## The Shire Of Coolgardie Looks For Innovative Ways To Improve Access To Shire Services And Facilities

This month, the Shire formally signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Goldfields Individual and Family Support Association (GIFSA) – a not-for-profit that employs more than 100 local people from around the region to support people with disabilities, those who care for them and their families.

By signing the MOU, both the Shire and GIFSA hope to work collaboratively to improve access and inclusion for all members of the local community including people with disabilities, their families and carers, people from CALD backgrounds, Aboriginal Australians, the elderly, parents, children and people who experience other access and inclusion issues due to temporary illness or injuries.

Together with GIFSA, the Shire of Coolgardie will develop a framework to investigate ways to improve accessibility to services, events, facilities and buildings. The Shire will also look to support the delivery of GIFSA services to people with disabilities in the community. It is estimated that there are over 170 people with a disability living in the Shire of Coolgardie.

The Shire of Coolgardie is already taking steps to improve accessibility and inclusion within the Shire, with the development of a Universal Access Pool at the new Kambalda Aquatic Facility. A new beach entry, Universal Accessible Toilets, and other features will improve access to people with disabilities, their carers, seniors and families with young children.

October 2019



With Spring in the air over the Goldfields, the month of September has been a busy period in our Shire. There is a lift in the mining sector with the gold price over two thousand dollars per ounce and a strong indication from local nickel mining companies that they may reopen up to three of the previous nickel mines within the Kambalda area in the new year.

This will be a major benefit for the town of Kambalda as these companies are promoting the employment of local people and the Shire is hopeful that during the recruitment phase, new residents can be attracted to relocate and live in our towns.

At the Special Meeting of Council this month, tenders have been let for the commencement of repairs to several of the Shire's facilities including the Coolgardie Recreation Centre. The stadium in the centre has been unusable since the hail storm last December, and it will be good to finally have this facility back in use once more.

Tenders for two other projects in Coolgardie have also been approved by Council to commence. These are the truck parking and assembly area on the eastern end of Bayley Street, and the remaining sections on the Coolgardie North Road, which will see a full width bitumen seal to the Bonnievale Railway Station. Both of these projects will enhance road safety and hopefully reduce the impact of disruption within the residential area of road trains parking on the streets overnight.

The Shire was fortunate to host a visit to Coolgardie by the Premier of WA, Mark McGowan, accompanied by Regional Development Minister Alannah McTiernan on September 8 during their trip to the Goldfields for the Regional Cabinet meeting in Kalgoorlie. Shire Staff arranged for the framing of a photograph of the first Union and Labour Congress meeting, which was held in Coolgardie in 1899, to be presented to the Premier of which he was delighted to accept.

The Premier and Minister McTiernan were escorted on a tour of the Post Office Precinct with a view of the proposed redevelopment plans and also took the opportunity to chat with the vintage car group, which displayed their vehicles on Bayley Street during their trek through the Goldfields. The Premier presented a cheque of \$15,000 to the Coolgardie Day Committee from Lotteries West during the visit.

Councillors, CEO and Staff also conducted a tour of the Kambalda Pool for the Minister for Sport and Recreation, Mick Murray, to view progress of the renovation project underway on the site. Councillors spent considerable time with the Minister explaining the benefit of this facility, not only for Kambalda residents as this includes many visitors from Kalgoorlie and travellers passing through. He was quite impressed with the enthusiasm from our Councillors and commented that the progress of the works was very positive.

Myself and our Manager of Economic Development ,Mia Hicks, were fortunate to be invited to present a Regional Overview of the Goldfields Regional Councils to the Premier and State Cabinet on Monday, September 9, in Kalgoorlie. The presentation included information on projects and strategies being undertaken throughout the region, some of which include a comprehensive minerals and logistics strategy and the St John Primary Health Alliance with the Shire in Kambalda. The Premier and Ministers were very attentive and appreciative of the presentation and we received positive feedback that it was one of the best presentations they had received.

The annual Coolgardie Day Celebrations were an outstanding success with a huge crowd estimated at 20,000 people attending. The day attracted over 100 stalls and five of the extreme rides that only are usually available at the Perth Royal or large cities, and the large amount of free entertainment in the Coolgardie Park which included the popular band Tapping Sticks playing on stage.

A comment from one of the showmen who travels all over regional WA to the agricultural shows, was the Coolgardie Day event is now the biggest and most popular event of its kind outside the Perth Royal, which is a great accolade for the hard work and effort that Sheree Forward and the Coolgardie Day Committee have done over the past 12 months in preparation for the event.

#### **Shire of Coolgardie Largest Mineral Producer In Region**

- \$3.4B in value of mineral production for the region
- Growth of 8.9% in mineral production from 2017/18 largest regional growth percentage

The Shire of Coolgardie's value of mineral production once again places the area as the largest mineral producer in the region and the third largest local government producer in the State after the Pilbara.

The figures were revealed in the Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety's latest statistics release for 2018-19.

Figures show the value of mineral production achieved in the Shire reached \$3.4 billion in 2018/19; an 8.9 per cent increase from 2017/18; the largest growth in the region.

"The growth in 2018/19 came largely on the back on the increase in gold price with the strength of continued investment by Goldfields St Ives, Northern Star, and Evolution," said Shire President Malcolm Cullen.

"This year has also seen the purchase of the Higginsville gold operations by Canadian miner RNC Minerals and renewed investment into nickel by Mincor and newcomer, Black Mountain.

"I believe these record numbers can be partly attributed to the Shire of Coolgardie's proactive approach in engaging with mining companies to support their operations and growth in the area. We are anticipating a continued growth in the value of mineral production of at least 4 to 5 per cent in the next two years." Mr Cullen said.

## Coolgardie Day Draws Crowd Of 20,000

Coolgardie Day was held on Sunday, September 15, 2019 and once again the Coolgardie Day Celebrations Committee delivered an action packed, family fun free event for all to enjoy. The day started early for the small committee who were up before the sun (5am to be exact) placing banners up in the Coolgardie Park acknowledging our amazing sponsors, unlocking toilets, setting up tables and chairs for people to enjoy the festivities in the park and just being ready for the influx of various stall holders.

6am came and the main road through town was closed at the western and eastern entry points on Bayley Street by ATM Traffic controllers, then the large Cat dump trucks rolled into town with the support from the local police and parked out the front of the Post Office Building. The stall holders had started to arrive between 6am-8am, the barriers were set up in place for the Annual Coolgardie Day Street Parade for the 11am start.

Side Show Alley had been set up on Saturday and they were rearing and ready to excite the crowd. Australia's fastest ride "the Scorpion", punching out 3-4 Gs, had its first visit to Western Australia and Coolgardie was its first stop, along with the "Star Flyer" which had never been to our show before either. The other exciting rides were the "Shockwave", "The Claw" and the "Ghost Train". The trampolines, tea cup ride and various carnival games were all in attendance for everyone to try win a prize or two.

The crowds started to flow in quite early this year and they had the opportunity to listen to the Barefoot Bands on the two stages, one on Bayley Street and the other in the Main Coolgardie Park, where we had the huge marquee set up above the main stage this year to provide some shade for the crowd.

Coolgardie Park was chock a block full all day. A huge thank you to

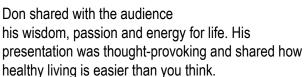


## Don Chisholm 'The Gut Man' Visits Kambalda

- 4. The simplicity of health and living without disease.

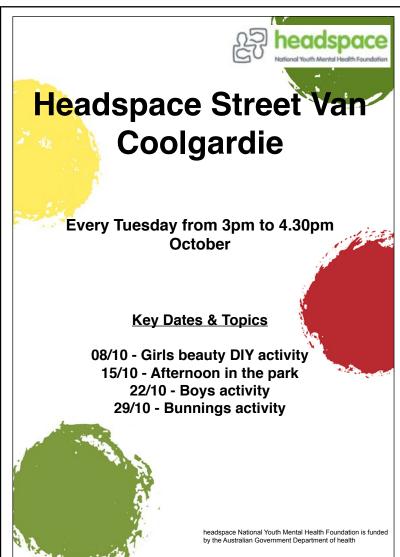

## Shire of Coolgardie Mosquito Fogging Program 2019/20

Please be advised the Coolgardie Shire is currently taking measures to ensure that mosquito breeding does not occur which will help prevent the incidence of mosquito borne diseases such as Ross River Virus and other similar viruses. The Shire is currently working to develop a mosquito management plan which will consider all the available strategies and techniques currently used in the industry, especially the potential for source reduction and larval treatment as the Mosquito life cycle is only 12 – 14 days.

Street fogging is the spraying of an ultra-fine mist into the air from a slowly moving vehicle. The chemicals approved for fogging are usually in the "synthetic pyrethroid" family, which are designed to target insects while having a very low toxicity towards humans and mammals. At the approved dispersion rate the fog is harmless to humans, dogs, cats and birds, but is toxic to fish and aquatic organisms. The use of fogging is weather dependant with spraying ceasing during windy conditions.

When fogging is in progress, a Shire vehicle will display flashing beacon and vehicle lights and signage notifying of fogging in progress.

In urban environments mosquitoes can breed in a range of water holding containers such as;

- Pot plant drip trays
- Septic and Leach Drains
- Rain water tanks

#### **Further information**

- Maximum of \$150 per child per calendar year.
- · \$150 can be split over multiple clubs.
- Fees are only for the nominated registered season.

- No limitation to the number of applications per family, providing the criteria for each child is met.
- Applicants can only receive KidSport funding for a financial exception once.



#### KidSport financial exceptions

If applicants are not listed on a valid concession card they can apply for a KidSport financial exception through a financial assessor.

#### Who are KidSport financial assessors?

KidSport financial assessors are professional employees at agencies who provide support services for families. They will assess a family's financial situation against the KidSport financial exceptions and submit a KidSport application on their behalf. The department will review and assess the application.

#### Financial exceptions

- Sudden loss of employment and subsequent income from the main income earner of the family. This does not include voluntary unemployment or circumstances where a redundancy payment has been received.
- Death or serious illness of a parent/ guardian causing significant impact on the household income.
- Fire, flood or other natural disaster causing significant impact on the household's financial situation.
- Situations where the child has been placed into care (of the State, foster or extended family) and the relevant concession cards are unavailable.

- Applications are assessed within 10 working days and if approved your code will be emailed to you.
- Voucher codes should be submitted to the club. Clubs can then claim their funding through their online portal.
- · Vouchers expire after 90 days.

Applicants who are not listed on a valid concession card but meet one of the KidSport financial exceptions can apply for KidSport by contacting a financial assessor.





## **Building Skills With Bright Minds Activities**

At Bright Minds Therapy we have had a busy term three within the Shire of Coolgardie.

Services this term commenced as per normal with speech pathology and occupational therapy staff completing their first two visits of the term together; however from week 3 the speech pathology services were temporarily withdrawn due to staff resignation and inability to fill the position. And with staff leave planned, the term was somewhat disrupted; however occupational therapy pushed through to hold some make up sessions on Mondays to finish off the term.

There was a strong focus this term on providing ongoing services to clients screened in terms one and two, as well as screening of a few new referrals.

Read aloud groups recommenced towards the end of the term in Kambalda, followed by developmental playgroup sessions. And in Coolgardie the occupational therapist joined the already established Wednesday morning playgroup to provide an activity station for children to work on fine motor skills development.

We are looking forward to finishing up the year's services in the Shire in term four. Unfortunately the speech pathology position is still vacant; however we will have a fourth-year OT student available to provide increased OT services.

We will be re-offering the 123 magic and emotion coaching course in Term 4 if there is enough interest. Please fill out

#### Food, Water & Shelter

As responsible dog owners we must make sure our beloved dogs are fed on a daily basis, have access to plenty of fresh water and suitable shelter available to them. With the warm weather coming, it is especially important as they rely on us to make sure they have all of these things to keep them happy, healthy, comfortable and in good condition.

Consider filling a large bucket of fresh water, ensuring you maintian the freshness and amount available to them daily. Also, a half shell that they can hop in to cool down in is a fantastic idea and another source of water for them.

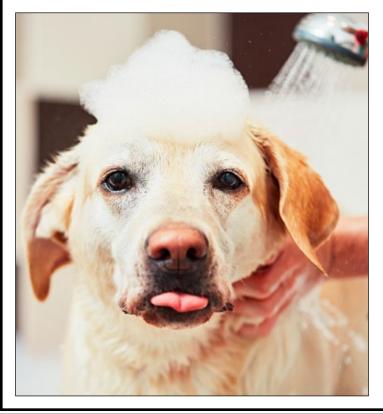


#### **Grooming, Exercise & Play**

Our dogs count on us to help them out when it comes to grooming. Giving them a bath and brush on a regular basis can assist in health issues like skin irritations, fleas/ticks and matted fur. It also assists them with shedding and not being "on the nose". Nail clipping is sometimes required too.

Playing with and exercising our dogs is so important to their health and wellbeing and to ours as well. It helps them to keep in shape, burn off energy, learn tricks and bond with us. Please remember that when walking or exercising your dog in public, you must keep them tethered on a lead unless in an off-lead area. Keep in mind though, in an off-lead area, you must have control of and the ability to recall your dog effectively to you to attach a lead as required.

## Vaccination & Sterilisation Maintaining the health of our dogs is very important. Vaccinating can assist in

Vaccinating can assist in preventing our dogs from contracting any nasty diseases or viruses including kennel cough or parvo.

Sterilising is beneficial to their health too as it can reduce the risk of uterine infections, mammary or prostate cancer as well as the prevention of unwanted pregnancies. It can also reduce their desire to roam.



When you register your dog, you are required to make a signed declaration to certify that the property where the dog is kept is capable of confining the dog within the premises. Therefore, as a dog owner you must have adequate fencing that is stable and in good repair. Any fencing that has started to separate or is in need of repair should be addressed as soon as possible

to avoid the risk of your dog escaping or injuring itself in the process. Gates should also be satisfactory enough to close and latch properly. A spring-loaded gate that self-locks is a brilliant idea for dog owners.

Your yard should be a well-maintained area that is suitable for the size of your dog. This means it should have enough space for your dog to move around and exercise, be free of any hazardous materials, have suitable shelter available, good fencing in place and faeces removed regularly.

#### Registration & Microchipping

As you can see owning a dog brings with it a lot of responsibilty. By law, as dog owners, we must register and microchip our dogs from three months of age. It is up to us to ensure this is done and that the dog's registration and your contact details are current and up to date. Dogs should be wearing their rego tag on their collar at all times and replacement tags are available if tag gets lost or damaged.

Microchipping can be carried out by our Ranger or your vet by appointment. As long as all of this is done correctly, it will making reuniting you with your dog a much easier and smoother process should your dog get out.

NO FIRES are to be lit in the open air between November 1, 2019 and March 31, 2020. The ban applies throughout the whole of the Shire of Coolgardie.

## Bush Fire Act Notice For Owners And Occupiers

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are hereby required on or before the first day of November or within fourteen days of your becoming owner or occupier of land should this be after this day to clear all firebreaks and remove flammable materials from the land owned or occupied by you as specified hereunder and to have the specified land and firebreaks clear of all flammable materials from the first day of November up to the thirty first day of March.

#### 1. Land Outside Town Sites

- All buildings on land which are outside town sites shall be surrounded by two firebreaks not less than two (2) meters wide cleared of all flammable material, the inner firebreak to be not more than twenty (20) meters from the perimeter of the building or group of buildings and the outer firebreak not less than 200 meters from the inner firebreak.
- 1.2 The removal of flammable material from the whole of the land between the firebreaks required in paragraph 1.1 above.

#### 2. Land In Town Sites

- Where the area of land is 2000 square meters (approximately ½ acre) or less, all flammable material shall be removed from the whole of the land.
- 2.2 Where the area of land exceeds 2000 square meters, firebreaks at least three (3) meters in width shall be cleared of all flammable material immediately inside and along the boundaries of land. Where there are buildings on the land additional firebreaks three (3) meters in width shall be cleared immediately surrounding each building.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks or remove flammable material as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council not later than the first day of November for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to remove or abate fire hazards. If permission is not granted by Council or its' duly authorised Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Flammable material" does not include green growing trees or green growing plants in gardens. It also does not include plants native to the region that are fire resistant, for example; saltbush shrubs.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning shall comply with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fire Act 1954.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$5000 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay cost of performing the work directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

THE PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD WILL BE FROM 1 NOVEMBER TO 31 MARCH AND SHALL APPLY THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE SHIRE.

THE RESTRICTED BURING PERIOD WILL BE FROM 10CTOBER THROUGH TO 30 APRIL.

# Premier And Representatives Visit Labor Party's Coolgardie Origins



With the recent visit of the Premier, the Hon Mark McGowan, the Minister the Hon Alannah MacTiernan and the Hon Kyle Owen McGinn to Coolgardie on Sunday, September 8, 2019 they were interested in seeing where the first Labor (spelt this way in 1899) Party was formed in Coolgardie back in 1899.

After some in depth research with fantastic assistance from Moya Sharp and the Eastern Goldfields Historical Society it was revealed that the Trade Congress delegates from Goldfields, Perth and Fremantle were met at the Coolgardie Railway Station on April 11, 1899 by the Mayor of Coolgardie, Mr J T Glowery, and they adjourned to the Municipal Council Chambers for a welcoming. After that the delegates went to Pearce's Athletic Hall on Bayley Street and this is where the WA Labor Party was established.

The Pearce's Athletic Hall no longer exists and the location of this building is in between Jacqui Mill's Art Shop and the previous Way out West Café. Our visitors took the opportunity to have a photo taken in that area.

The whole exercise of researching where the building was reminded us how much our town has changed and how busy Coolgardie was back in those days, and full of beautiful big buildings that are no longer standing, and the pioneers who were here in the Mother of the Goldfields.

Here is an article kindly supplied by Moya Sharp about Harry Pearce:

#### Harry Pearce: sportsman and miner

Harry Pearce, a former instructor with the Victorian Police Force, opened a gymnasium in portion of Leiper & Lamb's store in 1893, where he taught boxing and promoted bouts for prizes donated at his insistence by lucky miners and where, according to one writer 'the exponents of biff by sleight of hand extracted gold from the pockets of the miners and placed it in their own'.

When Frank O'Donnell bought the store as a site for a new hotel, Harry Pearce shifted the gymnasium to another site further up Bayley Street, between the Courier office and the Denver City Hotel. By day fighting men gathered, and on Saturday nights there was a 'regular feast of glove-knuckled bashes'. 'Smiler' Hales put up one of his numerous fights and lost a finger in an argument with a German who had attracted 'Smiler's' partner for a dance in Pearce's Salon de Luxe.

Father Ryan, collecting for the new Roman Catholic Church, wrestled with the big Dane 'Nungerson' for a tenner and threw him so hard he broke the Dane's shoulder. Occasionally, little George Powell delighted the fans with superb displays of hand, head and footwork in exhibitions with men twice his size who were never able to lay a glove on him.'

After functioning as a gymnasium since 1893 Harry Pearce decided to turn his premises into a private club 'to

encourage athletic exercises among businessmen' who paid one guinea entrance fee and an annual subscription of two guineas.

Harry Pearce wasn't only a business man but also a mine owner. The Star of Fremantle at Kunanalling was a very profitable mine and the family lived on the lease for many years. The family were to own and run the mine for over 20 years.

Mr and Mrs W H Pearce had four children: William, Ruby, Lylie and Clara.

## Mystery Surrounds The Birth Of Kambalda

There is much speculation about who found gold first at Red Hill, and the exact date.

A lot of research has been conducted in order to get to the bottom of what has turned out to be a bit of a mystery. And so, it seems the discovery of gold at Red Hill is looking a bit like the Ford/Bayley/ Talbot saga.

Anyway, here is what has been discovered so far ... you be the judge!

The following information was written in the *Coolgardie Miner*, on September 27, 1897.

"According to a report Percy Larkins and party, which consisted of the prospectors Harvey, Giblets, Straube, Sampey, Heppingstone, Tom Larkins, Jim Larkins, Percy Larkins and a well-known Aboriginal boy named Monkey, were prospecting a belt of gold-bearing country on the Hampton Plains. The belt ran north and south, and at the beginning of December decided to give the south a trial.

"They travelled two miles south of their other workings and started napping and getting gold in several outcrops (near where the townsite sits today). It was resolved to give the area a good trial on December 17. Jack Gibletts and Percy Larkins specked several pieces of gold on the edge of the lake.

"Something sensational was found among the laminated ironstone - pennyweight pieces of gold was exposed to the prospectors. The property was pegged, and Percy Larkins made his way to Coolgardie to take up what is known as Christmas Box."

News of the find gradually leaked out, and with that a new rush began. By March and April there were at least 1000 men who were hunting for their fortune, some doing very well.

(A book, written by J.J Gresham states that Larkin returned to Coolgardie in January of 1897 with 106 ounces of gold, and that by April only 400 to 500 people were on the site of Larkin's find.)

A week later, on October 1, 1897 an article was published in the *Coolgardie Miner*. It was written by Mr. J. T. Giblett (one of the prospectors mentioned in the previous article) on September 28, 1897.

He writes: "In the first place, the gold-bearing reefs found near the present townsite were discovered by W. Ervine and J. Harvey in early December, neither of them at the time being connected with Larkins party. The finding of alluvial gold on the lake, that was specked by myself on December 17. Percy Larkins came on me while I was specking, and on him questioning me I showed him what I had got. On December 18 my mates (J. Straube and J. Harvey) and myself moved camp to block 48 from Plate Well. December 19, we amalgamated with Larkins and party and agreed to try the ground together. Previous to December 19, I was in no way connected with Larkins or party. This is the correct account of how Red Hill was discovered."

Aaaah, so the plot thickens.

It would be quite difficult to determine exactly what happened, but for any history buff, it would also be exciting digging into the past to discover the truth.

# Shire of Coolgardie Kerbside Waste Collection

#### REFUSE COLLECTION

Hard refuse should be placed neatly on the verge as close as possible to the kerb and your driveway. The following items will be collected from your verge;

WHITE GOODS -Stoves, refrigerators (doors to be removed), washing machines etc. TRAMPOLINES/SWING SETS must be dismantled SCRAP METAL OLD FURNITURE GENERAL RUBBISH

The white goods and scrap metal should be placed on the verge in a pile separate to the other hard refuse as this will be collected separately and recycled. All items of hard refuse will be collected by hand. A maximum weight will apply and as a general rule, two (2) people should be able to lift the item easily to shoulder height with the item being no longer than 4 metres.

Please note this service is available in townsites only. It is important that residents pay close attention to the requirements of the roadside collections. All waste is to be placed in a pile neatly on the verge no earlier than one (1) week prior to the advertised collection week.

All waste must be placed on the verge by 6.00am on the advertised starting date as the truck will only travel down your street once. All waste is to be placed on the verge without obstructing footpaths or line of sight particularly adjacent to road intersections. Waste will not be collected from Vacant Properties, Public Land or Land outside townsite boundaries.

# Be Snake Aware In The Goldfields

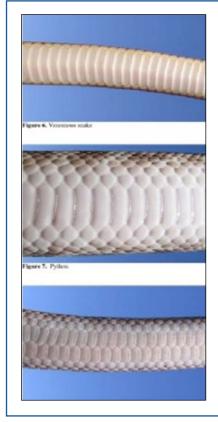
As the weather starts to warm up, the snakes are starting to come out of hiding.

It is important to note that in the Goldfields there are legless lizards (that look very similar to snakes; but are non-venomous), non-venomous snakes (pythons) and venomous snakes. The way to tell the difference between these three species is the scales on their underside.

If you see a snake or suspect a snake to be nearby, DO NOT approach or kill it. Snakes are a protected species in Western Australia and killing them without reason can result in a fine.

There are qualified snake handlers in Coolgardie. Please contact the Shire of Coolgardie on 9080 2111 if you are in need of assistance with a snake. Please do not try and catch the snake yourself, as they can strike and may be venomous.

If you get bitten by a snake, immediately apply pressure to the wound and imobilise it, moving it as little as possible. Call triple zero (000) and try your best to recall what the snake looked like, to help with identification for anti-venom.

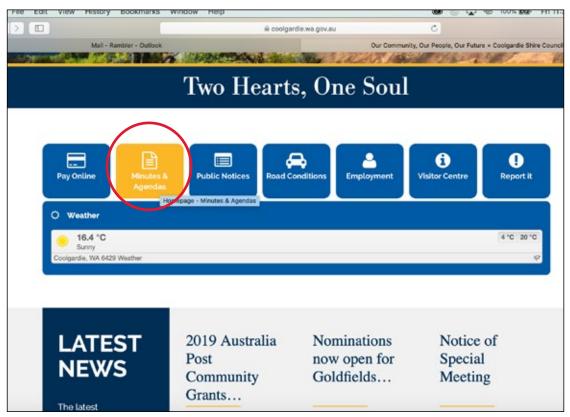

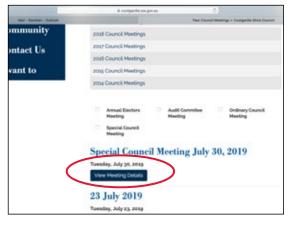

# Mural Project completed by Ashlee Donkin

Merging ideas of two Kambalda Artists, depicting the original purpose of the Arts Centre as a service station with Ash's playful style and a lot of hard work by both has resulted in another successful community Arts Project.

The two Artists, John Scott and Ashlee Donkin came together in June last year to discuss the mural mentorship. It was not expected to take so long to complete, but all seems for a really good result. The mural needs to be coated to protect it, will be unveiled and installed in the front window of the Kambalda Arts Centre later this year.

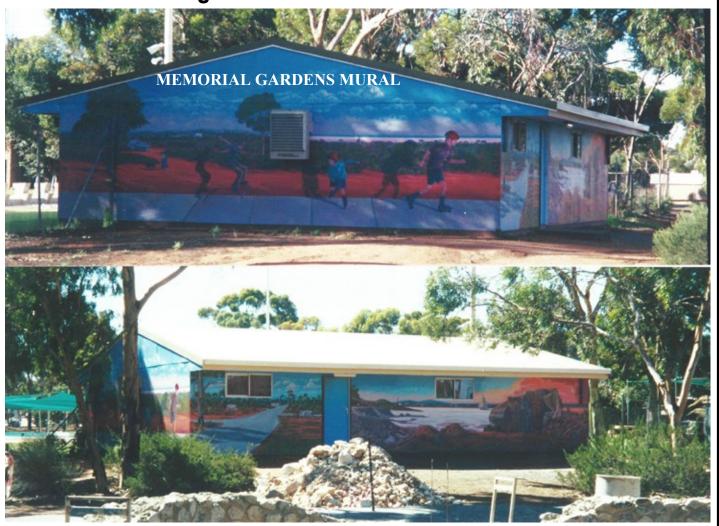
#### Memorial Gardens Mural Art Project 1999-2000

This project was initiated by the Shire through their Community Development Officer, Barry Gresham and was supervised by John Scott under contract. It took almost 12 months to complete, was unveiled in early June 2000, involving about 125 community participants and was in essence a wonderful event for building the spirit and part of getting the Memorial Gardens Project complete. CANWA, local business, Kambalda Swimming Club and Rotary also contributed to the cost. It was broken into three parts—Youth, Seniors and general community.

The paints used were Solver Bright Glo, at that time the best household paints available for murals and after coating have only a life of 10 years in our harsh environment, so have stood the test of time.

Reflecting back to then, it was this project that built a platform for our group and led us to forming, initially as a sub-committee of the Kambalda Tourist Bureau. Then a mural mentorship for John Scott followed, mentored by community Artists, Fiona Sinclair and Peter Hill. That project was for the Kambalda Seniors to paint character images of "Old People Doing Young Peoples Things". That went when the building was demolished and so did the flip side painted by youth that was on the swimming pool wall that has also gone. These were both very good training exercises.

The top image is the youth section and the bottom, left of the door by Seniors and to the right by the rest of the community. The air conditioner was removed later and that area had to be painted and the "Blue door" was replaced and painted by John Scott in 2006.

#### **Important Spin-Off from this mural:**

Because of it being a time-line mural, research into the history of Kambalda followed, leading to a photo album held in the original Shire's library, so as to find appropriate images.

The subject matter in the mural's pioneering portion were Red Hill Camp, Butterfly Dumps, Sorrenson's Land Yacht and some of the Red Hill camps around the lake.

Consequently, after moving into the current Arts Centre building, it seemed logical to have an pictorial historical display for the public to view, as nothing existed here. But, locating the album became a problem, so we had to go to the Eastern Goldfields Historical Society to obtain the photos and permission to display. Two people in our community had taken the liberty for research, a reason to make photocopies from the album, so by eventually matching the photos, were able to compile a list.

Quite a lot of those images are on display at the Arts Centre, but it's what followed from that research, locating books, publications and building a collection that adds value.

From this, combined with hard work by Mrs Billie Ingham, this research needs to continue.

The Old Testament book of 1 Kings records Solomon as the wisest man to ever live. He ruled over the nation of Israel and led the people to great prosperity, great buildings, including the temple in Jerusalem, a time of peace and a time of influence. Once the temple had been built many visited Israel to see it's marvellous feats and to listen to this man who was known as the wisest who ever lived.

There was a woman who was known as the Queen of Sheba who had heard about Solomon's wisdom and fame. Her response after checking it out for herself is recorded in 1 Kings, 'And when the gueen of Sheba had seen all Solomon's wisdom, and the house which he had built, and the food of his table, and the sitting of his servants, and the attendance of his ministers, and their clothing, and his cupbearers, and his burnt offering that he offered up to the house of Jehovah, there was no more spirit in her.' 1 Kings 10:4-5

Her breath was taken from her or 'there was no more spirit in her.' Often when meeting someone who has been built up as a hero we can end up disappointed. Famous people can often be a hero from a distance but not quite the same when encountered close up. Not so with Solomon, according to the Queen of Sheba. Her breath was taken away. Solomon went on to write the Old Testament books of Proverbs, Ecclesiastes and Song of Songs all of which are studied to this day.

It was not surprising then to see the very negative reaction to the Lord Jesus Christ when He said 'The queen of the south shall rise up in the Judgment with this generation, and shall condemn it, for she came from the uttermost parts of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon, and behold, One greater than Solomon is here.' Mathew 12:42. To claim to be wiser than Solomon equated to blasphemy.

Even today I would argue that the words of Jesus have done more good than any other words in history. It's no wonder that Jesus stated 'Heaven and the earth shall pass away, but My Words shall not pass away." Matthew 24:35. If the Queen of Sheba humbled herself in order to listen to the words of Solomon how much more should we humble ourselves and pay attention to the words of the Son of God.
