Interactive Story Time

Acting and Interacting with Stories

Today's session was about acting out stories and books. Movement helps us to regulate our attention, and acting out stories can help children to 'experience' the book, understand action words (verbs); and assists in memory.

Telling well known stories from memory also teaches children that you can tell stories imperfectly without a book; it also helps them with auditory memory and to help re-tell a story even from a young age.

Car Stories:

Telling stories from memory with your kids whilst you are driving is a good way to pass the time and build some pre-literacy skills into your day.

Finishing Sentences:

Tell well known nursery rhymes at home with you kids. Stop at different point and allow your child to finish your sentences.

Acting Out:

Whilst reading act out action words (verbs) as you are reading them ie. The boy ran - run on the spot. Have your child copy your actions

Get Creative

Make up your own action stories. Pretend your astronauts going to space or a scuba diver going diving.
