imposed. That is, in this case, monies raised from the proposed specified area rate can only be used to fund the cost of refurbishing the pool. This includes costs associated with loan repayments and interest associated with such loan repayments.

It is proposed that for all other properties using GRV as the basis for rating will attract the same rate in the dollar and minimum rates. The reasoning for this is that the same services are provided for all. Where there has been a business decision by property owners to locate activities outside the town site boundaries to undertake an activity which could be located within the town site, the services provided by the Shire remain the same. The cost of servicing the communities within the boundaries of the Shire should be borne by all residents and property owners.

The Shire of Coolgardie are committed to manage the current level of infrastructure and services, as well as having the capacity to implement and maintain new infrastructure and services and to do so with sustainable rate increases and affordable service delivery models.



Cashless Debit Card Common misconceptions



Misconception 1: I can't pay rent on the Cashless Debit Card.

You can pay rent with your Cashless Debit Card

In many instances, your rent will be paid before your payment goes onto your Cashless Debit Card. In other private rental agreements, you can use your Cashless Debit Card to pay rent by BPAY, eftpos or direct debit.



Misconception 2: I can't use my card interstate.

You can use your Cashless Debit Card in any location in Australia You can use your Cashless Debit Card in any store that accept eftpos nationwide, except to buy alcohol, gambling products, some gift cards or to withdraw cash.



Misconception 3: I can't buy second hand items (furniture, cars etc) or items at markets.

You can purchase items with cash from markets and stalls

You can use the 20 per cent of your payment paid into your regular back account to make cash purchases. There is also an ability to transfer additional funds in certain circumstances where you need access to additional cash.



Misconception 4: Indue charge fees to use the card.

The Cashless Debit Card is a fee-free account

The Cashless Debit Card is a fee-free account for participants. You can check your account balance and transaction history for free online, over the phone or at an ATM. Lost or stolen cards are replaced for free and purchases do not incur transaction fees or account keeping fees.



Misconception 5: I can't shop online.

You can shop online using your Cashless Debit Card

From 29 January 2019, you can use your card to make purchases from all online retailers, except those that sell alcohol or have gambling activities available such as online casinos.



Misconception 6: I can't buy meals where alcohol is also served (mixed merchants).

You can use the Cashless Debit Card at restaurants and bistros

You will be able to purchase food using your Cashless Debit Card at most restaurants and bistros in Cashless Debit Card trial sites, however alcohol cannot be purchased with the card.

Energy Assistance Payment

2019 Budget

Around 5 million Australians will benefit from a one-off payment aimed at helping them with the cost of their energy bills.

What was announced in the 2019 Budget?

From June 2019, the Australian Government will pay pension, allowance and veterans' payments recipients a one-off Energy Assistance Payment. To be eligible, you must be residing in Australia and be receiving of the following payments on 2 April 2019:

- Age Pension
- Disability Support Pension
- Newstart Allowance
- Parenting Payment Single
- Parenting Payment Partnered
- Carer Payment
- Youth Allowance
- Austudy Payment
- Sickness Allowance
- ABSTUDY (Living Allowance)
- Wife Pension
- Widow Allowance
- Widow B Pension
- Partner Allowance
- Special Benefit
- Double Orphan Pension
- Farm Household Allowance.

The Department of Veterans' Affairs will pay the Energy Assistance Payment to eligible veterans and their partners.

The amount of the one-off payment will be:

- \$75.00 for singles, and
- \$62.50 for each eligible member of a couple.

Key facts

- The Australian Government is investing around \$365 million into the Energy Assistance Payment.
- The one-off payment aims to support around 5 million Australian residents with their winter energy bills.
- People who had lodged a claim for one of the eligible payments by 2 April 2019, and the claim is subsequently granted will also receive the one-off payment.
- The payment is not taxable and will not be counted as income.
- The payment will automatically be paid to recipients by the Department of Human Services from June 2019.





It might surprise people to find out that the crucifixion of Jesus Christ is described a number of times in the Scriptures as an offence. For many Jesus' degradation and humiliation was a very strange way to show God's love to humanity. The reality is that the magnitude of the sacrifice was required because man's sin (ie yours and mine) is a lot uglier than we could ever imagine.

The apostles encouraged followers of Jesus to share the message of salvation and eternal life with respect and love. They also insisted the message was never to be tampered with just because it causes offence. Commonsense says that those who don't believe in Jesus and His message can't be offended by something they think is false. Those who do believe the message bow their knee, confess their sin and declare Jesus as Lord. His followers are completely humbled by a God who would go to extraordinary lengths to bring salvation to them.

It is offensive to many that the gospel message proclaims Jesus as the only way to God. It is offensive to God that He would go to such enormous lengths to save mankind only to be rejected.

Jesus Himself sent a message to his cousin John the Baptist saying 'Blessed is he is isn't offended by Me' (Mathew 11:6). Approximately 600 years before Jesus came to earth it was prophesised through Isaiah that Jesus would be a stone of stumbling and a rock of offense. One of the biggest reasons for Jesus being described this way is that He revealed that eternal life or entrance to Heaven can't be earned by a person's good works. Good works do not cancel out sin. Christ's sacrifice and shed blood is the only thing that can cancel sin.


Kyran catches up with Coolgardie locals



Community together in preventing illegally dumping

Illegal dumping costs our community more than just being a eyesore. In June 2018 the Shire spent more than \$5000 cleaning up illegal dumping of asbestos fence sheeting, which was dumped in eight laneway locations. In an effort to reduce to impact on the community and environment the Shire will be targeting illegal dumping with surveillance cameras.

For those that have information on offenders, please submit with any photo evidence, vehicle details and additional information to assist us to follow up. Prosecutions for minor illegal dumping offences occur, and the fine is between \$200 and \$10,000 if proceedings arrive in court.





Dogs ownership

Council is committed to encouraging responsible dog ownership to benefit the entire community. Dog owners are responsible for ensuring their dogs are:

- Secured in a fenced yard on property;
- On a leash when in public; and
- Registered with the Shire and microchipped.

The Shire is currently targeting dog registration and following up to ensure owners comply. If your dog is collected by officers, owners will need to have dogs registered, pay impoundment fees and will have seven days to ensure their dog is microchipped. Dogs will not be released without owners paying the fees applicable.

Should you need assistance please call the Shire main line on (08) 9080 2111. All calls and information will be logged to enable the appropriate actions to be taken and followed up. We understand that this **change in process** may be inconvenient for some members of the public however it is important as it enables us to appropriately respond to your concerns.

For after hours emergency assistance, please contact the Shire main line and select option 1 for ranger to be diverted to the oncall officer. Officers will only attend in event of an emergency, such as a dog attack. For further assistance, police officers also have authority to act.

Should you have complaints in relation to ranger matters or services provided, it is encouraged that contact is made with the Shire and you submit your concern in writing.
