Message from the Shire President

With the coming of the New Year, our Technical Services staff, under the guidance of Keith Dickerson has been working toward setting up the Shire roadworks program until the end of June.

This will include the current bitumen resealing project in both towns that is underway. The completion of a section on Coolgardie North road, the asphalt sealing of several intersections in both towns and the gravel road re-sheeting works.

Planning and design work is being done for road profiling work in Kambalda. The Kambalda Tip road and intersection and the Renou, Jobson Street intersections on Bayley Street in Coolgardie. These projects are being funded through Black Spot safety programmes.

Keith is also working with our supervisors and staff in various aspects of road construction, funding sources and compliance and acquittal of grant funding procedures, which has been a great benefit for both our staff and the organisation.

The Kambalda footpath program will commence next week with our technical staff supervising the Goldfields Employment Training group to replace and repair various sections of the footpath network in both Kambalda towns.

Council has allocated capital expenditure of \$100,000 and GETS will provide the labour and own equipment for the project which should enable a substantial amount of this work to be completed this year. This ongoing partnership between the Shire and the GETS group will continue to bring much benefit to both our communities in the future.

Our staff are continuing to receive queries and complaints from disgruntled ratepayers regarding the increase in rates which in the main was generated by the recent increase in the Gross Rental Valuation in the Shire last year.

A Coolgardie resident is currently circulating a petition to the Minister for Lands in an endeavour to request a review of this valuation increase by the Valuer Generals Department. There have also been several articles printed in the Kalgoorlie Miner recently in relation to this issue.

The CEO is working on a review of Councils Rating Strategy, in order to set out the procedure and compliance steps that staff and Council will be required to take in considering the Rate Setting Standard in future budget deliberations. This procedure is the single most important aspect in the whole of Council budget process, and it is imperative that we get it right the first time each year so as to eliminate the frustrating issues for both staff and rate payers that have had to be dealt with in the past.

Several Councillors have taken the opportunity to partake in the Councillor Training courses in Esperance and Kalgoorlie during February held by the WA Local Government Association. The move to bring this training out into the regions is a great initiative to allow Councillors to gain important training in their roles on Council without having to travel from home and family.

Also, while in Esperance, they will be able to attend the annual Goldfields Regional Council meeting on February 3.

From the desk of the Acting CEO

Happy New Year. Welcome to the first "From the desk of the CEO" for 2017. Where has the time gone? The end of January is upon us and Christmas is a distant memory.

The Shire team has hit the ground running in January with enthusiasm and renewed vigour. There is much to do and I am confident the new management team and their staff will deliver the projects and programmes set by the Council.

Organisational flexibility will be a key to the future for sustaining Local Governments. One of the major issues that have plagued Local Government reputation is its ability to be responsive to community requests. Local Governments have responded to this criticism over the past decade by beefing up its customer service focus. Whilst that has assisted to some extent with improved customer management at point of entry, further work, requiring role re-engineering and job cultural fits needs to be achieved if deep seated customer responsive cultural change is to occur within Local Government. This goal needs to be driven into all the back of office or specialist roles and need to be integrated into the human resource management, governance and risk management processes within the Local Government. This approach is systemic and can only be undertaken within the context of a full scale organisational and service level review that has an improvement customer serving goal. The service level review is well under way and anticipated to be completed by the end of April.

A secondary driver behind the need to reform the organisation's financial capability is the recent Regional Subsidiaries Legislation passed in parliament on 14th September 2016 providing a legal mechanism for shared services between local governments. It is imperative the Shire's financial and staffing arrangements are managed in a way that demonstrates the Shire is sustainable and has inbuilt flexibility to respond quickly to changing community expectations, legislative demands and other external factors that may require urgent responses over the short and long term.

Prior to Christmas, the Shire underwent an organisational review. The CEO met with and presented to all staff in the organization. All staff were given the opportunity to provide feedback and input. A confidential staff survey was also undertaken. This information was then used to formulate the organisation review. The review was workshopped with the Council and then reviewed and endorsed by Council in November. The outcome of the review was then presented and conveyed by the CEO to all staff.

With any change comes misinformation, innuendo, rumour and of course the lack of facts. I would like to reassure the community:

- 1. The Shire is committed to maintaining offices in Coolgardie and staff are not being moved to Kambalda
- 2. No staff, as a result of the organisation review, have had their employment terminated by the Shire nor any staff retrenchments
- 3. Some staff accepted voluntary redundancy
- 4. Based on external human resources advice, all staff were provided with the opportunity to apply for jobs advertised internally which some chose not to do

The responsibility to ensure daily operations, delivery of the works programme, financial management, compliance, governance and risk within the shire remains my primary focus.

To develop services that are fit for purpose the Council wants to engage with the community for input in relation to what services are important and their satisfaction with the services being provided. The Council needs some clear direction from the community on what services are important and the community's level of satisfaction with the various services provided by Council.

The community survey was launched on Australia Day with great success. If you want to have a say in your community, please take 15 minutes to complete and return this years survey by the 28th February. The community survey can be accessed on line via the Shire website as well as from the Shire offices and recreation centres

Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor.

When I think back to the start of a new school year, I can still remember the buzzing feelings of excitement, anticipation and nerves. Am I going to have classes with all my friends? Will I get better results than last year? Which teachers will I have?

Millions of young people across the country heading into primary and secondary school over the coming weeks may be facing similar feelings – whether they are starting another school year or commencing a new school for the first time.

Some students can adjust to the changes and settle into things quickly. However, some young people may find this a daunting and challenging time.

There can be a number of reasons why it might be hard to go school: trying to make new friends, pressure to get the best marks, dealing with bullying, or perhaps going through a mental health issue such as anxiety or depression. These worries can make the next few weeks an uncertain time.

Whether you are a young person struggling, or a parent with concerns about your child, **headspace** is here to help. As the National Youth Mental Health Foundation, **headspace** provides support for young people aged 12-25 years old who are struggling with their mental health and wellbeing.

No matter where you are, you can access help at **headspace** – either through one of our 95 centres in metro, rural and regional areas of Australia, or via <u>eheadspace.org.au</u> where you can receive online and telephone support between 9am-1am (AEDT), seven days-a-week. There are also general mental health and wellbeing resources available on our website: <u>headspace.org.au</u>.

Advice for parents:

Warning Signs:

Most parents can tell when something is out of the ordinary, but there are also signs that suggest a young person might be experiencing a mental health problem. These are new and noticeable changes in the young person, lasting at least a few weeks, including:

- Not enjoying, or not wanting to be involved in things that they would normally enjoy
- Changes in appetite or sleeping patterns
- Being easily irritated or angry for no reason
- Involving themselves in risky behaviour that they would usually avoid, like taking drugs or drinking too much alcohol
- Seeming unusually stressed, worried, down or crying for no reason
- Expressing negative, distressing, bizarre or unusual thoughts

Tips for parents:

- Talk openly and honestly with them, and let them know that you are concerned.
- Reassure them that you will be there for them, and ask what they need from you.
- Let them know that there is lots of help available.
- Help find an appropriate service, such as a headspace centre and support them in attending.
- Help them build a support network.
- Look after yourself as well. Get some support by talking to someone you trust, and seek professional help for yourself if you need it.



Mental health and mental health issues in young people:

- Good mental health is about being able to work and study to your full potential, cope with day-to-day life stresses, be involved in your community and live life in a free and satisfying way.
- A young person who has good mental health has good emotional and social wellbeing and the capacity to cope with change and challenges.
- Feeling down, tense, angry, anxious or moody are all normal emotions for young people, but when these feelings persist for long periods of time, or if they begin to interfere with their daily life, they may be part of a mental health problem.
- Mental health issues can also influence how young people think and their ability to function in their everyday activities, whether at school, at work or in relationships.
- If you think you know a young person whose mental health is getting in the way of their daily life, it is important to let them know you are there to support them.
