Shire of Coolgardie Message from the Shire President June 2018



Councillors and management participated in a governance survey during April, initiated by the Department of Local Government, and orchestrated by the Australian Institute of Company Directors. There were 64 questions covering topics such as financial and risk measures, role of council, relationships between council-CEO and staff, council competencies and council-community and stakeholder engagement.

Overall 78.3% of aggregated individual assessments from both council members and management were either "mature" or "sound", which is a healthy indicator for our shire, and indicates a good working relationship between the council, CEO and the management team.

The Lottery West funding application prepared by Mia Hicks for the Coolgardie Community Cultural and Business Hub, within the Post Office Precinct, has been successful and was approved on May 1, 2018. An amount of \$233,500 has been allocated to this refurbishment project, as well as \$37,882 for a permanent shade structure over the Coolgardie skate park. This is great news for Coolgardie and will enhance and revitalise the centre of town.

The shared service agreement between the shire and City of Kalgoorlie/Boulder is working well and achieving good results for the Shire of Coolgardie. With over 220 building applications received for the replacement of damaged roofs in Kambalda, as well as handling many asbestos related inquiries, the CKB health and building officers have been working alongside our staff to process all these applications in a timely manner.

The other success story with this agreement, is the number of stray dogs that have either been rehomed or licensed and it has been noted that many people are walking their dogs on leads now that the rangers are patrolling more frequently.

Our Manager of Recreation and Community Services, Laura Dwyer, has successfully renegotiated the lease agreement for the Oil and Spice Cafe within the Kambalda Community Recreation Facility this week. There has been some speculation and angst within the community that the cafe was closing, however this was never the intent of the shire, therefore this will be good news for our residents, as the cafe is an integral part of the centre and attracts people as a meeting place for their morning coffee and lunch.

The annual Goldfields Giants State Basketball match in Kambalda was held on May 12, proved to be a most successful event with a cliff hanger of a finish to the game. The Giants got over the line by one point in the last second of the final quarter to beat the Mandurah Magic team in what was an exciting finish for the big crowd that attended the game.

It is a credit to our recreation staff for the effort they all put in towards making this annual event so successful, and I know from many of the comments made on the night the Giants players and members enjoy coming out to play at Kambalda. It also gives our residents the opportunity to enjoy an event such as this in their home town.

I would also thank and acknowledge all our corporate sponsors, who supported this event, once again.

Tara's inspiring run raises thousands

Coolgardie's "everyday hero", Tara Davies, has run both an incredible campaign and an amazing half-marathon to contribute more than \$3200 for Huntington's WA.

Tara, who is also one of the recreation officers at Coolgardie Recreation Centre, entered this year's HBF Run for a Reason event to help raise awareness and funds for research into Huntington's Disease.

Through her online campaign, as well as a sausage sizzle at Woolworths and a lolly-counting competition at Coolgardie Primary School, she raised the whopping \$3200-plus tally.

Tara was diagnosed with Huntington's Disease (HD) two years ago. Her mother and grandfather died from the disease, and her sister suffers badly with the condition. Her experience with the disease has made her determined to do everything she can to help researchers find a cure, and to leave a legacy for her children, Riley and Jayde.

"I need my kids to have positive thoughts and memories of their mum, so I am raising awareness and money for Huntington's WA as one day I won't be able to do any of it," she said. "So I am making the most of my time now to show my kids anything is possible."

This year's HBF Run for a Reason was held on May 27 in Perth, where Tara completed a half-marathon (21km).

"My experience at HBF run for a reason was awesome, and eye opening," Tara said. "My goal was to run it in under 2.5 hours and I did it in 2 hours and 19 min so I was happy with that. Also it was raining and my socks were saturated so blisters were bad.

"At the start line you had a chance to ask people what their reasons for entering were. The lady next to me had breast cancer and was running for all the people with breast cancer who can't run, then there was a teacher running for a boy in her class who had leukemia. The run was hard but fun at the same time. Leading up to it we had a big donation from Coolgardie Youth Club - it was over \$600 - and we raised heaps of money at the sausage sizzle.

"Coolgardie has blown me away with support and donations. Thank you to Kath, Norm and Clinton Parks, Riley, Kellie and Andrew Smallacomb for all their donations and help with the sausage sizzle, and Woolworths for their donations. A massive big shout out to Coolgardie Youth Club for there massive donation. Also a big thank you to Coolgardie Primary School for doing a lolly jar, which is still going. And thank you to all the girls who work here. Everyone has shown me so much support.

"I am pretty sure a Running for Huntington's Disease team hit nearly \$17,000 and that is the second biggest fundraiser this year and for such a small organisation."

HD is an inherited disease affecting areas in the brain which control movement, thinking and emotion. It has a slow progression, and symptoms gradually worsen over time. Huntington's WA works to empower those affected by HD to meet the extraordinary challenges they face. All donations make a real difference to the health and well being of HD families.



Put safety first when prospecting

The Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety expects a bumper prospecting season this year and is ramping up its message to stay safe in the bush.

The death in January of novice prospector in the Gascoyne, near Cue, is a dramatic reminder of the importance of the department's annual Seven Golden Rules for prospecting campaign launched this week by Mines Minister Bill Johnston.

The prospector's body was found after a major two-day search in 45 degree heat only 2.5 km from the 48-year-old man's campsite.

DMIRS Resources Tenure Executive Director Tony Bullen said that the combination of another cool summer and a large amount of Miner's Rights issued early in the year will mean there will be a lot of prospectors on the ground during the season.

A total of 974 Miner's Rights have been issued since the start of the year and 537 of those have been issued since the beginning of April.

A Miner's Right is the most common prospecting permit used by prospectors visiting Western Australia and allows holders to prospect on Crown Land with hand-held tools, such as a metal detector, and to take and keep samples or specimens up to 20 kilograms

"We're only a few short of last year's record number of Miner's Rights, so that is telling us we need to be tenacious in spreading the safety message this year, particularly to the first timers out in the bush this year," Mr Bullen said.

The first Seven Golden Rules for prospecting campaign in 2014 was in response to a recommendation by the State Coroner for prospectors to carry a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) following the 2012 death of a prospector near Menzies.

Michael Graham sparked a 15-day search involving aircraft, motorbikes, horses and expert trackers covering 1500 square kilometres.

The body of the 46-year-old father-of-two was never found.

Put safety firs

- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
- Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB)
 it may turn out to be your most important safety device.
- Obtain a Miner's Right permit when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).
- Obtain a 40E permit prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).
- Get written permission from the tenement holder when prospecting on
 - a mining lease
 - an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
 - a prospecting licence
- Comply with all legal requirements when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.
- Show respect when on Crown land because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.
- Fill any holes that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

This year's flu season is about to begin

The state-funded free influenza vaccination program has now commenced.

If you are eligible for the free vaccine (see criteria below) please call the Coolgardie Health Centre 9025 0200 to book an appointment.

Eligibility for government-funded influenza vaccines in WA in 2018 includes:

- Pregnant women (any trimester).
- Persons 65 years of age or older.
- All Aboriginal people aged 6 months and older.
- Individuals aged six months or over with medical conditions that
 place them at risk for: complications of influenza, e.g. cardiac
 disease, chronic respiratory conditions, chronic neurological
 conditions, immunocompromising conditions, diabetes and
 other metabolic disorders, renal disease, haematological
 disorders, and children aged six months to 10 years receiving
 long term aspirin therapy.
- All children aged six months to less than 5 years. (The Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation strongly recommends influenza vaccination for children aged from 6 months to less than 5 years.)

In the Greek language there are several words that are used for what we call love. There is "phileo", which defines a brotherly love, there is "eros", which defines a sexual love, and there is "storge", which is usually love among family members. The word for love that is most often used in the Bible and that which describes God is known "agape". God Himself is described as "agape" in the Scriptures (1 John 4:8).

Agape love is a giving of oneself. It is a selfless love. In describing agape love in 1 Corinthians 13 we read that love does not force itself upon someone. The best-known verse in the Bible refers to this agape love. God's love drove Him to give up His Son in order for mankind to receive forgiveness and eternal life. God does not force Himself upon anyone. People who reject this love choose their own consequences. God makes the offer to all who would believe to receive forgiveness from all sin and eternal life and to be welcomed into His family as a child of God. The misuse and misunderstanding of love leads to confusion and brokenness. The embracing of agape leads to wholeness.

Got a litter problem?

Projects which aim to reduce litter and change littering behaviour are eligible for up to \$10,000 funding through the Keep Australia Beautiful Council (KABC).

KABC Western Australian Chairman Michael Aspinall said individuals or groups had until 25 June to apply for a Community Litter Grant.

"We're looking for initiatives that will make positive and lasting changes to littering and littering behaviour or trial projects that will develop a model for future initiatives," he said.



"Priority will be given to initiatives that reduce litter and target areas such as roadsides, car parks, sporting venues and shopping areas, and focus on specific issues such as the incorrect disposal of cigarette butts and drink containers.

"Littering in public areas is a big issue in WA, so we're keen to put our support behind people who can come up with effective strategies to address the problem in their area."

Mr Aspinall said local area projects could secure up to \$5000 while major or regional initiatives were eligible for \$10,000 grants.

Projects that received funding in 2017 include an educational video for young children, nude food lunches at a regional school, a litter education mascot and a wash against waste trailer.

Cashless debit card trial begins in community



On April 23rd 2018, the Shire of Coolgardie opened the Cashless Debit Card shopfront in the Coolgardie Administration Office on Bayley Street. Since then our staff, Aleysha and Dave, have been pleased to assist members of the community with activating their Cashless Debit Card and working with them to understand and manage the changes brought in by the introduction of the card to the Goldfields.

There has been a lot of media discussion about the introduction of the card, some good and some bad.

Most of the negative comments are based on non-truths and have caused some concern, however the community has worked really well with our staff to gain a better understanding of how the card will benefit them, and the best way of putting this new system into place.

The shopfront is open on Monday to Friday from 9:00am to 2:30pm, and Dave and Aleysha are here to help.

The Goldfields trial of the Cashless Debit Card continues until June 30th, 2019. Please pop in and have a chat with our staff.

Since April the shopfronts for the Cashless Debit Card Scheme have been operating in Coolgardie from the Shire Administration Building on Bayley Street and in Kambalda at the Kambalda Recreation Facility on Barnes Drive.

Support Officers Dave, Aleysha and Nancy have been assisting customers to not only activate their cards, but to transfer payments, set up housing payments, pay bills and many other services.

As part of the trial, support services from Centrecare are now available to assist people with financial counselling

them. More information will be available in the coming weeks.




May has been a busy month with our brigade with trainings, working bees and the installation of some well-needed uniform racks for our fire fighting gear.
