SHIRE SECURES FORUM NAMING RIGHTS

20th Annual KBCCI What's Down The Track Event Presented By Shire Of Coolgardie

The Shire of Coolgardie has secured the sole naming rights for the KBCCI's What's Down the Track being held in Kalgoorlie on Thursday, November 21, 2019.

As the Platinum sponsor, the Shire will also be provided an opportunity to give a number of presentations during the forum and display everything that is great about the Shire of Coolgardie at an exhibition booth.

The Shire of Coolgardie is the largest mineral producer in the region and the third largest local government producer in the State after the Pilbara. Recent figures released by the Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety, revealed that the value of mineral production achieved in the Shire reached \$3.4 billion in 2018/19 and currently accounts for 30 per cent of mineral production in the region.

"The Shire is privileged to have the opportunity to sponsor such an important event that showcases the mining industry in the Goldfields," said Malcom Cullen, Shire President. "Over the past two years, the Shire has proactively engaged with this industry to promote economic development to bring greater benefits to our communities.

"We also have a significant number of initiatives underway that we will share with attendees at the event - many of which will provide direct benefits to industry and communities throughout the region."

Summer is finally here bringing a busy month of October for the Shire.

Last month, statistics were released by the Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety that showed the Shire was once again the largest mineral producer in the region for 2018/19. Figures show the value of mineral production achieved in the Shire reached \$3.4 billion in 2018/19; an 8.9 per cent increase from 2017/18; the largest growth in the region.

The increase came largely on the back of the increased gold price with the strength of continued investment by Goldfields St Ives, Northern Star, and Evolution.

This year has also seen the purchase of the Higginsville gold operations by Canadian miner RNC Minerals and renewed investment into nickel by Mincor and newcomer, Black Mountain. In the next two years, there is an anticipated continued growth in the value of mineral production of at least 4 to 5 per cent.

The Shire CEO and I work collaboratively with these industry stakeholders to support economic and community development in the Shire. The Shire has established MOUs with major mining companies to identify how we can best obtain their support for infrastructure and community projects. A good outcome of this partnership approach was the contribution from Goldfields St Ives of \$200,000 towards the Kambalda Aquatic Facility redevelopment.

To complement this growth, we are also seeing several of our strategic projects getting underway with the commencement of the Lady Loch parking area project early this month. This project dates back several years, so it is fantastic to see machinery on site and development underway.

Construction has also commenced on the remaining sections on the Coolgardie North Road, which will see a full width bitumen seal to the Bonnievale Railway Station. Both projects will enhance road safety and hopefully reduce the impact of disruption within the residential area of road trains parking on the streets.

On Saturday, 19 October, the Local Government Elections were held with returning officer, Liisa Morrow working closely with our staff to run the electoral process. Congratulations to Tracey Rathbone, Kathie Lindup and Tammee Keast on your election to Council. I would like to thank Betty Logan for her service to our communities over the past eight years. Betty has been an invaluable member of our Council and we wish her all the best in her next endeavours.

This month also saw the re-launch of our community assistance grants through two workshops held in Coolgardie and Kambalda. Compass Consulting was engaged by the Shire to teach local community groups on how to access community assistance funding and apply for other funding available to them. I hope that community groups received some great tips on how to access funding to support their events and programs.

With a total of 1684 issues and renewals in the past financial year, the Kambalda Library recorded a very busy time, with many readers in our community visiting the library.

With new families moving to Kambalda constantly, we are proud to have welcomed 71 new borrowers in the past financial year. We now have a total of 323 active borrowers in our community, all with a love and passion for literature. If you have not got a library membership yet, now is the time to come and see your friendly staff in the Kambalda Public Library to fill out your FREE membership form.

Inter Library Loans and e-Resources

There is a wide range of adult fiction, adult non-fiction, junior fiction, junior kindy and junior non-fiction available in your library to explore. Members also have access to unlimited inter-library loans and to a number of e-resources.

E-resources are electronic alternatives to loaning out books or audio items using an electronic device. Most of these are available to download from your App Store or Google Play store. Some are also available for download via the Microsoft App store.

By utilising e-resources you will have access to the State Library of Western Australia's eBook, audio book and magazine collection at the touch of your fingertips.

Two very popular e-resources are Borrow Box and the Story Box library. The Borrow Box library is a fantastic app to borrow ebooks and eAudiobooks for adults and children alike.

Younger audiences can visit the Story Box library and choose from more than 270 stories read by well-known illustrators, authors and storytellers. You can even create a playlist for your child to listen to the same stories over and over again.

Simply sign in by choosing your library from the drop-down list and use your Public Library Card Number located on the back of your library membership card, and let the storytelling begin.

Ranger Focus: Fire Hazards In The Spotlight



Shire Rangers have recently identified a number of properties that are considered to be potential fire hazards within both Coolgardie and Kambalda town sites.

If you have not received a letter requesting you to clear your property within the given time frame, then please be sure you are continuing to maintain your property by keeping it clear of all flammable materials and having firebreaks installed if required.

Bush Fire Act (1954)

As stated under Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act (1954), everyone is required on or before the first day of November, or within 14 days of your becoming an owner or occupier of land should this be after this day, to clear all firebreaks and remove flammable materials from the land owned or occupied by you as specified hereunder and to have the specified land and firebreaks clear of all flammable materials from the first day of November up to the thirty first day of March.



"Flammable material" does not include green growing trees or green growing plants in gardens. It also does not include plants native to the region that are fire resistant, for example Saltbush shrubs.

The penalty for failing to comply with the Bush Fires Act 1954 is a fine of \$5000.00 and a person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not to pay the cost of performing the work required to be done.

FIRE RESTRICTIONS

Prohibited Burning Time: November 1 - March 31. NO burning off is permitted.

Restricted Burning Time: April 1-30 and October 1-31. Burning off can be undertaken with a permit.

Burning Off Permitted: May 1 through to September 30. No permit necessary to burn off.




Rangers & RSPCA Entertain And Educate At Holiday Program

Shire of Coolgardie Mosquito Fogging Program 2019/20

Please be advised the Coolgardie Shire is currently taking measures to ensure that mosquito breeding does not occur which will help prevent the incidence of mosquito borne diseases such as Ross River Virus and other similar viruses. The Shire is currently working to develop a mosquito management plan which will consider all the available strategies and techniques currently used in the industry, especially the potential for source reduction and larval treatment as the Mosquito life cycle is only 12 – 14 days.

Street fogging is the spraying of an ultra-fine mist into the air from a slowly moving vehicle. The chemicals approved for fogging are usually in the "synthetic pyrethroid" family, which are designed to target insects while having a very low toxicity towards humans and mammals. At the approved dispersion rate the fog is harmless to humans, dogs, cats and birds, but is toxic to fish and aquatic organisms. The use of fogging is weather dependant with spraying ceasing during windy conditions.

When fogging is in progress, a Shire vehicle will display flashing beacon and vehicle lights and signage notifying of fogging in progress.

In urban environments mosquitoes can breed in a range of water holding containers such as;

- Pot plant drip trays
- · Septic and Leach Drains
- Rain water tanks
- Any old 44 Gallon Drums containing any water or liquid
- Roof gutters
- Ponds and disused containers
- Poorly maintained swimming pools
- Dog water bowls
- Disused car tyres


By checking or removing and maintaining these sites, mosquito numbers can be reduced in urban areas.

Fogging is scheduled to start commencing in November 2019, and residents are invited to make comment to the Shire via email mail@coolgardie.wa.gov.au or call to discuss on 90802111.




Cashless Debit Card

How it works and where it can be used

The Cashless Debit Card looks and operates like any regular bankcard, however, it restricts the purchase of alcohol, gambling products and some gift cards and cannot be used to withdraw cash.

What does the Cashless Debit Card look like?



Where can the Cashless Debit Card be used?

It can be used:

- in any store that accepts EFTPOS nationwide, and to shop at approved online stores
- to pay bills and make recurring payments (such as rent or mortgages)
- for online banking via the Indue website or with an app for both Android and Apple devices

It cannot be used to:

- x buy alcohol
- x buy gambling products and/or some gift cards
- x withdraw cash

How does the Cashless Debit Card work?

- The Cashless Debit Card does not change the amount of money people receive from Centrelink
- It only changes the way in which people receive and spend their fortnightly payments

People on the Cashless Debit Card receive:

- 20 per cent of their welfare payment into their regular bank account
- 80 per cent of their welfare payment onto their Cashless Debit Card
- 100 per cent of lump sum payments from Centrelink (e.g. Family Tax Benefit) onto their Cashless Debit Card

Example of how someone might receive their payments if they are on the Cashless Debit Card:

If a single person with three children aged under eight and renting receives \$1,468 in Newstart Allowance, Family Tax Benefit and other payments every fortnight:

- \$1,174 will go onto their Cashless Debit Card
- \$294 will go into their regular bank account, which they can access as cash

Snake Handlers ... To Horse Rescuers

On the afternoon of Friday, October 19, Coolgardie volunteer snake handlers Allana Lind and Aleysha Elmer were called out to a unique case.

A member of the public informed the Coolgardie Community Recreation Centre staff of a dead horse in the Londonderry dam (about 10km south of Coolgardie), with its young foal nearby, alone. Allana and Aleysha were called out to pull the dead horse from the dam, to prevent contamination to the water, and to attempt to catch the young foal, which would've died without its mother.

The ladies arrived on the scene at the Londonderry dam and saw a horse lying on its side in the waterhole. Upon closer inspection, they discovered it was alive!

She was exhausted, weak and very stuck in the clay-like mud. Her foal was patiently watching from a distance, along with another horse, which was believed to be a stallion. Allana and Aleysha couldn't believe their luck and immediately went on their hands and knees in the mud to start digging to free the mare's legs, which were trapped. She was so weak that she didn't fight or resist the help.

Allana and Aleysha eventually freed the mare from the mud after about 30 minutes, but ran into their next issue. The mare was so tired that she didn't want to stand up.

The ladies knew they had to get her on her feet or she might not attempt to stand. They were also mindful that there could be predators around and didn't want to leave her there.



After trying to push the mare onto her feet, she was still being too stubborn and wouldn't get on her feet. Allana luckily had some straps and rope in her ute, so she made a loop around the horse's belly and resorted to dragging the mare to her feet with the ute – which worked!

The exhausted mare shakily got to her feet and trotted off into the bush where her excited foal and stallion rejoined with her. The brumby family was back together again.

"It's moments like this in life that you never forget – seeing the mare rejoin with her foal was incredible. I don't want to think about what could've happened if the member of the public didn't tell us about the horse in the dam. We are so happy about the outcome and hope the mare is doing well," said Aleysha.



How To Report A Faulty Street Light

Got a faulty streetlight on your street? Simply go to the Western Power website and follow the prompts to report it online, or by phone on the number listed below.

Western Power will then arrange to have it repaired or replaced.

To report a broken, flickering or otherwise faulty streetlight:

- Go to www.westernpower.com.au and click on 'faults and outages'.
- Follow the prompts and on the interactive map, find the faulty streetlight. Select it, click on 'next' and fill in any additional information, your contact details and then click 'submit'.



If you are unable to report a streetlight problem online, you can phone the Western Power streetlight direct line on 1800 622 008. You will need to have noted down the streetlight number (posted on the light's pole) to tell the customer service representative. If you are unable to get the pole number, provide the customer service representative with the exact address, or as much information as possible to identify the location of the pole so Western Power staff can find it and provide the necessary repairs.

Western Power installs and maintains streetlights on behalf of most local councils. Councils control the location, brightness, and the number of streetlights in their area. Main arterial road lighting is installed and maintained by Main Roads Western Australia.

Western Power says that for streetlight faults in major regional centres (eg Kalgoorlie), repairs are normally made within five working days, and nine working days in rural areas.




DAILY FIRE DANGER RATING

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

What should I do with my pets and livestock during an emergency?

Part of your bushfire preparations should include preparing for any pets or animals you have on your property. As an owner of animals you have a duty of care to provide appropriate food, water, shelter and treatment for injury or disease for your animals.

Having a duty of care for an animal means you are legally obliged to care for it by providing for its needs in a reasonable way, so it is important to have a plan in place if a bushfire were to occur.

I can see and smell smoke, but here is no bushfire alert. What do I do?

DFES responds to more than 6,500 bushfires each year and only issues alerts and warnings when there is a known possible threat to life or property.

If there is no alert posted on the www.emergency.wa.gov.au website, recorded on the information line or distributed to the media, it often means there is no threat to your area at this time.

In the event that there is a bushfire that is known to be threatening property or personal safety, DFES will issue community warnings and alerts through a number of channels.

However, bushfires can start suddenly so you need to be ready to act even if you do not get an official warning. You need to stay alert on hot days and look for information, regularly going outside to check for signs of bushfire. Act immediately for your own safety. Do not wait and see – this can be deadly.

How can I find out today's Fire Danger Rating for my area?

Fire Danger Ratings are issued by the Bureau of Meteorology and are publicised by DFES when there is a rating of severe or above.

Check the Fire Danger Ratings page to find out whether your area has a rating at severe or above.

If your area is not listed on that page, you can find out the Fire Danger Rating for your area by going to the Bureau of Meteorology's website and clicking on the relevant section of the map. Alternatively, scroll to the bottom of the Shire of Coolgardie website and view the Fire Danger Rating in the bottom footer.

What are firebreaks? Why are they required?

Firebreaks are 'a strip of land that has been cleared of all trees, bushes, grasses and any other object or thing or flammable vegetation leaving clear, bare mineral earth.'

Firebreaks is also used as a generic term to describe the broader fire prevention work required by land or property owners.

Firebreaks are required in order to provide a safe area for firefighters to work from in a bushfire, to prevent the extension of a bushfire, and to prevent a fire entering or leaving your property.



Prohibited burning time

NO FIRES are to be lit in the open air between November 1, 2019 and March 31, 2020. The ban applies throughout the whole of the Shire of Coolgardie.

Bush Fire Act Notice For Owners And Occupiers

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are hereby required on or before the first day of November or within fourteen days of your becoming owner or occupier of land should this be after this day to clear all firebreaks and remove flammable materials from the land owned or occupied by you as specified hereunder and to have the specified land and firebreaks clear of all flammable materials from the first day of November up to the thirty first day of March.

1. Land Outside Town Sites

- All buildings on land which are outside town sites shall be surrounded by two firebreaks not less than two (2) meters wide cleared of all flammable material, the inner firebreak to be not more than twenty (20) meters from the perimeter of the building or group of buildings and the outer firebreak not less than 200 meters from the inner firebreak.
- 1.2 The removal of flammable material from the whole of the land between the firebreaks required in paragraph 1.1 above.

2. Land In Town Sites

- 2.1 Where the area of land is 2000 square meters (approximately ½ acre) or less, all flammable material shall be removed from the whole of the land.
- Where the area of land exceeds 2000 square meters, firebreaks at least three (3) meters in width shall be cleared of all flammable material immediately inside and along the boundaries of land. Where there are buildings on the land additional firebreaks three (3) meters in width shall be cleared immediately surrounding each building.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks or remove flammable material as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council not later than the first day of November for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to remove or abate fire hazards. If permission is not granted by Council or its' duly authorised Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Flammable material" does not include green growing trees or green growing plants in gardens. It also does not include plants native to the region that are fire resistant, for example; saltbush shrubs.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning shall comply with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fire Act 1954.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$5000 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay cost of performing the work directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

THE PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD WILL BE FROM 1 NOVEMBER TO 31 MARCH AND SHALL APPLY THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE SHIRE.

THE RESTRICTED BURING PERIOD WILL BE FROM 10CTOBER THROUGH TO 30 APRIL.

easy pizza scrolls

INGREDIENTS:

- 1/2 small red capsicum, chopped finely
- 100g ham or 100g salami, 2 sheets ready rolled finely chopped
- 1/2 cup cheese, grated
- 1/4 cup pizza sauce
 - puff pastry



METHOD:

- 1. Preheat oven to 200C.
- 2. Combine the chopped capsicum, ham and cheese in bowl.
- 3. Spread the sauce onto each sheet of pastry, leaving a 2cm border along one side, and sprinkle the capsicum mixture over the top.
- 4. Roll up the pastry to enclose the filling (like a swiss roll), leaving the plain edge until last.
- 5. Brush the edge lightly with water and fold to seal.
- 6. Cut each roll into 1cm rounds (use serrated bread knife) and place on lined oven trays.
- 7. Bake for 20 minutes or until the pastry is golden.



The account of creation in the book of Genesis is quickly followed by what is known as the fall of man. First Eve ate from the tree (described as the tree of knowledge of good and evil) that God had told them not to eat from and she was quickly followed by her husband Adam. One of the promises the serpent made to Eve when encouraging her to eat of the tree was that it would make her wise (Genesis 3:6). Eating the fruit of the tree according to the serpent was good for food, pleasant to the eyes and able to make her wise.

On first glance it would seem a perfectly reasonable thing to want to obtain wisdom. Ignorance is not bliss and can lead to all sorts of problems. God Himself is described in Scripture as being the only wise God so why wouldn't His creation also want to be wise. The bible says that prior to Adam and Eve eating the fruit of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil that God walked with them daily. At their fingertips was the wisdom and knowledge of an all-wise God.

By partaking of the fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil instead of being wise they actually became foolish. One commentator points out that God had not intended for man to know good and evil but to be able to discern good from evil. Over the recent long weekend, Coolgardie once again hosted the Bottle and Collectables Club of WA (BACWA) during their second Council-approved dig at the Coolgardie tip.

The weekend started for the more than 50 registered bottle diggers with a social barbecue on the Friday night at Warden Finnerty's Residence. This was followed by a small bottle auction, including some lovely items very kindly donated by BACWA members, with all proceeds raised from the auction going to the Coolgardie Exhibition Museum.

At 8am Saturday the very excited, energetic bunch of diggers met on Bayley Street in front of the museum. Once



there, they were told of the rules and safety precautions in place during the dig, and then it was time to set off in convoy for the Coolgardie tip.

Through research, the club had discovered some old sanitation dumps within the Coolgardie tip boundaries. With a lot of prior planning a loader had been bought in a couple of days earlier to clear the rock-hard topsoil and it soon began to reveal the trenches underneath.

It then came down to using muscle, along with a little bit of grit, determination and perseverance, and over the next three days the bottle diggers used their shovels, picks and garden forks to unveil some great treasures.

For those who were willing to stop and have a break, there was a qualified masseuse within their ranks available to help ease the aches and pains, and a sausage sizzle supplied each day for lunch.

With new friends and some great memories made a great time was had by all members over the three-day dig.

Waghorn Bottle Collection - Coolgardie's Goldfields Exhibition Museum

In 1954, when Frank and May Waghorn went to Sandstone and May found their first two Penny Ink Bottles, no one could have imagined the collection of old bottles and historic collectables they would create. They travelled all over WA, NT and SA digging as they went along and adding to their collection.

In 1977 the Waghorn's moved to Coolgardie and opened their home as a museum to display their ever-expanding collection and over the years they won many ribbons at shows for their remarkable bottle collection.

The glass in the Waghorn Bottle collection is in an amazing array of colours, shapes and sizes.

Glass is made from sand, soda and lime, all sand has some iron oxides in it and this makes the glass agua coloured or green. Clear glass without this agua tint can be made by adding red lead, but this was too expensive for the 19th Century trade in common bottles.

Clear bottles were not common until about 1880 when bottle manufacturers discovered they could get remove the aqua colour by adding manganese, or selenium. Clear bottles with high manganese content are the ones which turn to beautiful amethyst shades after

being exposed to sunlight. Those with high selenium content turn to amber or brown.

Natural glass colours, where the colour goes into the glass at the time of manufacture were created by adding other minerals, olive green (iron slag), brown (carbon), yellow and green (chromium and sulphur), purple (manganese), red (copper or gold).

Tin or zinc is added to the mixture to make milk glass and cobalt for the deep blue glass.

Bright rich colours are not particularly common in old bottles, because coloured glass was more expensive, but poisons were usually bottled in them as a warning. Some poison bottles were very elaborately designed.

When the Waghorn's decided it was time to retire the Waghorn Bottle Collection became a part of the Shire of Coolgardie's Goldfields Exhibition Museum, housed in the old courtroom in the Wardens Court Building on Bayley St Coolgardie.

Tent Serves For First School In Coolgardie

As you could imagine, it did not take long for the population of Coolgardie to grow following the discovery of gold. The families of prospectors and businessmen alike eventually began to join them, so naturally, a school was needed.

A history of education in Coolgardie

1894: The first Coolgardie Progress Association was formed in May, and it was this organisation that started proceedings for the school.

September 10, 1894: The Coolgardie Municipal Council approved the go ahead for the 'tent school' and the progress committee advised the department of education of what was needed. Which included:


- 1 x tent, 30 feet (9.1m) by 20 feet (6.1m) for the school
- 1 x tent, 12 feet (3.6m) by 10 feet (3.1m) for the principals' quarters
- Floorboards (for the dusty ground)
- Desks, box of cupboards for school material, blackboards, maps etc.

September 17, 1894: Mr. G.B. Crabbe was appointed principal.

October 10, 1894: Blackboards, easels, and free stock had arrived. Within a couple of months, the tent school had been erected.

November 12, 1894: The school was officially opened by Mr James Shaw, the newly elected first mayor of Coolgardie.

At the time of the opening, there were 25 students enrolled, and although the names of those students is not available, it has been recalled that they included



Joseph and John Penglase, Thomas James, and George Lathrope. These were all well known names in Coolgardie for many years later.

Like their pioneer parents, the students were considered 'brave souls'. They prevailed in the harsh conditions that the area offered. A tent can be oven-like in the summer and an ice-chest in the winter.

1895: Attendance was starting to drop. Reasons given included the departure of families to new 'rushes', fever, and 'boy labor' (believe it or not). In regard to the fever, reference has been made to the fact that there were no fewer than 35 funerals in the week prior to March 5, 1895. And by September, Principal Crabbe had left. Apparently, he had not had a happy time.

October 27, 1895: John MacIntyre became the new principal. It seems that the school enrolments increased considerably in 1896 and 1897. A report from May of 1897 showed that there were 420 students attending the school, and the numbers were increasing.

October 1897: Mr. J J Tucker, the town clerk, wrote complaining of the conditions in one room, measuring 60 feet by 20 feet, that was used to accommodate 150 infants. He described it as "insufferably hot and on occasions had to be closed all day on account of the clouds of dust, with the temperature rising to 38 degrees".

A.W MacDonald, the mayor at the time, considered this to be "highly detrimental to the students and teachers, and also to educational progress". A new building was needed.


June 1897: A contract was let to Mr. M. Barrie, for an infants school to be completed by January 1898.

There's no information on when these buildings were first used, but it most certainly would have been a day to



celebrate, as well as a wonderful reprieve from the hot, dusty tent the students had been using.

Shire of Coolgardie Kerbside Waste Collection

REFUSE COLLECTION

Hard refuse should be placed neatly on the verge as close as possible to the kerb and your driveway. The following items will be collected from your verge;

WHITE GOODS -Stoves, refrigerators (doors to be removed), washing machines etc. TRAMPOLINES/SWING SETS must be dismantled SCRAP METAL OLD FURNITURE GENERAL RUBBISH

The white goods and scrap metal should be placed on the verge in a pile separate to the other hard refuse as this will be collected separately and recycled. All items of hard refuse will be collected by hand. A maximum weight will apply and as a general rule, two (2) people should be able to lift the item easily to shoulder height with the item being no longer than 4 metres.

Please note this service is available in townsites only. It is important that residents pay close attention to the requirements of the roadside collections. All waste is to be placed in a pile neatly on the verge no earlier than one (1) week prior to the advertised collection week.

All waste must be placed on the verge by 6.00am on the advertised starting date as the truck will only travel down your street once. All waste is to be placed on the verge without obstructing footpaths or line of sight particularly adjacent to road intersections. Waste will not be collected from Vacant Properties, Public Land or Land outside townsite boundaries.
