Community cheers Goldfields Giants to victory in Kambalda

A jam-packed Kambalda stadium hosted a crowd of more than 450 people when the Goldfields community came together for a fun and exciting night to watch the Goldfields Giants take on Perry Lakes Hawks recently.

The very vocal crowd got to witness a 94-89 victory for the Giants on the evening of Saturday, June 15, 2019. The win means the team now qualifies for the State Basketball League play offs for the first time since 2015.

Shire of Coolgardie Message from the Shire President May 2019



Kambalda residents would be noticing the flurry of activity in and around the swimming pool enclosure during the past few weeks. The contractors are making good progress with the works at the site with major excavation of the old pipe work and removal of tiles in the pool shell. The engagement of a project manager for the pool upgrade is making oversight of the pool work much more beneficial for Shire staff, with regular updates on the progress of work, whilst enabling our staff to continue with their own tasks.

The recent announcement by State Sport and Recreation Minister Mick Murray, that the latest application from the Shire for state government funding for the pool refurbishment had been successful, is a massive boost in confidence for the community and the Shire. The amount of \$700,000 from the State now reduces the funding gap to only \$400,000, which will greatly reduce the amount of Shire own funding required.

Coolgardie residents may have noticed the installation of several new street bins along Bayley Street last week. The reason for these larger bins being the volume of waste received by residents and passing travellers depositing into the older style bins and the birds being able to access the open bin, pulling the rubbish out, which then blew around on the main street. The new bins fit in well with the amenity of Bayley Street, and hopefully we will have a much neater street.

With the resheeting work on the Kambalda Airport road now completed, the Shire Road Crew has commenced maintenance grading of our gravel road network, with the first of these being Coolgardie North and Jaurdi Hills roads. With the increased mining and exploration activity in the Shire in recent times, this has meant large volumes of both light and heavy vehicle traffic on our road network, thereby increasing the cost of maintaining these roads. Shire contractors have replaced and widened several sections of the bitumen road to Bonnie Vale, where the road surface has broken up and suffered surface damage. As part of the Shire strategy to maintain and upgrade the road network, we are continually juggling mining contributions, Regional Road Group funding along with Shire own funds in an endeavour to maintain and upgrade these roads into the future.

The Shire was privileged recently with a visit to Coolgardie by newly promoted Federal Minister for Families and Social Services, Anne Rushton. Shire Staff, CEO and myself hosted the Minister, Member for O'Connor Rick Wilson, Secretary to Department of Social Services Kathryn Campbell, representatives of local governments from the City Kalgoorlie/Boulder, Menzies, Leonora and Laverton on a tour to learn and assess the implementation and positive impacts following the implementation of the CDC trial in the Goldfields region.

The Minister and entourage also visited the Coolgardie IGA store and met with the new owners to discuss their experiences so far with the use of the CDC transactions in their store. The message from the Minister was for all the local governments to continue to collect imperative evaluation data from throughout the region in an endeavour to continue and extend the use of the card into the future.

The St John, Shire of Coolgardie Primary Health Alliance continues to gain momentum, with the recent launch of the new community transport bus. The service will officially commence in July, with volunteers currently undertaking basic training to be able safely transport residents to and from destinations in both Kambalda and into Kalgoorlie as well. This will be a really great initiative and benefit to many of our residents that require transport in the community.

The annual state basketball event was held in Kambalda on Saturday, June 15. The basketball game was preluded by a Goldfields football league match between the Kambalda Eagles and Mines Rovers.



RSPCA Western Australia came to Coolgardie Park on Tuesday, June 11, to deliver a community action day.


The RSPCA regularly holds action days like these for communities around the state, and offers various free services during the event.

Creative journeys at art therapy workshop

Art therapy classes were held at the Coolgardie Community Recreation Centre on Sunday, June 23 and 29, 2019.

We have had a great turnout when these classes are offered, and look forward to holding more again in the future.

Art therapy is a form of psychotherapy involving the encouragement of free self-expression through painting, drawing, or modelling, and can be used



as a remedial or diagnostic activity. The practice helps one discover their inner self, explore their feelings and emotions and express themselves subconsciously through art.

Our participants all went on a relaxing journey through their mind and the result was some beautiful artwork and stories of empowerment. The first stage of the workshop involved a warm-up, during which participants drew a collection of circles and then painted the resulting pattern in colours that each person was drawn to the most.

After a quick break for lunch, we jumped into the main activity of creating a picture of ourselves – imagined as a superhero. This was a very thought-provoking exercise that brought our a lot of stories and emotions to the surface.

A huge thank you to Carlie, our art therapy guide, who delivered the workshop, and we can't wait for more in the future.

The first wedding in Coolgardie

Clara Saunders was living in Southern Cross with her mother and sisters when Evan Wisdom - the licensee of the Exchange Hotel in Coolgardie - returned to Southern Cross looking for a woman to assist Mrs. Fagan, the wife of the manager with the domestic work.

Although Clara was only 15 at the time, she was mature for her age and keen to take up the opportunity. She already had experience helping her brother-in-law in his hotel while her sister was pregnant with their fifth child.

It was April 1893 when she came to Coolgardie, and quickly made friends with another girl named Florrie Cheshire.

In June of 1893, Paddy Hannan was travelling back to Coolgardie following his find at what became known as Hannans. On the way he ran out of water. He filled his water bags with brown water from a clay pan, which resulted in him getting dysentery. He carried on to Coolgardie to seek help.

The little Irishman went to the Exchange Hotel and asked for a room, but there were none available. Clara, seeing how sick he was, offered up her own room and looked

after him. She mended a hole in his water bag, gave him plain boiled rice and food, and medicine from the chemist. He was better within a few days and was eager to get back to his find. When he left, he gave Clara a small piece of gold. He said it was the first piece he'd picked up at the new find.

Towards the end of 1893, Jack Raeside, a friend of Clara's from Southern Cross, arrived. She was pleased to see him again and agreed to accompany him to Coolgardie's first ball on Boxing Day.



Early in the New Year, Mrs. Fagan left for Hannans with her husband to help set up the Exchange Hotel there, and left Clara in charge of the domestic arrangements.

One morning not long after Mrs. Fagan left, Warden Finnerty came to the hotel to inform Clara that Jack Raeside's body had been found. He had been shot in the face, and a rifle was lying next to his body. The inquest into his death revealed that Jack had borrowed a rifle to shoot a dingo nearby. It appeared that as he was climbing a ridge he tripped, and the gun went off. The Warden

declared it an "accidental death". Clara went to the funeral (Jack's grave is in the pioneer cemetery) and as she had neither Mrs. Fagan nor her best friend Florrie there for support, she felt terribly depressed and alone.

Arthur Williams, who ran the billiards room at the hotel, tried his best to comfort her, but it took some time for her to recover from Jack's death.

Shortly after the tragedy, Evan Wisdom left the hotel and Coolgardie. Mr. De Baun asked Clara if she would take over the dining room at his hotel, The Great Western, and she agreed.

In the meantime, Arthur Williams had been doing all he could to woo Clara, often taking her on outings. During these excursions he told her of his plans for the hotel and billiard room he was having built at the 90-Mile (Goongarrie). She was uncertain about continuing the friendship, worried about the age difference as there was a 13-year age gap between the pair.

Molly Brennan, a barmaid, helped Clara make up her mind about marrying Arthur by explaining that "he is a young man who is going to do well in life". Clara knew that the best way to improve her situation was to marry someone in a well-off position. So, she continued to accept Arthur's attention and when he did officially propose she thought it over for a while and then said yes.

News of the engagement spread across the Goldfields and congratulation messages started to pour in.

It didn't take long for Clara to get caught up in the excitement of planning the wedding, Coolgardie's first, and the couple chose July 4, 1894, for the event.

The Great Western Hotel was the venue for the reception. The owner, Mr. De Baun, gave the bride away, while the manager, Mr. Aitkin, served as best man.

The couple's house was being built while they prepared for their wedding. In the meantime, Arthur had gone to Perth and ordered furniture for their house and to be fitted for his wedding suit. He also selected an assortment of engagement and wedding rings, so Clara could make her own choice.

One other thing on his list was to carry out a special assignment for his fiancé. Clara asked him to have the nugget Paddy Hannan had gifted her made into

a brooch which she was very pleased with. Clara's family still have the brooch and it is one of their most treasured possessions.

Men from out of town began drifting in a day or two before the wedding. Their early celebrations turned Coolgardie into a carnival like atmosphere.

On the day of the wedding, Molly helped Clara dress and they made their way to the ceremony. Those who could not fit inside lined each side of Bayley Street. The couple was pelted with rice as they stepped outside following the ceremony and the crowd lining the street sang to them as they rode away in the bridal buggy with old boots and kerosene tins clanging and rattling behind.

Outside the dining room of the Great Western, men crowded into the bars, passages and every other available space, all toasting to the happy couple. Dancing lasted well into the night and all enjoyed themselves thoroughly.

I imagine having something like a wedding in those early days of Coolgardie would have been a welcome distraction for the people living and working in the area and was the perfect excuse to dress up in your finery and dance until your feet were sore.

Last month it was all about wind and basketball. With the weather having started to get colder we read a story about "Ollie and the Wind" and made wind socks, which all children enjoyed. Such a great craft for the kids to watch the weather change without having to go outside.

In the lead up to the Giants v Hawks state basketball game hosted by the Shire of Coolgardie last month we selected a book from the non-fiction section, telling the kids all about basketball as a sport and the rules of the game.



Monthly focus from Ranger Services



Have you recently taken on the joy of owning a pet or just moved to town with pets?

If you answered yes, are they microchipped and registered with the Shire of Coolgardie?

If you answered yes again, then high five to you and thank you for being a responsible pet owner.

If you answered no, then here's what you need to do:

- 1. Arrange with your preferred vet to get this done or organise a time and date with our local Ranger, Kevin, aka "Wombat", to have your pet microchipped at a cost of \$65.
- 2. Gather your pet's details including their microchip number and sterilisation certificate.

Why register and microchip your pet?

- In the event of your pet getting lost or stolen, microchipping is an excellent way of identifying your beloved pet and being able to reunite them with their rightful owner.
- If for some reason your pet escapes and is found wandering, if it is wearing its collar with registration tag, the person who has found your pet can call the Shire and provide the tag number. The Shire can then attempt to contact you to inform you your pet has been found and can arrange to reunite you and your pet.
- In WA it is law that all dogs are to be microchipped and registered after three months of age, and all cats after six months age or on transfer of ownership. (See Cat Act 2011 and Dog Act 1976.)

Australian Government Department of Social Services

Energy Assistance Payment 2019 Budget

Around 5 million Australians will benefit from a one-off payment aimed at helping them with the cost of their energy bills.

What was announced in the 2019 Budget?

From June 2019, the Australian Government will pay pension, allowance and veterans' payments recipients a one-off Energy Assistance Payment. To be eligible, you must be residing in Australia and be receiving of the following payments on 2 April 2019:

- Age Pension
- Disability Support Pension
- Newstart Allowance
- Parenting Payment Single
- Parenting Payment Partnered
- Carer Payment
- Youth Allowance
- Austudy Payment
- Sickness Allowance
- ABSTUDY (Living Allowance)
- Wife Pension
- Widow Allowance
- Widow B Pension
- Partner Allowance
- Special Benefit
- Double Orphan Pension
- Farm Household Allowance.

The Department of Veterans' Affairs will pay the Energy Assistance Payment to eligible veterans and their partners. The amount of the one-off payment will be:

- \$75.00 for singles, and
- \$62.50 for each eligible member of a couple.

Key facts

- The Australian Government is investing around \$365 million into the Energy Assistance Payment.
- The one-off payment aims to support around 5 million Australian residents with their winter energy bills.
- People who had lodged a claim for one of the eligible payments by 2 April 2019, and the claim is subsequently granted will also receive the one-off payment.
- The payment is not taxable and will not be counted as income.
- The payment will automatically be paid to recipients by the Department of Human Services from June 2019.

Jess's sausage rolls

INGREDIENTS:

- 1kg sausage mince
- Salt & pepper to taste
- 1 large onion, diced
- 4 slices bread, crusts removed
- Salt & pepper to taste
 5 sheets puff pastry
- 1 Tbsp milk
- 4 Tbsp approx. mixed herbs

METHOD:

- 1. Preheat oven to 180 degrees Celsius and line a large baking tray with baking paper.
- 2. Lay the puff pastry out to defrost as per packet instructions.
- 3. Place the bread into a bowl of water for 1 minute.
- 4. Squeeze the water out of the bread and mix all the ingredients, including the bread, in a large bowl.
- 5. Cut pastry sheets in half.
- 6. Evenly place mixture along one side of each half.
- 7. Roll up and place on oven tray.
- 8. With a back of a knife (blunt side), create segments along the rolls.
- 9. Brush each roll with milk.
- 10. Cook in the oven for 35-40 minutes or until golden brown on top.

The app allows qualified first aiders to sign up a: first responder and be notified when someone has called 000 for an ambulance within 500 metres of their current location and in a public place.

To become a first responder you will need to provide evidence of having completed a first aid course within the last three years. Minimum qualification level of HLTAID001 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation. We now offer the ability to become a BASIC level first responder in the app, by uploading yo Photo ID.

If you're not looking to sign up as a first responder yet, then that's okay! The app also contains a number of other resources, including:

- First aid instruction guides helping you to treat a range of injuries and illnesses.
- Triple zero (000) calling with automatic GPS location calling 000 from the app will send your GPS coordinates direct to the St John State Operation Centre, making it easier for an ambulance to locate you.
- Defibrillator (AED) locator showing all the defibrillator locations near you.
- Upload the location of new defibrillator (AED) locations that aren't currently appearing on the app.
- Locate nearest medical centres and emergency departments including live ED waiting time information.
- Patient transport services information.
- Your first aid course information and refresher reminder notices
- First aid tips and special offers keeping you up to date with handy first aid information.

Bright Minds helping families across the Shire

At Bright Minds Occupational Therapy we have had a busy term 2 within the Shire of Coolgardie.

Whilst during term 1 we focused on building awareness and referrals into the service with lots of community activities, term 2 changed direction with focus on service delivery.

Many families have been provided with screenings of their child's speech and language skills, and functional skills for learning through the speech pathologist and occupational therapist. Some families have also commenced further sessions to work towards their goals set by parents and therapists.

We were lucky enough to have two fourth-year OT students with us in term 2, which also helped to provide more services to clients referred to OT.


We have continued our library storytime sessions in Kambalda, through which we continued to build connections with local families.

We also held some developmental playgroup sessions in Coolgardie which gained interest when held in the mornings. We had some services that didn't gain any attendees or interest however on review of these

and feedback we are working towards providing more appropriate services and schedules times to cater for families.

Term 2 also included the launch of our 123 magic and emotion coaching program, which aims to teach parents about emotional and brain development; and arm them with strategies to help nurture and encourage positive behaviours and build emotional regulation skills while setting appropriate limits.

This program had limited interest in Coolgardie however there was a great turn out in Kambalda and further interest within the community to run the program again in term 3.



An attendee of the Coolgardie course said she found it valuable and would recommend it to other parents and carers.

"The information was very helpful, with plenty of practical advice and tips on how to apply it at home. It was delivered in a way that was easy to understand and in a convenient timeframe," said Emma.

Another parent said: "This course has given me tools and the confidence to cope as we head into the "terrible twos". I'm much less worried about it now."

Feedback from the Shire regarding our service has been positive, and we hope to continue to provide a valuable service throughout the rest of 2019.

Shire of Coolgardie

It is intended to make the following Local Laws:

Bush Fire Brigades

The purpose is to provide for the appointment or election of a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant, and such additional lieutenants as may be necessary as officers of bush fire brigades in the district, and prescribe their respective duties. The effect is that the appointment or election of a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant, and such additional lieutenants as may be necessary as officers of bush fire brigades in the district is prescribed, as are their respective duties.

Cats

The purpose is to set a 'standard number' of cats that may be kept on premises, and areas where cats are prohibited. The effect is that persons must not keep more than the standard number of cats unless provided for by the local law, the Cat Act, or its associated Regulations or permit a cat to be in a prohibited area.

Cemeteries

The purpose is to provide for the orderly management of cemeteries under the care, control and management of the Shire and to create offences for inappropriate behaviour within cemetery. The effect is that all persons in the administration of the cemeteries, burying deceased in the cemeteries, or otherwise providing services to or making use of the cemeteries, are to comply with the provisions of the local law.

Dogs

The purpose is to make provisions about the confinement of dogs, control the number of dogs that can be kept on premises in the district, and to require removal of dog excreta. The effect is to extend the controls over dogs which exist under the Dog Act 1976 and Regulations.

Fencing Amendment

The purpose is to amend the Shire of Coolgardie Bylaws Relating to Fencing and Obstructions at Intersections 1996 to reflect more up to date terminology and legislative references, and to increase penalties for some offences. The effect is that the Shire of Coolgardie Bylaws Relating to Fencing and Obstructions at Intersections 1996 are amended.

Local Government Property and Public Places

The purpose is to regulate the care, control and management of property of and under the care, control and management of the Shire including thoroughfares. The effect is that some Shire property is set aside for particular uses, some activities are allowed only under a permit or under a determination, and others are restricted or prohibited. The local law also establishes offences for inappropriate behaviour in or on Shire property.

Meeting Procedures

The purpose is to regulate the conduct of council, committee and electors meeting. The effect is that meetings of council, committees and electors are to be conducted in accordance with the local law.

Parking

The purpose is to enable the Shire to regulate the parking of vehicles within the district and provide for the management and operation of parking facilities under the Shire's care, control and management. The effect is that a person parking a vehicle within the parking region is to comply with the provisions of the local law.

Repeal

The purpose is to repeal local laws relating to Signs, TV Antennae and Masts, and Bee Keeping. The effect is that the local laws are repealed.

Waste

The purpose is to regulate the storage, collection and disposal of waste and refuse from premises and on waste facilities in the Shire. The effect is that unless otherwise authorized, the storage, collection and disposal of waste and refuse within the Shire must be carried out in accordance with the provisions of the local law.

The proposed Local Laws may be inspected at the Shire offices at Irish Mulga Drive Kambalda, and Sylvester Street, Coolgardie and libraries at Barnes Drive, Kambalda and Sylvester Street, Coolgardie during normal opening hours or via the website at www.coolgardie.wa.gov.au.
