Shire of Coolgardie Message from the Shire President December 2018



How quickly the year of 2018 passed, and reflecting on some of the highs and lows we have experienced during this time there has been significant change within our communities and the Shire as an organisation. As well from the wild storms last November that wreaked havoc on Kambalda, the loss of the doctors, bank and temporary closure of the BP roadhouse and swimming pool in Kambalda, I believe both our residents and the Shire have become more resilient, and on most occasions have come out the other side with positive outcomes.

The majority of damaged properties in Kambalda have been repaired and we have reinstated the doctor's clinic and medical service in a very opportunistic partnership with the St John organisation. Other good news for Kambalda residents and travellers is that the BP roadhouse has reopened for business.

On the low side, the Coolgardie community was smashed by a ferocious hail storm on the afternoon of December 10, with extensive damage to homes, solar systems and vehicles. The Coolgardie Recreation Centre roof and solar panels were damaged, rendering the stadium unusable. I would like to sincerely thank our Volunteer Fire Brigade crews and members of the community who pitched in with the SES crews from Kalgoorlie to help out dealing with the emergency situations during and following the storm. The Shire crews have also been working at cleaning up the debris all over town in the wake of the storm, and the Shire is hopeful there may be emergency assistance available to help out disadvantaged members of the community to help recover from this disaster.

The Shire Service Level Review is entering the second stage of implementation with efficiencies and improved performance within the organisation gradually improving. The Shire financial position continues to show improvement our administration, recreation and tourism divisions are displaying increased outputs and efficiencies, whilst our Technical services section including works, construction and waste crews are achieving increased objectives. It is a credit to our CEO James Trail and our leadership team, working with Ravim/RBC consultant John Ravlic, to implement these changes to the organisation that will bring long term benefits for our Shire into the future.

The Annual Seniors Christmas function was held at the Coolgardie Recreation Centre on November 29 with over 130 people attending Senior residents from Kambalda, Norseman and Coolgardie all came together to share their experiences over the year and celebrate the approaching festive season whilst enjoying the days great entertainment and a really well prepared Christmas luncheon provided by the WOW Cafe. A big thank you must go to all our staff and volunteers who helped out on the day, and also the sponsors who contributed so generously, which together helped make this such a successful event. I know from the many comments our seniors made during the day, that they really look forward to this event each year. I also received a letter of thanks and acknowledgement from a senior resident last week to thank the Shire in appreciation for hosting these events for our communities.



A reminder for those who have lost, broken or have had their card stolen, please visit the Coolgardie and Kambalda Post Offices to obtain a temporary card. Participants will need to know their full name, birthdate, Centrelink Number (eg. 123 456 789A), and the payment they receive from Centrelink.

The temporary card comes with a set PIN (that can be changed on the Indue Webportal/online account) and will be fully functional until a new card is sent out to the participant's home address. When this new card arrives, it will need to be activated either via phone, or through the online account. If participants need help with activating their cards, come in and speak to the friendly staff at the Coolgardie and Kambalda Community Recreation Centres.

MEDIA RELEASE – SHIRE OF COOLGARDIE KAMBALDA AQUATIC FACILITY MISSES OUT ON GOVERNMENT FUNDING Monday 18/2/2019

The Shire of Coolgardie has missed out on Federal and State Government Funding for the retention and redevelopment of its much-loved community pool with both governments indicating that there was a significant oversubscription to their funds. It is disappointing that both funding requests have been overlooked to revitalise what is the only outdoor 50 metre pool in the Coolgardie-Kalgoorlie area.

Estimated costs of refurbishment to the Aquatic Facility is \$3.4M which includes renovations to the 50m Pool, new change rooms and expanded first aid room and universal access pool. In order to fund the project, the Shire will require additional funding to just loan borrowings.

Both funding requests were made in September 2018 for the Sport Australia's Move it Australia – Community Sport Infrastructure grant for \$500,000 and the State Government's Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Funding for \$808,175.

Correspondence received from Sport Australia, Federal Government, indicated that the "\$28.3 million grant program experienced overwhelming interest with over 2,000 applications submitted totalling more than \$390 million in grant requests." Whilst feedback on the application for state funding was deemed of good quality, further comments indicated that the CSRFF program was also considerably oversubscribed and that the project fell over due to funding not being secured through Sport Australia.

The Shire has applied for a loan from the Western Australian Treasury Corporation (WATC) which is currently being assessed with the Shire liaising with officers to provide information in support of the application for funds. The process is rigorous and a decision from WATC will be made on the 30th April.

Kambalda Aquatic Facility was originally constructed in 1970 by Western Mining, as a standard outdoor aquatic centre comprising: outdoor 50M, Children's and Learn to Swim Pools, change rooms, First Aid room, kiosk, large recreation areas, and shade structures. In the early 2000's, the Shire inherited the asset when Western Mining withdrew its operations in the townsite. Due to the age of the facility it now falls short on a number of operational and compliance requirements and needs significant repairs. Any works that commence in the future for the pool must then meet health, building and safety standards at the time they are completed.

Tenders for the Kambalda pool closed Friday 1st February. The assessment process will take 4-5 weeks to ensure requirements stipulated by WATC are met. A community workshop is proposed for Tuesday 19th March 2019 at the Kambalda Recreation Centre commencing at 6.00pm. Council consideration of the tenders received was set for the February Council Meeting on the 26th February. Given WATC

requirements and timing Council will consider tenders at the March Council Meeting on 26th March or at a Special Council Meeting in early April. Shire staff will work with the successful tenderer to try opening the Kambalda Pool in November

The process of applying for government funding has been a catalyst for Council to assess the Shire's asset renewal position and ensure that investments in major infrastructure upgrades such as the Kambalda Aquatic Facility are included in the Shire's long-term financial plan. It is acknowledged that planning for investment in infrastructure is vital to managing risk which ensures that the long-term viability of projects do not hamper the Shire's ability to function or progress key projects for the interest of the community.

Council intends to continue discussions with business, mining companies and the community to seek options and funding avenues to support its major infrastructure investments. It is strongly encouraged that community members contact Ministers and local members in support of works to the Kambalda Swimming Pool. The Shire is also progressing discussions with the Federal and State Governments to continue to lobby for funding support.

There are many types of portable pools, ranging from small plastic or inflatable paddling pools, specifically designed for young children, to larger more solid inflatable pools or flexible sided pools with frames that can accommodate adults.

Young children can drown in portable pools in a matter of seconds if left unsupervised.

Any pool that is designed for swimming, wading and paddling that contains water more than 30cm deep, must be enclosed by an effective safety barrier that complies with the laws. Please refer to the summarised checklist overleaf.

Help save young lives in and around water

Never prop a pool gate open.

- Ensure you always actively supervise children within arm's reach whenever they are in, or around the water regardless of how much water is in the pool.
- Never rely on older children to supervise younger children, no matter how confident you are about their ability.
- For smaller pools ensure they are emptied and stored safely away from young children after use.
- Ensure the pool cannot fill with rainwater or water from sprinklers.
- Ensure the barrier is clear of climbable objects.

POOL



Did you know?

By law, swimming and spa pools containing water more than 30cm deep must have effective safety barriers that restrict access by young children. This includes portable pools.



Does your safety barrier tick all the boxes?

If not, you risk the lives of young children and may face substantial fines or prosecution.

This summarised checklist is not exhaustive and should be read in conjunction with the **Rules for Pools and Spas** brochure.

Check the pool gate

- Does the pool gate close by itself from any open position?
- Does the gate have a self-latching device?
- Does the gate open away from the pool?
- Is the latch release mechanism at least
- 1.5 metres above the ground?

Check the pool fence

- Is the fence fixed securely in place?
- Is the outside of the fence at least 1.2 metres high?
- Are all vertical uprights in the fence spaced less than 10cm apart?
- Is there at least 90cm between handholds and footholds?
- Is the bottom of the fence 10cm or less from the ground?
- Is the surface directly beneath the fence stable and not easily eroded?
- If a boundary fence forms part of the pool safety barrier, is it at least 1.8 metres high?

Check climbable objects

Barbecues, flower-pots, trees, retaining walls, plumbing, cubby houses, toys, outdoor furniture, pool pumps etc. may all help a young child to climb into the pool area.

Is the pool area clear of any items that would assist a child to climb over the fence or reach the latch on the gate that provides access to the pool area?

Check windows

Is the openable portion of a window that forms part of a safety barrier:

 permanently restricted to open no more than 10cm by a device that requires the use of a tool to remove it?

or

covered by bars or a metal screen, fixed in place by a device that requires the use of a tool to remove it?

Please note that key locks are not considered to be a permanent restriction.

Doors

- Doors with direct access to the pool area require local government approval.
- Pet doors are not permitted.



It seems not everyone is aware of new laws that came into effect in 2018; it is a requirement to slow down to 40km/h when approaching and passing emergency vehicles at the scene of an incident. We want to be able to go home to our families too so please read and pass this message on so we can all be safe on the roads.


The State Government announced in late 2018 that SLOMO laws will be introduced in the new year, with the aim of providing a safe working environment for roadside emergency responders.

SLOMO stands for Slow Down, Move Over, and requires drivers to slow down around stationary emergency vehicles, tow trucks, incident response service vehicles and motor break-down service vehicles which are displaying flashing lights while attending an incident.

The penalty for this offence is three demerit points and \$300.
