Message from the Shire President February 2017

Heavy rain in the region over the past weeks has resulted in extensive damage to road and footpath networks in the Shire. Our Technical services staff are currently assessing the damaged areas and preparing a report for restoration works to be carried out. Fortunately, most of the work will be funded under the State Government natural disaster recovery funding (WANDRRA).

One positive benefit out of this heavy rainfall has been to fill all the lakes and dams in the region, including Newtown Dam in Kambalda and the Gorge in Coolgardie, giving our residents the opportunity to enjoy these expanses of water so close to the towns.

Our works crews have also been busy completing road resealing projects in both our towns and the section of Coolgardie North Road, and Coolgardie Tip road. Contractors are currently working on Salmon Gum road, with cement stabilizing work, to restore the sub base, in preparation to reseal this section of failed road pavement.

Our CEO held meetings with the project managers of the Post Office Precinct, Palassis Architects, last week to set parameters for the letting of tenders for this project. It is expected that representatives from Palassis and Mia Hicks Consulting will present the current designs and plans to Council prior to going out for tenders, and staff will also consult with current and future tenants of the Precinct. Council will receive monthly reports on the progress of this project from its commencement.

Our Finance Staff have been working diligently with the CEO and Moore - Stephens staff, to finalise the Shire's Financial Report for the 2015/16 year in preparation for the annual Electors meeting. The Report is expected to be finished by the end of February, and then presented to Council for adoption during March, when we can finally set the date for the AGM of the Shire.

The CEO, and myself, had an opportunity to liaise with Department of Local Government and Communities Director, Jenny Law, whilst attending the GVROC meeting in Esperance earlier this month. We were able to provide Jenny with an update of progress and actions being implemented in regard to the Shire's Probity Audit, and that our Financial Audit Report was expected to be completed by end of February, and would be forwarded to the Department in March.

One pleasing aspect of the discussion with Jenny was that she acknowledged our improving performance and that the Shire of Coolgardie was by no means any where near the worst performing Local Government in WA.

Staff at the Coolgardie Visitor Centre have been busy setting up the Pharmacy Display in the Exhibition Building on Bayley Street and have sourced a full sized wall photo of an 1890s style Pharmacy to demonstrate the era of our famous collection, which looks really great. In relation to the Visitor Centres in both our towns, it is pleasing to note the increasing numbers of travellers in caravans and motor homes already this year and I believe the tourism industry is one that our Shire can gain considerable benefit from by promoting and developing attractions in our region into the future.

The Nationals WA are the party for small business

The Nationals WA's plan for payroll tax will:

- » Deliver tax relief for more than 10,000 small to medium businesses in Western Australia
- » Raise the payroll tax exemption threshold from \$850,000 to \$5 million
- » Introduce \$5,000 Kick-Start Grants for small businesses (payroll under \$850,000) to help them hire new workers

A difficult jobs market

After a period of record employment, strong wage growth and an economic boom, the number of full-time workers in WA is at a five-year low. Around 4,300 jobs were lost in September this vear, marking 21 consecutive months of job losses in WA. To tackle this challenge, The Nationals WA will deliver significant payroll tax relief for businesses to encourage expansion, investment into new equipment and stimulate employment.

The Nationals WA have consulted with business and industry experts to deliver a plan for payroll tax reduction that will deliver significant benefits to WA's small to medium business sector.

How much will it cost?

Payroll tax relief is estimated to cost \$440 million per annum or \$880 million over a two year period. The Small Business Kick-Start Grant is expected to cost \$10 million per annum or \$20 million over two years. These initiatives will be funded by The Nationals' plan to increase the iron ore Special Lease Rental charge.

The GST Rip-Off

If there is no change from the Federal Government, we can only afford to provide payroll tax relief and incentives for new employees for a limited period of time. We are proposing these exemptions for a period of two financial years. The Nationals WA will ensure payroll tax relief and incentives for small to medium business are sustained long-term once the Federal Government acts to place a floor in the GST at 75 cents or quarantines the revenue raised from the iron ore Special Lease Rental from GST calculations.

The Nationals WA have a plan to return the budget to surplus, create new jobs and ensure that resource companies pay their fair share.

We have identified a charge in WA's State Agreements – the contract between the State and resources companies - which has not been updated since the 1960s.

MYTH #1 The Nationals are introducing a new mining tax

This is not a new tax. We are simply updating an existing charge which the big miners are already paying. The Special Lease Rental hasn't been reviewed for over 50 years, so we think it's time to update it to reflect the modern economy we all live and work in. While charges and fees have risen for every West Australian household since the 1960s, the 25c per tonne Special Lease Rental has not been reviewed or increased for 50 years.

The Nationals WA welcome your feedback on this policy:

MYTH #2 The big miners pay \$19 per tonne in tax

While we have asked the Chamber of Minerals and Energy to provide a breakdown on this figure, they have not been forthcoming. Figures in *The West Australian* indicate this \$19 tax includes around \$13 in Federal taxes. Of the \$6 that Rio and BHP pay to WA most is redistributed away thanks to the GST rip-off. It should also be noted that royalties on iron ore are not a tax. They are the price all miners must pay to purchase Western Australia's mineral resources.

MYTH #3 The Nationals plan will cost jobs

The Chamber of Minerals and Energy's own report into The Nationals WA's plan reveals no current WA jobs are at risk as a result of The Nationals' proposal. The greater risk to employment is BHP and Rio's own cost cutting strategies — which include automated trucks and trains and the use of Singapore trading hubs and Malaysian call centres. These measures were put in place long before The Nationals announced our policy. WA's mining sector shed 25,000 jobs between August 2013 and June 2016 and despite their immense profitability Rio has recently announced another 500 job cuts. The Nationals have a plan to create more jobs for WA workers by cutting payroll tax for more than 10,000 small

and medium businesses. We'll also deliver new, job creating infrastructure projects through asset recycling.

Daughters of Midas Pioneer women of the Eastern Goldfields

"On October 16, 1892, the Murphys left Southern Cross with a team laden with goods and equipment for the store. Three Days later Ann and (their daughter) Edith made history of being the first European female in Coolgardie.

The journey from Southern Cross to Coolgardie took about three days and, unlike her parents, Edith thought it something of a picnic. There had been good rains that winter and although it was late spring the bush still showed patches of green and a few wildflowers and had not yet taken on the grey parched look of summer.

Being a child, Edith could relax and enjoy the experience while her father guilded the horse through stands of salmon gums,mulga and sandalwood or around salt lakes and through stretches of heavy sand. At night they set up camp and the girl gathered wood for the fire and assisted her mother prepare the meal.

When the murphys reached their destination they saw that most of the activity was taking place on an area of ground called Fly Flat so they erected their canvas store and living quarters there, and Felix (husband) returned to carting between the two towns.

Mother and Daughter soon learned the reason for the name, Fly Flat. The bush flies, which breed prolifically in the warm weather conditions...."

"Edith Murphy was a tom boy. She enjoyed living among the diggers who made much of the young girl and gave her the nickname "Tommy". One day, feeling restless, she "borrowed" a horse and took it for a gallop in the bush. When the owner found his precious steed was gone he reported its disappearance to the police.

Edith duly arrived back on the exhausted animal and when the owner found that his horse had not been stolen but taken for a ride by a young girl he told the police to forget the matter. Ann murphy had other ideas, It was time her wayward daughter was taught a lesson. She told Warden Finnerty he must make Edith stand up in court and be charged with stealing. The warden, a family friend, at first objected to this rather drastic measure, but he finally agreed. He took her to court and placed the now very alarmed young girl on the dock and said, "Tommy Murphy I charge you with stealing a horse"."

These extracts are from the novel "Daughters of Midas, Pioneer Women of the Eastern Goldfields" it was written by Norma King with alot of people throughout the Goldfields, and beyond, acknowledged for their input into the research. The book is filled with many interesting stories of the pioneer women. Nurses, the first bride, working ladies, female doctors, miners wives and many, many more. It is a fantastic look into some of the untold history of the Women of the Goldfields.

This book can be purchased for \$22.00 from the Coolgardie Visitors Centre along with many other great history novels covering all sorts of areas of life in the goldfields.

Living by sight is often superficial. Living by feelings can quickly lead to obesity or mistakes. Living by fear very quickly makes you a slave to the things that you fear. Living by faith acknowledges that above every human Government, above every human power and above the spiritual world is God. Living by faith often appears foolish in the short term however will show itself very beneficial in the long term.

Living by faith requires a person to realise that everything you see is not always as it appears. Some feelings can lead to destruction if obeyed. If you realise how powerful God is you won't live in fear of others. Living by faith led the apostles, who suffered greatly, to make statement like, 'What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? Truly He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things?' Romans 8:31-32

Camping at Cave Hill

Cave Hill is a well loved campsite for community members as well as many travelling visitors. This spectacular granite outcrop got its name from the large cave on the western side.

During the 1930's there were 4 dams constructed to help supply the steam- driven engines on the Woodline Railways. The Woodline timber was taken to Kalgoorlie-Boulder by the many camps scattered around the area.

If you wish to travel to Cave Hill, Via Burra Rock, you may come across some of these old camps. From Coolgardie, this trip is about 100kms. This track is a four-wheel-drive track, and as with any bush driving we recommend that you be mindful of the weather conditions.


Cave Hill is also accessable from Widgiemooltha. It is only 50kms from Widgiemooltha and is suitable to travel in two-wheel-drive.

At the base of the rock you will find beautiful bush camp grounds, picnic tables, BBQs and toilets. There are also some information boards to tell you the history surrounding this area.

There are plenty of nature based activities to do at Cave Hill. After exploring the outcrop and cave you might like to walk on some of the bush trails, try capturing some of the wildlife on camera or seeing how many yabbies you can catch!

Please make sure you pack your own drinking water and leave only your footprints.

Please note, as the area is in a conservation reserve, no pets are allowed.
