# "It's all about family"

Coolgardie Day is the celebration of Arthur Bayley registering his claim for himself and William Ford, known thereafter as 'Bayley's Reward', on the 17th of September 1892 at Southern Cross. It was the beginning of the Eastern Goldfields and was to spark the greatest gold rush in Australian history.

The Old Camp is truly the Mother of the Eastern Goldfields' and has celebrated its birth right for most of its history. By the end of WW1, the population of Coolgardie had dwindled down to about 350 residents.

It is not known at what point in time the celebration became known as 'The Coolgardie Railway Picnic'. We do know that the Railways would put on a free train from Kalgoorlie to Coolgardie to celebrate Coolgardie's birthday. In line with Goldfields history, Coolgardie Day has had its rise and falls. The 1970's under a very pro-active Council, saw the day rise to old heights with the introduction of camel racing down the main street. Like all events in all towns, it was only as good as the economic environment and the people who give their time to create these special days. Time was again to see the Day shrink, but not to disappear. In 1992, and again with the support of a very active Council, the Shire of Coolgardie brought together a good collection of its business and professional people with the intent to build the day to a major attraction on the Goldfields. I was a foundation member of that committee and at this point it became an incorporated body.

Today, Coolgardie Day enjoys the respect it is entitled to. It is the oldest event in the Eastern Goldfields. It is firmly etched on the West Australian Calender of Events and still brings people back to the Goldfields who have soft memories of their past. Crowds of 10,000 plus have made Coolgardie Day a nice place to be.

Today, Australians care about our history, and why not? We have earned it. And so the significance of the Day will rest with today and tomorrow.

Message from the Shire President July 2017

Councillors and staff will be participating in a series of workshops during the next two weeks to discuss rating and budget modelling strategies with a view to be in a position to adopt the 2017/18 budget early next month. It is hoped that this will help the preparation of our financial position with regard to having the Auditors visit to the Shire in September.

The Shire hosted community forums on the 11th and 12th of July in Coolgardie with presentations and information regarding the trials of the implementation of the Federal Government Welfare Debit Card in the communities of Ceduna in SA, and the East Kimberly in WA. The presentation was conducted by Dougall Ethell from the Minderoo Foundation, who did an excellent job explaining how the system worked and the outcomes and improved results in both of these communities following the cards implementation.

The first session on Tuesday was for Councillors and other Government agencies, and the second on Wednesday morning for the public which, was well attended with 35 people coming. This included the member for Kalgoorlie Kyran O'Donnell, Superintendent of Police Darryl Gaunt, our new OIC of Police in Coolgardie Shannon McGowan, Patsy Dellar from the IGA and members of the Judumul Advisory Aboriginal Corporation (formerly CAAG) which I thought was a great turnout. During and following the presentation, there were many questions put to Dougall, regarding people's concerns about how they would be affected should the card be introduced within the Goldfields Region.

Following much discussion most people's fears that anyone would be disadvantaged were allayed by Dougall, and overall the majority of people in attendance were in favour that the introduction of the card would actually benefit the region.

The Shire received some really great news last week with verification of funding from Department of Primary Industries & Regional Development for the continuation of our Community Resource Centres in both Coolgardie and Kambalda, for the next eighteen months. I would like to make special mention of the work that our CRC Officers Leanne Shilton and Valerie Whittaker put in to preparing the Tender Documents to secure this funding and in doing so they have saved an estimated \$8,000, that consultants have charged other Shires to prepare their tenders.

During these eighteen months it will be imperative that we gain the support of the whole community to fully utilise the programmes and projects within our Recreation Facilities provided by the CRC's in an endeavour to secure follow on funding for the fifteen months there-after.

Councillors and Staff embarked on separate road trips to Widgiemooltha last week to investigate the proposed road closure by Mincor Resources at the proposed mining operation south of the townsite.

Meeting with local resident Jan McLeod and Paul Darcy from Mincor, on site has revealed that the subject road is not actually on the road reserve and Mincor have offered to realign the existing track for access by light vehicles, therefore removing the need to close the road. The Shire will await any submissions on the proposal before making a decision.

The CEO and I have hosted several meetings recently with proponents of haulage campaigns and one in particular with Maximus Resources, who have purchased the Burbanks Treatment Facility 10kms south of Coolgardie. They are intending to commence toll treating gold ore from various mining ventures surrounding Coolgardie, whilst looking at recommencing mining at the Wattle Dam Mine south of Kambalda. They will then transport the ore to the plant at Burbanks.

The other meeting with Empire Resources and Hampton Transport, who are intending to be the first customers at Burbanks, are requesting permits to haul their ore on Ladyloch and Nepean Roads in the Shire. This is all good news with increased mining activity in the Shire.

Further good news this week, has seen the arrival of a brand new T & R transportable home in Coolgardie last week. This is the third brand new home under construction this year, with two other site built homes nearing completion. Despite the negative statistics from the recent census, it goes to show that people are still positive about building and living in our towns, which augers well for our future.

The Goldfields Tourism Network launch of the Golden Quest Discovery Trails smart phone app of the Drive Yourself Wild promotion of the self drive trails of the Goldfields region was held at the Hannans North Tourist Centre on June 30th.

This was followed up by a \$10,000 advertising campaign on GWN 7 to be run until October, to promote and entice the older travellers to the Goldfields region during the spring months. It is great to see Neil and the GTN committee being really proactive in the promotion of tourism in the region and looking at all avenues of giving all the member Shires value for the money they are investing in tourism in their towns.

A meeting took place regarding the 2017/2018 financial year rates and in accordance with Section 6.36 of the local Government Act 1995 we gave notice to our ratepayers of the intention of the Shire of Coolgardie to levy the following differential rates. The Category Proposed Rate in \$ Minimum Rate is UV Mining 22.5945 \$441 and the UV Rural / Pastoral 11.3276 \$691. A statement detailing the objects and reasons for the differential rate is available at the Shire's Libraries and Recreation Centres. Electors and rate payers are invited to make written submissions on the proposed differential rates and they are to be forwarded no later 4.00pm on 7 August 2017. Once the council has considered any submissions the differential rates and the 2017/2018 budget (with or without modifications) will be adopted by Council. You still have time to write in your submissions and if you have any please do not hesitate to do so as we are encouraging it.

Election time is approaching us and this year we will be having four positions becoming available to become an Elected Member/Councillor for the Shire of Coolgardie. The Coolgardie and Kambalda Community Resource Centres are having a Webinar Session on Thursday 17 August from 4.30pm, which is put on by WALGA (WA Local Government Association). It will be played on the big television screen and it is the perfect opportunity to come along watch the Webinar and ask WALGA the questions directly. By becoming an elected member or councillor not only do you get to learn new skills and training from WALGA you also get to make a difference to your community and everyone brings their own unique skills and traits to the table. I will also be available for a question and answer session at both Coolgardie and Kambalda the week after the Webinar and look forward to meeting with you.

The next Council meeting will be held in Kambalda at the Recreation Facility on Tuesday 22 August 2017 at 6.00pm. We have copies of all Council Agenda's and Minutes available for reading at the public libraries or they can be easily accessed on the Shire of Coolgardie website <a href="https://www.coolgardie.wa.gov.au">www.coolgardie.wa.gov.au</a>

The Shire has set a special meeting of council on Tuesday 15 August to adopt the 2017/2018 Budget. It is anticipated that the efficiencies and savings achieved in 2016/2017 will be reflected in the 2017/2018 Budget. The Service Level Review received by Council has set the foundations for the forthcoming Budget.

It is with great sadness that I am advising the communities of the passing of Stephen Jones. Stephen's funeral will be held Friday 4 August at 3.00pm in Kalgoorlie. Our thoughts go out to all family and friends of Stephen. All Shire buildings and services including Kambalda and Coolgardie Recreation Facilities, Landfill Sites, Depots and Administration facilities will be closed on Friday from 1:00pm so that staff are able to attend Stephen's funeral.

# Time Capsule Celebration Memories of Kambalda's 25th Anniversary

On 15<sup>th</sup> September 2017, Kambalda will be celebrating it's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary by opening the Time Capsule that was buried inside a commemorative rock 25 years ago.

During 1992, I was working as a professional photographer in Kambalda (Kathie Lindup Photography), and some of you will remember me taking photos of sports teams, school classes, 21st birthdays, weddings etc. I was privileged to be the official photographer at the two major events which marked Kambalda's 25 years.

The first was Western Mining Corporations 25th Anniversary Community Fair, which was held on the Kambalda (East) Oval on Saturday 12th September. As well as the "Kambalda Gift" race (based on the "Stawell Gift"), my photos show a tug-of-war, pony rides, sky diving, an art and craft exhibition, pottery demonstration, face-painting, train rides, an engineering demonstration by WMC apprentices, a rock drilling competition and a presentation by the Kambalda Volunteer Fire Brigade.

There were also food and drink tents, and an ice cream van. It was a full day event which culminated in a spectacular fireworks display on Lake Lefroy. My family and I sat on the hill near the Silver Lake head frame, where we had a bbq whilst waiting for the fireworks to start. They were ignited from an exploration causeway and were breathtaking with a background of the Salt Lake and a full moon.

Three days later, the Shire of Coolgardie organised two large rocks, which had separate plaques and Time Capsules, to be erected in the Kambalda Town Square and the Kambalda Lions Park. I went along with my camera, to witness the rocks being put into place by the CPC crane. The rocks were on the back of a Shire truck. If I recall correctly or after placing the first one in the Town Square, the truck and crane then travelled to Kambalda West; but as the rock was being lowered in to the prepared area, someone read the plaque and realised that it was the wrong one!

Thank goodness there was enough time for the vehicles to travel back to East and swap the rock over before the official ceremonies were to take place.

The first ceremony was held at 11.00am in the Town Square. The Shire President, Lou Carnicelli, Deputy Shire President, Billie Ingham, other Shire Councillors and dignitaries, along with the pupils and teachers of Kambalda Primary school took part in the event. The Time Capsule for this service was to be opened on 15th September 2017.

At 2.00pm, on the same day, students and teachers from the two Kambalda schools joined the dignitaries at Lions Park. This ceremony celebrated the Time Capsule which is to be opened on 15<sup>th</sup> September 2067, to mark the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Kambalda.

All of the photos from the Time Capsule events are on display at Kambalda's Public library. There are still people in the town today who will recognise some of those in the photos. Why don't you make a visit to the library and check them out?

#### COULD TOO MUCH SITTING BE BAD FOR OUR BRAINS?

In many aspects of our life when we need to use our brain power, we tend to sit down: at school, at work, reading, using our mobile phones or watching television.

Researchers from The University of Western Australia, in collaboration with the Baker Heart and Diabetes Institute - a global leader in sedentary behaviour research, are examining the prolonged negative impact that sitting might have on our brains.

Lead researcher UWA PhD student Michael Wheeler said the brain is a powerful organ but it needs a stable glucose supply to function optimally. Glucose levels outside that optimal range can have a negative impact on brain health.

"Our brain weighs about two per cent of our body mass but demands about 20 per cent of our resting energy requirements, which is mostly in the form of glucose - the primary brain fuel," Mr Wheeler said.

"Sitting for long periods throughout the day alters our blood glucose levels, which in turn may affect the brain."

Mr Wheeler said multiple studies had demonstrated that reducing and replacing sitting with light intensity walking helps keep glucose levels in the optimal range, particularly after food consumption. This means glucose levels do not spike too high, or dip too low.

"Studies investigating the effects of excessive sitting on brain function have had mixed results so far," Mr Wheeler said.

"But what the studies do agree on is that interrupting sitting with regular activity breaks is positive for many aspects health.

"For scientists, the way in which sitting is likely to affect brain function still poses a research challenge. Based on the available evidence, it's more likely that reducing sitting would slow cognitive decline, rather than improve cognitive function. Physical activity is also beneficial for other health outcomes."

So what should people do to improve the health of their brains?

"Take a walk after lunch, wash the dishes by hand after dinner or take an active commute to and from work if possible," Mr Wheeler said.

"There is much opportunity to reduce sitting time throughout the day, and therefore much potential to have a positive impact on our health."

The research project has been supported by funding from the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC).
