Over the past few months local employment agency Goldfields Employment and Training Services (GETS) have been working on the restoration of the Kambalda East train.

To date they have fully completed 5 carriages; in that time GETS participants have replaced the majority of the wood work on the carriages. They are currently painting the exterior giving the carriages a sense of youthfulness, by adding a splash of colour and new designs to the body.

Acting Shire President Tracey Rathbone expressed her appreciation to everyone involved in making this project happen in particular the community members, who have assisted with the work.

Message from the Shire Acting President September 2016

There has been a great deal happening within the organisation during this month.

We have farewelled our CEO Mr Paul Webb and in doing so, would like to acknowledge the commitment, the passion and energy that Mr Webb has offered the Coolgardie Shire and it's communities over the past six years. With Paul's initial appointment as the Manager of Technical Services, he introduced many changes to make the organization far more effective, efficient and significantly improved service levels to our communities. This was evidently shown by Paul's persistence in developing a Heavy Haulage Policy in relation to Mining activities within the Coolgardie Shire, which have provided great opportunities to source much needed funding for maintenance, repairs and construction on our heavy haulage routes. Paul has been, for three years as CEO, relentlessly advocating with State Government Ministers and agencies, inclusive of the DMP, toward the growth and development of our communities and has such proven to have raised the profile of this within the Goldfields Esperance region. During his tenure, Paul has also lead the completion of the Flood Mitigation Project in Kambalda which has seen the completion of the Gabion Wall Project, coupled with a multi-million dollar upgrade to Newton Dam and significant upgrades to the Goldfields highway drainage systems being funded by WANDRA and Main Roads WA. The long awaited commencement of restoration works to the Coolgardie Post Office Complex is a milestone that has been long awaited. On behalf of the Coolgardie Shire Council, we extend our sincerest wishes for Paul's future success and endeavours and wish him and his family a progressive and happy future.

Following this Council had chosen to appoint Jill O'Brien, Recreation and Regulatory Services Manager, as Acting Chief Executive Officer for the Coolgardie Shire until 30th of October, during which time Council will proceed to secure an Acting CEO for up to a further 12 month period. This will ensure the fluency and actions of the Probity Review are achieved and further compliant actions are securely embedded into the future of the organization. Councillors and the Shire Officers have been working diligently toward the preparation, presentation and implementation of the Long Term Financial Plan and Community Strategic Plan and are confident that as we move forward, the Coolgardie Shire will be steadfast and successful.

There have been questions raised by the ratepayers with regards to the delay of the rates notices within the Shire. I would like to take the opportunity to reiterate that Council endeavours each year to keep the rates increase within a reasonable margin, however, during the 2015/2016 year the Valuer General's revaluation of the Gross Rental Values has resulted in a significant variation in property values across the Coolgardie Shire. Consequently in order to retain a reasonable margin, Council has chosen to re asses the rate in the dollar as per the rate setting statement to minimise the impact of the revaluations. Furthermore on behalf of the Coolgardie Shire ratepayers, there has been a recommendation of Council that a letter be written the Valuer General's Office seeking an explanation as to the significance of the increase in Gross Rental Values on behalf of the community.

On a brighter note, the 124th Coolgardie Day celebrations had Bayley Street, buzzing with an estimated 15,000 local and regional visitors from the region attending this month. This year, the event had a welcomed increase in funding which, amongst other attractions, saw the return of the wood chopping event and live performances streaming throughout the day. This event has grown to become one of the largest events on the regional calendar and it would be appropriate to acknowledge the dedication and commitment of the Coolgardie Day Committee for their efforts to ensure the days continued success.

The Australia Day Citizen of the Year Award nominations are now open and Council would like to encourage community members to take the time to complete the online nomination form. As with many regional communities, our volunteers and community groups, and their contributions, are of great significance to the social health and foundation to the Coolgardie Shire. Their commitment and selfless acts are beyond measure and although they seek no thanks, it is only fitting that we take the opportunity to celebrate their value.

From the desk of the Acting CEO

Hello to all

My name is Jill O'Brien and I have been appointed Acting Chief Executive Officer.

For those who don't know me. I have been with the Shire of Coolgardie for the past seven years. Six years as the Manager of Recreation Services and for the last year the Manager of Recreation and Regulatory Services. I reside in Kambalda with my husband and two children and I am very happy to call Kambalda home.

I consider myself very fortunate to be able to fill this page in my acting role as Chief Executive Officer for the next 2 months. With the support of the staff in our organisation it can be assured I will continue to be just as committed and passionate to our Shire and community as I have been in my role as Manager of Recreation and Regulatory Services.

This years rate notices have been delayed due to the implementation of the four yearly Valuer General's Revaluation of rateable properties within the Shire. Upon setting the figures it was identified that the Gross Rental Revaluations would result in an increase to many properties. However this has since been reassessed to minimise the impact of the property revaluations. The set estimated date for rate notices will be 1 October 2016.

The Shire has received a number of public complaints in relation to a number of potholes in the access road, Mistletoe Place to the Shopping Centre in the Kambalda townsite. The Shire understand the potholes are a hazard to traffic and have issued a letter to the owner of this access requesting this issue be rectified immediately for the safety of the community and the overall impression the Shire want to leave on the many travelling visitors to our town.

Recently Council have requested for Officers to conduct Level of Service Review across all departments within the Shire of Coolgardie. A full Level of Service analysis will be carried out to see how the Shire can improve on expenditure, customer service, general efficiency and utilisation of all departments. Council Officers will research how significant expenditure savings can be made across the organisation with minimal impact on the community and staff.

The Kambalda Football club have made themselves at home in the Kambalda Community Recreation Facility for the past two years and everything is going well in their partnership with the Shire. Unfortunately with the clubs new home being the future for the club, the old Football club's day will be coming to an end with demolition work commencing at the end of October.

I would like to ask the Kambalda community to be mindful of the demolition site. Please let the contractors do their work without having the extra worry of putting any of our community members safety in jeopardy. Thank you for your cooperation.

A road closure has been issued to the Coolgardie North Road, 10 meters past Jaudi Hills Road. This closure is due to road reconstruction. A detour to access the train station will be via Carins Road open to heavy haulage and local traffic weather permitting. Estimated completion of road reconstruction will be 31 October 2016.

Bush Fires Act Notice for Owners and Occupiers

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are hereby required on or before the first day of November 2016 or within fourteen days of your becoming owner or occupier of land should this be after this day to clear all firebreaks and remove flammable materials from the land owned or occupied by you as specified hereunder and to have the specified land and firebreaks clear of all flammable materials from the first day of November 2016 up to the thirty first day of March 2017.

1. Land Outside Town Sites

- 1.1 All buildings on land which are outside town sites shall be surrounded by two firebreaks not less than two (2) meters wide cleared of all flammable material, the inner firebreak to be not more than twenty (20) meters from the perimeter of the building or group of buildings and the outer firebreak not less than 200 meters from the inner firebreak.
- 1.2 The removal of flammable material from the whole of the land between the firebreaks required in paragraph 1.1 above.

2. Land In Town Sites

- 2.1 Where the area of land is 2000 square meters (approximately ½ acre) or less, all flammable material shall be removed from the whole of the land.
- 2.2 Where the area of land exceeds 2000 square meters, firebreaks at least three (3) meters in width shall be cleared of all flammable material immediately inside and along the boundaries of land. Where there are buildings on the land additional firebreaks three (3) meters in width shall be cleared immediately surrounding each building.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks or remove flammable material as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council not later than the first day of November 2016 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to remove or abate fire hazards. If permission is not granted by Council or its' duly Authorized Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Flammable material" does not include green growing trees or green growing plants in gardens. It also does not include plants native to the region that are fire resistant, for example; saltbush shrubs.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning shall comply with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fire Act 1954.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$5000 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay cost of performing the work directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

THE PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD WILL BE FROM 1 NOVEMBER 2016 TO 31 MARCH 2017 AND SHALL APPLY THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE SHIRE.



Essential Works

Kambalda East

Water Corporation will carry out essential works in Kambalda East starting in late-September 2016 and carrying through to mid-late December.

The upgrade works involve the installation of new valves and the changeover of a number of fire hydrant services which will improve the reliability of Kambalda's water supply.

The work will be carried out between the hours of 7.00am and 5.00pm.

This upgrade will help us to limit the impact of future water supply interruptions in this area of town.

During the works you may experience lower pressure and you may also notice discoloured water for a short period.

Temporary discoloured water may occur when we undertake this type of work as small amounts of natural sediment that settles within pipes over time is stirred up and causes discolouration,

While the sediment is harmless and the water is safe for use, running a tap closest to your water meter for two minutes should clear this up.

Thank you in advance for your co-operation and understanding during this essential work and we apologise for any inconvenience this may cause.
