

FACT SHEET- DOG MICROCHIPPING

Do I have to microchip my dog?

Yes. All dogs over 3 months of age must be microchipped as of 1 November 2015, under the *Western Australian Dog Act Amendment 2013*. A penalty of \$200 may apply if a dog is not microchipped.

Why do I need to microchip my dog?

Microchipping helps local governments identify lost and stray dogs and quickly reunite them with owners, reducing the period of impoundment along with cost and inconvenience to owners. The cost of microchipping typically costs around \$65+, but your Local Ranger or Vet can provide you with further information.

My dog is old and wouldn't cope with getting a microchip, what can I do?

Your local vet can issue an exemption certificate if microchipping the dog is likely to adversely affect its health.

I had my dog microchipped, but I can't recall the number, how do I find it out?

Contact your local Ranger or Vet to have the microchip scanned, or contact the vet/shelter that implanted the microchip for the number

My dog has now been microchipped, what do I need to do?

Please complete your registration renewal form along with the microchip number and applicable fee, then return it to us, (as all dogs over 3 months have to be registered):

- Sylvester Street Coolgardie WA 6429
- Irish Mulga Drive Kambalda WA 6442

How do I update my dog's microchip details?

If you are updating any contact details, please contact the Shire of Coolgardie so that we can give you the appropriate form to fill out.

My dog has died, what do I need to do?

Please contact the Shire on 9080 2111 or email mail@coolgardie.wa.gov.au and provide the dog's name, address and animal registration number to update our records and the date the dog passed away.

What will happen if I don't get my dog microchipped?

Failure to comply with the registration and microchipping requirements under the Western Australia Dog Act 1976 can result in a fine of up to \$5,000.00.
